



Allen Wallis has sent to you the attached memorandum describing the outcome of the first preparatory meeting for the Venice Economic Summit. The meeting was hosted by the Italians and took place in Sicily, October 11-12.

The dates for the Economic Summit have been set (after several false starts) for June 8, 9, and 10, 1987. The Italians have been informed that these dates are acceptable to the United States.

Bill Henkel and I met with the Italian Ambassador on October 25 to discuss logistical arrangements for Venice. The Ambassador was receptive to a proposal that an unofficial pre-advance trip be made in December to oversee U.S. needs for security and press facilities.

Attached is my report of the meeting of Personal

Venice Summit. For security reasons, they wish to locate all
press activities in one Press Center at the conference site on
San Giorgio Island.

The Italians plan an administrative briefing in late
January and would prefer that advance teams delay their visit
until after that meeting.

I anticipate some difficulties with the French during the
substantive preparations as President Mitterand's Personal
Representative does not reflect the thinking of Prime Minister
Chirac.

Preparations for the Venice Economic Summit:
Report on the October 11-12, 1986 meeting
of Personal Representatives

Personal Representatives met October 11-12 in Taormina, Sicily to begin preparations for the Venice Economic Summit. The meeting was chaired by Renato Ruggiero, Secretary General of the Italian Foreign Ministry and Italy's Summit Coordinator. We focused on organizational issues, discussing the schedule at the Economic Summit, logistics, press guidelines and future meetings of the Personal Representatives.

Outline of Summit Events

Italy now proposes that the Summit be held June 14-16, 1987 in Venice. Should these dates be unacceptable, Italy proposes June 8-10 although this would require moving the proposed June 10-11 NATO Foreign Ministers meeting. The Summit will take place at the Cini Foundation on the Island of San Giorgio, the site of the 1980 Economic Summit.

Heads of State or Government will arrive at Marco Polo Airport on Sunday, June 14 in reverse protocol order. The President of the Italian Council of Ministers will greet the leaders, who will then go to their hotels by boat. Early Sunday evening there will be a reception for Heads of Delegation, Foreign Ministers, Finance Ministers and other members of the official Delegation. Later that evening there will be separate working dinners for Heads of Delegations, Foreign Ministers, Finance Ministers and Personal Representatives.

On Monday, June 15, Heads of Delegation, Foreign Ministers and Finance Ministers will meet separately in the morning and continue their discussions separately during lunch. In the afternoon, there will be a plenary session of Heads of Delegation, Foreign Ministers and Finance Ministers to hear the report of Finance Ministers. In the evening, Heads of Delegations will hear from their Foreign Ministers at dinner; Finance Ministers and Personal Representatives will dine separately.

On Tuesday, June 16, a plenary session in the morning will discuss the communique, followed by a plenary working lunch. After lunch, the President of the Italian Council of Ministers will present the communique to the press. The Summit will conclude with a dinner that evening hosted by the President of Italy for Heads of Delegations and their spouses, Ministers and Personal Representatives (without spouses).

Logistics

(a) Location

The Summit will take place at the Cini Foundation, a sixteenth century building on the island of San Giorgio facing the Riva degli Sciaconi. Each delegation will have two rooms within the Cini Foundation complex. An additional office will be available for the Head of Delegation and participating Ministers in the restricted area of the Foundation where the meetings will take place.

Heads of Delegation will meet in the Longhena Library, Foreign Ministers in the Sala Barbantini and Finance Ministers in the Sala del Consiglio. There will be simultaneous translation into five languages.

Each delegation will be entitled to a total of 30 badges. Five are allocated for the Head of Delegation, Foreign Minister, Finance Minister, Personal Representative and a liaison official. These five, which will have names on them, provide access to all Summit facilities. Ten badges will be available for members of each delegation and provide access to delegation rooms. Fifteen passes will be available for support personnel and will also provide access to the delegation rooms.

We expect to receive diagrams of the Cini Foundation facilities within the next few weeks.

(b) Lodging

Delegations will be housed in Venice. The Italians assume we will wish to use the Cipriani Hotel as we did in 1980. I understand that Canada has requested the Danieli; Japan the Excelsior.

