HOWEVER, FEW MESSAGES PROVIDING NUMBERS WHO LEAVE BY COMMERCIAL TRANSPORT--TRAIN, AIR, BUS, ETC., AND BY PRIVATE AUTOMOBILE DURING THE FIRST FEW DAYS OF THE EXERCISE WOULD BE VERY HELPFUL. ALSO USEFUL WOULD BE A MESSAGE OR TWO CREATING TEMPORARY OBSTACLES TO NEO: HOST GOVERNMENT OPPOSITION, LARGE GROUPS UNABLE TO REACH DESIGNATED EVACUATION AIRPORTS, MEDICAL EMERGENCIES, OR THE LIKE.

DURING THE EXERCISE, YOU MAY RECEIVE MESSAGES ASKING YOU TO CONSULT WITH, OR TAKE SOME OTHER ACTION INVOLVING, THE HOST GOVERNMENT. Introduction/Background:

Exercise WINTEX/CIMEX 83 is a General War Command Post exercise jointly sponsored by NATO and the Joint Chiefs of Staff. The exercise will be conducted from February 24-March 9, 1983.

This is the most sensitive exercise we have conducted since the Ivy League Nuclear War Exercise last March. All major U.S. CINCs are participating and there will be collateral involvement in OSD, JCS and the State Department. NATO is participating in the exercise at the Defense Planning Committee (DPC) Permanent Representative level -with some heads of State expected to be involved during discussions of sensitive/nuclear issues. The scenario is NATO drafted -- not U.S. and there are several events in the exercise that will place U.S. National objectives/assets in competition with those for NATO. Our responses will be interpreted in the context of real world intent and commitment.

White House Involvement:

During the exercise the NSC will convene a simulated Crisis Pre-Planning Group (CPPG) chaired by Richard T. Boverie, as surrogate for the National Security Advisor. This body will deliberate policy issues, develop options and recommendations for Presidential decision. The role of the President will be simulated throughout the exercise by an Exercise Control Group comprised of NSC, State Department, DoD and FEMA representatives.

The simulated CPPG is currently scheduled to meet seven times in the White House Situation Room (WHSR) during the exercise, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on 24, 25, and 28 February and on 2, 3, 6, and 8 March. Agendas for these meetings will be provided by the NSC and transmitted to participants by LDX/courier from the WHSR. The format at Tab A, with appropriate "Exercise WINTEX/CIMEX 83" labels will be used throughout. Each CPPG meeting will commence with an intelligence/operations briefing over the Secure Video Link (SVL) between the NMCC and the WHSR.

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Responsibilities During Exercise Play:

- Exercise Message Handling. The White House Situation Room will control the distribution of all exercise traffic. In order to preclude exercise cables from being confused with actual message traffic, cables bearing the header "Exercise WINTEX/CIMEX 83" will be distributed outside the WHSR only to Richard Boverie (NSC), Horace Russell (NSC), Richard Beal (NSC) and Oliver North (NSC).
- Exercise Meetings. The WHSR Senior Duty Officer will be provided with a list of attendees for all Exercise meetings by Oliver North or Horace Russell. Messrs. North and Russell will also be responsible for clearing these representatives through visitor control.
- Simulated Presidential Decisions. Subsequent to each of the CPPG meetings, a simulated Presidential decision will be prepared by the Exercise Control Group. This document will be distributed to Exercise participants by WASHFAX from the WHSR. A format is at Tab B.
- Administrative Support. Administrative support for the meetings will be provided by Fawn Hall. She will be in a position from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. during the CPPG meetings at an administrative space in the WHSR. This administrative space will be used to prepare documents for MCAG meetings. The Director, WHSR, will ensure that this space is made available during this timeframe.
- Communications. The following communications arrangements will be made in effect for the Exercise:
 - -- Record Communications. All Exercise cables and messages will be prepared on normal message circuitry and distributed according to the guidance above (Exercise Message Handling).
 - -- Facsimile. When necessary, WASHFAX will be used to rapidly disseminate information among the Exercise participants. The NSC exercise coordinators will ensure that facsimile messages are properly addressed.

