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**Fluor Southern California Division
Irvine, California
Completed in 1976 (Addition under Construction)**

This 1,700,000 square foot facility consists of six 4-story buildings built around plazas and courtyards. Two new buildings are being added to the site which occupies 105 acres.



**Fluor Corporate Headquarters
Irvine, California
Completed in 1977**

This ten-story office building is the corporate home for Fluor Corporation. Like the other buildings in the business complex, it makes extensive use of mirrored glass. The building provides 300,000 square feet of space.



**Financial Plaza
San Diego, California
Design Development Phase**

This 23-story office building was designed for Bowlen Limited of Edmonton, Canada. The 471,000 square foot building will be finished in travertine marble with bronze reflective glass. Parking is provided for 600 cars.



**Dravo
Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania
Under Construction**

This eight-sided, 54-story tower will be the world headquarters for U.S. Steel Corporation's Dravo Realty. The 1.7 million square foot building features a stressed steel exterior. This is the first time steel has been used in a tubular steel frame structure as both the building skin and structural support.



**Cities Service Company
Tulsa, Oklahoma
Under Construction**

This 37-story building will be the new corporate headquarters for Cities Service Company. The 1.3 million square foot building will be located on a major downtown site of four acres. The building exterior will be of polished carnelian granite and bronze glass.



**Washington Convention Center
Washington, D.C.
Under Construction**

This 800,000 square foot convention center is located on a 9.7-acre site in the nation's Capital. The center will meet all community and convention needs. It provides flexible space in its four exhibition halls. One of these halls will have a dramatic 240 foot span of column-free space. The exterior of the center will be finished in fluted concrete panels and exposed structural steel.



**Harbourside
Jersey City, New Jersey
Masterplan**

Harbourside is a multi-use complex to be located on the Hudson River waterfront. The first phase of this 200-acre development will include a regional shopping mall, 600-room convention hotel and marina, 1,000 housing units and a one million square foot office tower. The complex will serve as a commercial "gateway" to nearby New York City.



Century City
Los Angeles, California
Completed in 1974

Century City is a 260-acre mixed-use complex. It contains 14 office buildings ranging in height from three to 44 stories, an 800-room hotel, an entertainment center, a 15-story hospital and medical facilities and four 20-story apartment buildings. In addition, there is a major commercial/retail center and parking for 15,000 cars. Becket masterplanned this business complex and designed 14 of the structures within it.



**400 South Hope Street
Los Angeles, California
Under Construction**

This 26-story office building is the headquarters for the prestigious law firm of O'Melveny & Myers. The six-sided prism-shaped building with underground subterranean parking is oriented 45 degrees to the site to take advantage of the view and the northern exposure. Two glass roof areas are featured in the design of the 700,000 square foot tower which is part of the Bunker Hill redevelopment area of Los Angeles.



**Naval Regional Medical Center
San Diego, California
Under Construction**

This 1.2 million square foot medical facility is located in a 77-acre park-like setting. It will include a 760-bed teaching hospital, outpatient department with 31 clinics, central energy plant and other support facilities. It will be the largest naval facility of its kind in the United States.



**Hyatt Regency at Reunion
Dallas, Texas
Completed in 1979**

This 1,000-room convention hotel has towers of seven distinct roof heights. The tallest tower is 30 stories high. It also includes a dramatic 625-foot-high theme tower with a revolving restaurant. The facade of the structure is mirrored glass. Hyatt Regency at Reunion is considered a major contemporary landmark of Dallas.
