Purpose of the meeting in the eyes of the State Department and Board of Education: To work out any difference that might exist between the Board and Department and the Governor. Their resolution, passed unanimously at the October State Board meeting, is as follows:

"...that the legislative committee chairman and the Superintendent of Public Instruction communicate with the Governor to clear up any mis-information as to the purpose of the bill (AB 950) and to determine the possibility of adding the bill to an existing bill."

Purpose of the meeting from our standpoint: To point out that we all realize that there is an epidemic and that concerted action must begin immediately. To remind both the Board and Department that no legislation is needed, and that they can begin immediately. To point out the actual meaning of AB 950, it removed from parents their authority relative to their children.

An outline then:

- A. There is a V.D. epidemic.
- B. AB 950, although a "non bill", had one saving grace, it underlined a problem and further brought it to the attention of our citizens-- it also confused the matter badly.
  - (1) Although a non bill in terms of stated intent, it did revoke the parents right



to remove their child from the class upon notification if they so desired.

- (2) Removal of parents' rights was the Governor's only concern.

C. None of us need legislation to begin.

- (1) State Board can join with Superintendent requesting local boards to develop proper curriculum immediately--either can do so alone.

- (2) They also can offer the words of encouragement required to motivate the teacher, thus removing false ideas or fear.

D. The local boards have not done enough and can begin in this area immediately.

E. The Administration will publicly support any appropriate action the State Board and Department take in this area.

(n.b.: Statements that will undoubtedly be made by the Board and Department:

... This legislation does not remove the ability of a parent to remove his or her child from a class as this is guaranteed for any subject in the educational code.

... True, instructors can begin without any legislation, however, if any information is discussed by an instructor that the parents have not had the opportunity to see before hand--such as a news article brought into class by a student--that teacher is liable to have her credential revoked.)

## Relays Wish From Vietnam

Governor Reagan visited a Rancho Cordova housewife Thursday to deliver personally her serviceman husband's message of love from Vietnam and a dozen long-stemmed red roses.

"I'm still in shock," bubbled Mrs. Earl Huffman — of 2528 Las Casas Way. "Two big black cars drove up at 6 o'clock sharp and when I opened the door, the man said, 'Hello, I'm Ronald Reagan. Your husband asked me to deliver these flowers to you and tell you that he loves you.'

"I KIND OF CRIED, just a bit. I'm a nobody, and I couldn't imagine someone as important as the Governor taking time to deliver flowers to me. It's like a dream."

The Governor also delivered a letter Air Force T. Sgt. Huffman had written him Sept. 28. Reagan's visit was not announced to the press, but a neighbor called The Sacramento Union about the incident.

From Da Nang, Huffman wrote Reagan, "In an attempt to find a dramatic way to show my wife how much I love her, I would like to make what may be an unusual request of you — for you to deliver to her in person one dozen roses.

"I realize that you may not have the time to do this and will understand if you refuse. However, if you can, I will be very grateful to you. I will pay all costs incurred."