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- -- Secure Voice. When necessary, secure voice conference calls will be used to coordinate among Exercise participants. The NSC exercise coordinator will inform the White House Communications Agency (WHCA) secure signal switchboard no less that 30 minutes prior to convening such conference calls. All discussions pertaining to Exercise WINTEX/CIMEX 83 should be conducted on secure voice terminals.
- -- Secure Video Link (SVL). Prior to each CPPG meeting, the SVL will be activated for the purpose of conducting an intelligence/operations update for CPPG participants. The NMCC will also provide video tapes of daily intelligence/operations events for viewing by NSC principals. The NSC exercise coordinator will notify the director, WHSR, not less than one hour in advance, of any of these events. The Director, WHSR, will ensure that the SVL is operational and effect necessary coordination with the NMCC.

Ambassador Dailey has written to you (Tab A) articulating his concerns re the forthcoming NATO exercise to be conducted February 24-March 9, 1983. His anxieties are precisely those that we expressed in the original exercise approval and reflect some of Dr. Ikle's feelings on the matter. Ambassador Dailey notes his hope

The exercise scenario -- drafted by NATO -- not the U.S., calls for NATO

March 8. Elections in the FRG are scheduled for March 6. A more detailed view of the exercise is available in our January 17 significant military Exercise Brief (Tab B). A copy of the SOP for White House participation in the exercise is at Tab C.

We believe that the obvious adverse consequences of such an exercise at this time can be mitigated with prior planning and handling. There are, however, several key players who must be involved: Ambassador Dailey, OSD, JCS and State Department. We believe that a high-level meeting on this matter is essential if we are to prevent a debacle -- as either cancelling the exercise or a major leak would give us.

The memorandum at Tab I from you to Under Secretary Eagleburger, et al, proffers a meeting in the WHSR to review the exercise and tasks State to prepare a paper which would address problems raised at the meeting. This meeting would last approximately 40 minutes and serve the purpose of placing all concerned on an even level of understanding regarding the exercise and ensure that all participants are fully engaged in damage limitation.

- -- Based on the briefing and subsequent discussion of the issues, the State Department will prepared, in coordination with other involved agencies, planning guidance for use here in Washington and at overseas posts. (S)

Attached at Tab A is a JCS Significant Military Exercise Brief for the subject NATO General War Command Post Exercise scheduled for the period February 24-March 9, 1983.

This is the most sensitive, and potentially most important exercise we have conducted since last
March. NATO is participating in the exercise at the Defense Planning Committee (DPC) Permanent Representative level—with some heads of State expected to be involved during discussions

The involvement of top level NATO decisionmakers in the exercise is a matter of serious import. Though this is an exercise, U.S. responses to the scenario will be closely scrutinized —not only by NATO Headquarters—but individually by the participating nations as well. It is important to note that the scenario is NATO drafted—not U.S. There are several events in the exercise that will place U.S. National objectives/assets in competition with those for NATO. Our responses will be interpreted in the context of real world intent and commitment. They will also be compared to existing treaties and support agreements. Lastly, our exercise responses could be used as the foundation for future support requests.

JCS had originally planned to forward to the Secretary of Defense the draft memorandum at Tab B--asking that he send it to Judge Clark for signature and transmittal. Subsequent to receiving this draft, Dr. Ikle and I discussed this matter--and the other concerns noted above. He proposed that we play the exercise at the same level as the November PROUD SABER exercise--with a White House level "Crisis Action Group" comprised of representatives from NSC, State, OSD, JCS and FEMA. At today's exercise planning meeting, all parties agreed in concept to this approach.

In accord with this informal agreement, the memorandum at Tab I authorizes the exercise to proceed and informs DoD that we are prepared to participate.

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At this time it appears that the "Crisis Action Group" would convene about seven times during the fourteen-day exercise. As in November, meetings would be held from 1900-2000--chaired by Gen Boverie acting as Judge Clark's surrogate. Horace Russell (Mobilization) and Dennis Blair (European Political Matters) would likewise be involved. If you concur with this approach, we will, as before, provide an internal SOP governing message handling, SVL use, etc.

