

RE:

Space Spinoff Project

At his request I met with Douglas Morrow today. Mr. Morrow reviewed with me the origins and planning of the Space Spinoff project. He spent much of the time explaining some of the spinoff benefits of the space program and noted the President's general interest in the space program. Mr. Morrow also elaborated on the "celebrity" media spots. explained that the Space Foundation was planning a press conference in mid-August to kick off the space ad campaign which is being marketed under the aegis of the Advertising Council. He advised that former Presidents Nixon, Ford, and Carter were going to do brief video messages for the press conference; he noted that the President would also be doing one. He also indicated that he expected the President to provide one short ad spot generally extolling the spinoff virtues of the space program.

Mr. Morrow adamantly emphasized that none of the proposed Presidential statements would be used to raise funds for the Foundation; he emphasized that all the funds have already been raised, and that the project is complete except for the actual airing of the ads. He did not raise any issue regarding a White House lunch for the ad participants or for any contributors to the Foundation's campaign, nor did he suggest that there was anything additional he wanted the White House or the President to do.

I advised him that we would want to review the text of any proposed Presidential message both with respect to the press conference and the ad campaign itself. I noted that comments the President may make would at most relate to the virtues of the U.S. Government space program and attendant societal benefits, and that the President should not make any comments commending or reflecting upon the Foundation itself. Mr. Morrow advised that the Foundation is a 501 (c) (3) entity.

SUBJECT: DOUGLAS MORROW AND NASA PROGRAMS

The President talked to Douglas Morrow today on the phone and Mr. Morrow then called me to give me a list of celebrity names he and the President discussed. He hopes to have the initial press conference in the next 2 or 3 weeks and wants to have former Presidents Nixon and Carter. He wants to schedule teams for spots thereafter, and suggested to the President: Charlton Heston with Gloria Steinham, Gerald Ford with Walter Mondale or McGovern, Barry Goldwater and Jesse Jackson, Bill Buckley and Tip O'Neil, Frank Sinatra and Willie Nelson, Leonard Bernstein and Bruce Springstein, Bill Cosby and Tom Selleck, and Willie Shoemaker and Karem Abdul Jabar (sp.?).

He indicated that the President said he just wanted to run this by his legal department to make sure there was no problem in getting involved in this and that he (RR) would contact these people for Mr. Morrow.

I assume you will be hearing from the President soon about the above.

Dear Mr. President:

I wanted you to know that I appreciated receiving your recent call from Camp David and to learn of your interest in Bill Cosby for the Doug Morrow project.

Following our conversation, I contacted Doug Morrow. We spent an hour on the phone, followed by a two-hour meeting in my office. Doug and I have been friends for well over 35 years, and I have great respect for him. He previously mentioned his project to me last December when he was busy putting it together.

After my meeting with Doug I then reviewed, in great detail, with Bill Cosby the project and advised him of your personal interest in him to appear with Tom Sellick.

Following Bill's further consideration, he is regretfully passing on Doug Morrow's project, as he simply does not have the available time due to his numerous contractual and charitable commitments. Also, he is not looking for additional exposure.

A rare exception, in the past, was the filming of a spot for the FBI relative to "missing children". This feature is being seen daily on the FBI tour in Washington and, with Bill Cosby's permission, the same material is available through all FBI regional offices.

Mr. President, in closing, I want to thank you for your interest in Bill, and I'm sorry that it did not work out.

DOUG MORROW BINDER:

- -- Wants 5 minutes (one on one) with the President sometime next week.
- -- Wants the President to do a 90 second spot in the next 2 weeks for an August airing (draft statement enclosed -- needs work).
- -- Wants the White House to host a luncheon for the 22 celebrities and about 20 CEO's (I'm assuming large financial donators to the space project), the majority and minority leaders of the House and Senate, and leaders of legislative space committees -- totaling approximately 50 or 60 people.
 - -- Luncheon would end with 15 minutes of spots being shown, followed by remarks from the President (and probably Doug).
 - -- Asks for the President to either attend the entire luncheon or to do a drop by to view the spots and then give remarks.
 - -- Doug and the US Space Foundation volunteered to pay for the cost of the event .
- -- Since Cybil Shepherd has had to drop out, it's possible Doug wants to see the President alone to ask him to call another candidate for this slot (or to talk him into the luncheon).

Dear Ken:

Although I realize your plate is full, I am not hesitant about adding this to it because I'm certain that, with your cooperation, this will help the President. That is my hope and I know it must be yours.

What with Iran/Contra, Persian Gulf, deficit, trade balance, Meese, Deaver, etc., etc., he is a beleaguæred man.

Bluntly, - rightly or wrongly, directly or by association, - he's in a hell of a lot of trouble. He shouldn't be and doesn't deserve to be. But that's water under the bridge.

The project we're doing will not solve his problems. Butit, and its ancillary offshoots, will significantly help him.

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working. Despite the flags, balloons and cheers of
the true believers, - and despite the President's
valiant performance, - the much needed response from
a broad cross-section is simply not happening.

And the reason is, I believe, because he is beating, if not a dead horse, a very lame one.

He is, by and large, right on the economic policy he is selling. But it is old hat. Line item veto, balanced budget amendment, Democrat-tax-and-spend, etc., however valid, have been on the plate for years. And, despite merit, are not "sexy" enough to distract constructively from all the other negative stuff floating around.

What I'm trying to say is that, currently, he appears to be on the defensive, instead of being on the offensive. But being on the offensive, - and I can't emphasize this too strongly, - does not have to be confrontational or adversarial. Instead, the perception should be broad and historic in scope and ecumenical in appeal.