(c) Transportation

Boats will shuttle between the Piazza San Marco and San Giorgio. The boats, which will be easily identifiable, will provide continuous transportation to and from the Cini Foundation and the press center, also located on San Giorgio. Boats will be moored as near as possible to the hotels. The shuttle boats should minimize private boats by delegations or the press. Mooring on San Giorgio is limited and will be reserved for the motor boats of Heads of Delegation and Ministers.

(d) Press

The Italian authorities intend to set up a press center on San Giorgio, but physically separated from the building where the Summit will take place and from the building housing delegation offices. The Press Center will house a common press room, national press rooms and other facilities for accredited journalists. It will have telephone lines, telex, telecopying, briefing rooms, radio and television studios and closed circuit television. Journalists will be accredited in Rome and Venice.

For security and logistical reasons, the Italian Government strongly advises against press meetings in hotels where delegations are staying. It is willing to provide for all our press needs in the Press Center. As it will shortly begin construction of the Press Center, it wishes to know our technical requirements soon.

Rules for press briefings are attached.

Preparatory Meetings

The next preparatory meeting of Personal Representatives, Finance and Foreign Ministry officials (the so-called 'sub-Sherpas') will take place next February 4-6 in Fiesole outside of Florence. I expect to receive around January 10 the first draft of the thematic paper which will be discussed at the Fiesole meeting. It is expected that Finance officials will meet in the afternoon of February 4 to prepare a report for the Personal Representatives.

Additional preparatory meetings will be held April 24-26 in Porto Cervo, Sardinia to conclude discussion on the thematic paper and May 15-17 at Stra, near Venice to discuss an annotated agenda. Political Directors will meet during the Stra meeting.

The Italians plan to have an administrative briefing in late January in Rome. They will invite a protocol, security and press official from each country plus a representative of the Personal Representative. They would prefer it if advance teams could delay their arrival in Italy until after the January administrative briefing.

Substantive Issues

Substantive discussions will not really get under way until the February 4-6 Sherpa meeting. However, there was a review of the global economic situation and of the various points

mentioned in the Tokyo communique. Ruggiero said Italy was fully satisfied with the way the G-5/G-7 process was working. He acknowledged that the paper prepared for the Taormina meeting was too pessimistic about the recent financial meetings. Pascal Lamy of the European Commission argued strongly for the EC's inclusion in the G-7, suggesting that the EC otherwise might not participate in the Summit.

The French Personal Representative, Jacques Attali, represents the President but his two sub-Sherpas represent the Finance and Foreign Ministries of the government. Attali urged that certain of the preparatory meetings, especially those where drafting is to be done, be with Personal Representatives only, excluding the sub-Sherpas. I told Mr. Ruggiero that this is unacceptable to me, and that even if it is decided to hold certain meetings without the sub-Sherpas I would ask my sub-Sherpas to be at hand so that I could consult them on matters of substance. Ruggiero, as the Chairman, would be doing that in any case, and I expect that the Canadians and Japanese will do the same.

Two experts' meetings are planned on terrorism, one November 24 in Tokyo and a second in February in Rome.

RULES FOR PRESS BRIEFING

For the press briefings the following rules have been agreed :

1. Before the Summit begins each Delegation will designate up to three spokesmen as on the record briefers during the Summit.
2. There will be no briefing on an individual session while it is in progress.
3. There will be no provision, in any form, of information to the press on the contents of each session by any concerned official including national spokesmen, while the session is in progress.
4. Before the conclusion of each Heads of State/Government or Ministerial session, participants will agree on how they will represent their discussion to the press.
5. The first Ministerial briefing after each session should be by the host Country, on the basis of agreed common guidance.
6. Subject to the above, participating Ministers may give briefings or media interviews at the end of each session,

except at the end of the lunch following the first morning session on June 9, when, after the President of the Council of the Italian Government has spoken to the press, only national spokesmen, not Ministers, may do briefing.

7. Heads of State/Government will not give any media interviews (press, radio or television) from 6.00pm on June 14, until after the concluding press conference, at which the President of the Council of the Italian Government will read a joint statement. Thereafter Heads of State/Government will be free to give their own interviews and briefing. Exception would, of course, be made for emergencies: eg.: a national crisis at home, but not for briefing after any bilateral meetings during the Summit, which should be done by spokesmen.