- 1. (U) Exercise Name. WINTEX-CIMEX 83.
- 2. (U) Geographic Area. Worldwide.
- 3. (U) Dates. 24 Pebruary 9 March 1983.
- 4. (U) Type. Worldwide procedural, general war command post exercise (CPX).
- 5. (C) Aims. To exercise civil and military staffs and appropriate plans; to test procedures; and to evaluate the WWMCCS during a simulated period of deteriorating worldwide political-military relations which result in a large-scale conventional war and limited use of nuclear weapons.
- 6. (C) Critical Cancellation Date. 31 January 1983.
- 7. (U) Political Implications.
 - a. (C) US Commitment to Allies for Conduct of the Exercise. Exercise WINTEX-CIMEX 83 is scheduled over a 14-day period commencing 240800Z February 1983 and terminating 091600Z March 1983, in conjunction with the NATO-sponsored Exercise WINTEX-CIMEX 83. The WINTEX-CIMEX 83 scenario is the same as the NATO scenario except for threats to US vital interests in the Caribbean Basin and North Pacific geographical areas.
 - b. (C) Other Political Implications. WINTEX-CIMEX 83 is designed to exercise US general war plans on a worldwide basis. The exercise scenario creates fictitious political and military situations in many areas of the world where tensions actually exist. Therefore, political implications could be inferred by other nations, friendly or hostile, if details of the exercise were revealed.



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


- 8. (S) Politico-Military Scenario Summary. The broad scenario depicts a period of rising tensions throughout the world resulting from continued politico-military disagreements between the Communist country of ORANGE and its allies and the United States and its allies. The rapidly increasing international tension culminates in NATO declaring MILITARY VIGILANCE, SACEUR'S request for the reinforcement of Europe, a Congressionally supported declaration of National Emergency, full mobilization and commencement of the reinforcement of NATO. The escalating worldwide tensions result in an outbreak of hostilities primarily in Europe and the Atlantic, and, to a lesser degree, in Southwest Asia and in the Northern Pacific. After an extended period of conventional defense by NATO, renewed ORANGE efforts will cause NATO and/or the United States to use tactical nuclear weapons.
- 9. (U) Directing Headquarters. Organization of the Joint Chiefs of Staff.
- 10. (C) Participating Commands, Headquarters, and Forces.

Canada will participate in WINTEX-CIMEX 83 both as a member NATO nation and on an unilateral basis to implement portions of the Canadian US Defense Plan (CANUS) for North America and to exercise consultative procedures between the US and Canada. All member nations of NATO, except Prance and Iceland, will participate in NATO Exercise WINTEX-CIMEX 83. This will include the three major NATO Commanders, SACEUR, SACLANT, and CINCHAN and their staffs, civilian and military agencies of NATO Headquarters, and government officials of the participating NATO countries.
- c. (U) Total number of US personnel participating cannot be determined at this time.

- d. (C) Allied Nations. Canadian NORAD forces will participate as directed by CINCNORAD. The Canadian Defense Staff will participate at Canadian National Defense Headquarters in Ottawa. NATO participants, subparagraph 10b, will participate in WINTEX-CIMEX in varying degrees from their headquarters/seats of government.
- 12. (S) Simulated Use of Nuclear Weapons. NATO and Canadian consultation, simulated Presidential release authority, the selective release, and use of tactical nuclear weapons will be exercised.
- 13. (U) Coordination Expected With Other Unified, Specified, or Service Commands, Governmental Departments Agencies, or Representative thereof. Full coordination has been made.
- 14. (S) Recommended General Public Information Policy. In view of the possible political implications noted in paragraph 7, and the sensitivity of US general war plans, minimum publicity is desired for Exercise WINTEX-CIMEX 83. The Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense (Public Affairs) will be the sole



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approving authority for news releases concerning the exercise. In the event queries are received emphasis in the response will be placed on the routine, periodic nature of local or unified/specified command exercises. NATO will adopt an active public information policy in regard to Exercise WINTEX-CIMEX 83. The NATO public information policy will be to present WINTEX-CIMEX 83 as a routine, biennial NATO-wide command post exercise, to provide reassurance regarding the defensive capabilities of the NATO alliance, and to emphasize the high degree of coordination effected between NATO military organizations, Ministries of Defense, and civilian agencies concerned. The following is recommended for release by OASD (PA) on 21 February 1983 in order to place the exercise in proper perspective and avoid press speculation and misinterpretation by any country which might note an increase in US military communications activity:

"A routine, NATO related command post exercise known as WINTEX-CIMEX 83 will be conducted by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, 24 February - 9 March 1983. The exercise is designed to emphasize the high degree of cooperation and coordination between NATO military and civil organizations during a period of increasing crisis and to test national procedures required to support the NATO effort. It will not involve the movement of forces."

