Eliminating The Threat From Ballistic Missiles (U)

Since the advent of nuclear weapons, deterrence of aggression has been achieved through the promise of retaliation — the notion that no rational nation would inevitably result in unacceptable losses to themselves. This approach to stability through offensive threat has worked. However, I have become more and more deeply convinced that the human spirit must be capable of rising above dealing with other nations and human beings by threatening their existence. Therefore, along with our effort to lower the level of forces through arms control, the time has come for us to embark on a program to counter the awesome ballistic missile threat to the United States and our allies with measures that are defensive. We would like to have the means of rendering these nuclear weapons impotent and obsolete. Our only purpose is to reach for ways to reduce the danger of nuclear war. (U)

I direct the development of an intensive effort to define a long term research and development program aimed at an ultimate goal of eliminating the threat posed by nuclear ballistic missiles. These actions will be carried out in a manner consistent with our obligations under the ABM Treaty and recognizing the need for close consultations with our allies. (U)