An arms agreement with the Soviets is "sexy". And if it occurs this fall, as appears possible, this will help him.

The dawn of the Space Age (which is really where we are) and how it relates to America's future, the betterment of all its people and, indeed, people everywhere in the world---is "sexy".

The polls uniformly show that approximately 75% of the American people support the Space Program. And the President will benefit greatly if he can be perceived in the forefront of America's space effort, looking ahead, as a leader should, setting historic policy (Space Station and Mars), and helping to bring the American people, of all persuasions, into his vision for the future and its benefits for all.

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First, because he inspired it.

Second, because it is specifically targeted at the people, male and female, black and white, liberal and conservative, Democrat and Republican, and how space technology will benefit them and generations to come.

And third, because my mouth waters at the opportunity to associate the President with those involved in the presentation of this series.

We all know that much, if not all, of the President's difficulties are politically or ideologically triggered. This makes irresistible this invaluable chance for the President to acknowledge and express his appreciation to the participants for their coming together,— despite disparate or diametric persuasions,—in a pro bono effort for the benefit of all...Carter and Ford, Goldwater and Jackson, O'Neill and Buckley, Steinem and Heston, Goldberg and Hayes, etc., etc. He inspired the whole thing and we should make damn sure, without using a sledge hammer, that he gets credit for it.

In the past 6 months or so I have met literally hundreds of people in connection with the project. All, Republicans and Democrats alike, have expressed gratified surprise at our presentation. They have tried to heap praise upon me for "bringing people together".

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This must be pursued.

Since the Ad Council, which fanatically by charter avoids anything that is political, ideological, commercial or controversial, has categorized our project as a Major Campaign (a big plus), things have accelerated and time is now of the essence.

Attached is all the essential data you requested, plus a general schedule of things to be done.

I will arrive in D.C. about 5PM, Monday, 7/20. Jefferson Hotel, 347-2200. Until then, at 213/245-0245.

Although I have NASA Council meetings on Tuesday and Wednesday, I can make myself available, as convenient to you, on those days or on Thursday and Friday.

Ken, I am absolutely certain that, with your cooperation, we can significantly help the President.

This LETTER OF AGREEMENT, signed by your company, and by the United States Space Foundation, acknowledges your commitment to and participation in the SPACE PROGRAM SPINOFF PROJECT, which project was proposed to you and described by President Reagan in his letter of September 11, 1986.

In follow-up to the President's letter, which was presented to you by Douglas Morrow, Morrow has further explained to you that, through an ad hoc consortium of a cross-section of major American businesses \$1,000,000.00 will be raised to fund the production of 10-15 public services television and radio announcements implementing the President's desire to disseminate to the public, the media and Congress, knowledge of the wide-ranging technological spinoffs from the Space Program that are beneficially affecting, and will increasingly affect, the welfare and quality of life for all humandkind, in this country and throughout the world.

Each aerospace company participating in the project will contribute \$75,000.00.

Each participating non-aerospace company will contribute \$50,000.00.

All contributions will be made to the U.S. Space Foundation, a Washington, D.C. non-profit corporation holding IRS 501(c)(3) status, and deposited in an interest-bearing trust account separate from all other Foundation funds and held by the Foundation under the following restrictions:

I. Interest from the Spinoff Project trust account may be used to reimburse actual documented out-of-pocket expenses--travel, hotel, phone, postage, etc.--incurred in organizing the project.

- II. The contributed principle in the account may not be drawn upon until the following conditions have been met and confirmed to each of the contributing companies:
 - A. The consortium of companies has been organized and all contributions deposited.
 - B. The teams of public figure and celebrity hosts (one team of two for each spot) have been committed.
 - C. The major television and radio networks have committed their networks and affiliated stations to airing the public service announcements.
- III. There will be no payroll in connection with this project. No one associated with the project will be paid from funds raised for the project and deposited to the separate trust account. The paid staff of the United States Space Foundation will continue to be paid by the Foundation from separate funds. The contributed capital in the trust account will be used solely for the production and distribution of the public service announcements.
- IV. Each withdrawal from the Spinoff Project trust account, for the production and/or distribution of the public service announcements, will be approved and authorized in writing by both General James E. Hill, Chairman of the Foundation, and Douglas Morrow.
- V. It is anticipated that the number of companies agreeing to participate in the project will, with their
 respective contributions, exceed the \$1,000,000.00
 target. If and when that occurs, each participating
 company will receive back from the Foundation, on a
 pro rata basis, some percentage of its original contribution so that the capital account will not
 exceed \$1,000,000.00.

- VI. It is further anticipated that some portion of the work necessary to produce and distribute the public service announcements may be done by the contracting suppliers on a cost or pro bono basis. If this occurs and results in a final cost to the project of less than \$1,000,000.00, the difference will be distributed back to the participating companies on a pro rata basis. In no event will the cost exceed \$1,000,000.00.
- VII. No changes of substance in the provisions of this agreement will be effectuated unless and until each company is notified of a proposed change by General James E. Hill and/or Douglas Morrow and approval for such change granted by each company.
- VIII. The Board of the United States Space Foundation has authorized Foundation participation in the SPACE PROGRAM SPINOFF PROJECT as described herein.
 - IX. By signature below, accompanied by your contribution of \$50,000.00 to the order of the U.S. Space Foundation Spinoff Trust Account, both parties acknowledge acceptance of this LETTER OF AGREEMENT.