- 15. (S) Assessment of Perception of US and Allied Strategy and Military Capability. Perception by participants and others who are informed or learn of the exercise should be that the exercise portrays an extended period of US reinforcement of NATO and a general war in Europe between NATO and ORANGE and its allies.



Introduction/Background:

Exercise WINTEX/CIMEX 83 is a General War Command Post exercise jointly sponsored by NATO and the Joint Chiefs of Staff. The exercise will be conducted from February 24-March 9, 1983.

This is the most sensitive exercise we have conducted since the Ivy League Nuclear War Exercise last March. All major U.S. CINCs are participating and there will be collateral involvement in OSD, JCS and the State Department. NATO is participating in the exercise at the Defense Planning Committee (DPC) Permanent Representative level -with some heads of State expected to be involved during discussions of sensitive/nuclear issues. The scenario is NATO drafted -- not U.S. and there are several events in the exercise that will place U.S. National objectives/assets in competition with those for NATO. Our responses will be interpreted in the context of real world intent and commitment.

White House Involvement:


During the exercise the NSC will convene a simulated Crisis Pre-Planning Group (CPPG) chaired by Richard T. Boverie, as surrogate for the National Security Advisor. This body will deliberate policy issues, develop options and recommendations for Presidential decision. role of the President will be simulated throughout the exercise by an Exercise Control Group comprised of NSC, State Department, DoD and FEMA representatives.

The simulated CPPG is currently scheduled to meet seven times in the White House Situation Room (WHSR) during the exercise, from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. on 24, 25, and 28 February and on 2, 3, 6, and 8 March. Agendas for these meetings will be provided by the NSC and transmitted to participants by LDX/courier from the WHSR. The format at Tab A, with appropriate "Exercise WINTEX/CIMEX 83" labels will be used throughout. Each CPPG meeting will commence with an intelligence/operations briefing over the Secure Video Link (SVL) between the NMCC and the WHSR.

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Responsibilities During Exercise Play:

- Exercise Message Handling. The White House Situation Room will control the distribution of all exercise traffic. In order to preclude exercise cables from being confused with actual message traffic, cables bearing the header "Exercise WINTEX/CIMEX 83" will be distributed outside the WHSR only to Richard Boverie (NSC), Horace Russell (NSC), Richard Beal (NSC) and Oliver North (NSC).
- Exercise Meetings. The WHSR Senior Duty Officer will be provided with a list of attendees for all Exercise meetings by Oliver North or Horace Russell. Messrs. North and Russell will also be responsible for clearing these representatives through visitor control.
- Simulated Presidential Decisions. Subsequent to each of the CPPG meetings, a simulated Presidential decision will be prepared by the Exercise Control Group. This document will be distributed to Exercise participants by WASHFAX from the WHSR. A format is at Tab B.
- Administrative Support. Administrative support for the meetings will be provided by Fawn Hall. She will be in a position from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. during the CPPG meetings at an administrative space in the WHSR. This administrative space will be used to prepare documents for MCAG meetings. The Director, WHSR, will ensure that this space is made available during this timeframe.
- Communications. The following communications arrangements will be made in effect for the Exercise:
 - -- Record Communications. All Exercise cables and messages will be prepared on normal message circuitry and distributed according to the guidance above (Exercise Message Handling).
 - -- Facsimile. When necessary, WASHFAX will be used to rapidly disseminate information among the Exercise participants. The NSC exercise coordinators will ensure that facsimile messages are properly addressed.



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- -- Secure Voice. When necessary, secure voice conference calls will be used to coordinate among Exercise participants. The NSC exercise coordinator will inform the White House Communications Agency (WHCA) secure signal switchboard no less that 30 minutes prior to convening such conference calls. All discussions pertaining to Exercise WINTEX/CIMEX 83 should be conducted on secure voice terminals.
- -- Secure Video Link (SVL). Prior to each CPPG meeting, the SVL will be activated for the purpose of conducting an intelligence/operations update for CPPG participants. The NMCC will also provide video tapes of daily intelligence/operations events for viewing by NSC principals. The NSC exercise coordinator will notify the director, WHSR, not less than one hour in advance, of any of these events. The Director, WHSR, will ensure that the SVL is operational and effect necessary coordination with the NMCC.
