The attached non-paper was given to the undersigned by Robbie Sabel, Counselor of the Israeli Embassy, today.

He added that Israel could not participate in the Summer Olympics without adequate security, including firearms for its security personnel.

I said federal agencies were well aware both of the problems the LAPD was trying to solve by banning such weapons, and of the problems this action created for certain foreign security officials. We are studying the issue carefully and remain hopeful something can be worked out.

2. SUMMARY. CHINESE AMBASSADDR ZHANG CALLED ON AS WOLFOWITZ JUNE 28 ON INSTRUCTIONS TO REQUEST USG ASSISTANCE DURING THE L.A. OLYMPICS IN I) ENSURING THE SAFETY OF CHINESE ATBLETES,

ME SAID HIS FIRST REQUEST GREW OUT OF INDICATIONS THAT ANTI-COMMUNIST GROUPS PLANNED TO DIRECT UNFRIENDLY ATTENTION ON CHINA.

VOL FOUTTZ

WELCOMED THE CHINESE PARTICIPATION IN THE OLYMPICS AND PROMISED EVERY EFFORT TO ENSURE THAT ZHANG'S CONCERNS WERE ADEQUATELY ADDRESSED. END SUMMARY.

- 3. CHINESE AMBASSADOR ZHANG WENJIN CALLED ON ASSISTANT SECRETARY PAUL WOLFOWITZ JUNE 28 TO DISCUSS CHINA'S PARTICIPATION IN THE UPCOMING OLYMPIC GAMES. SECOND SECRETARY YANG JIECHI ACCOMPANIED THE AMBASSADOR. DAS WILLIAM BROWN AND EAP/C DESK OFFICER DEAN WELTY WERE ALSO PRESENT FOR THE 45 MINUTE DISCUSSION.
- 4. ZHANG INFORMED WOLFOWITZ THAT CHINA WAS SENDING A LARGE DELEGATION OF OVER 300 ATHLETES AND OTHERS TO LOS ANGELES AS AN EXPRESSION OF SUPPORT FOR THE OLYMPICS AND OUT OF FRIENDSHIP FOR THE AMERICAN PEOPLE. ACCORDING TO ZMANG, THE DELEGATION WAS SCHEDULED TO ARRIVE IN L.A. ON JULY 16 AND WOULD BE LED BY THE MINISTER IN CHARGE OF THE PHYSICAL CULTURE AND SPORTS COMMISSION LI MENGHUA. THE FORMER MINISTER OF THE COMMISSION AND NOW SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE CCP'S CENTRAL ADVISORY COMMISSION, RONG GAOTANG, ALSO PLANNED TO ACCOMPANY THE DELEGATION. IN ADDITION, APPROXIMATELY 78 ARTISTIC PERFORMERS WERE SCHEDULED TO VISIT THE U.S. IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE GAMES.
- S. ZHANG STRESSED THAT CHINA ATTACHED IMPORTANCE TO THE SAFETY OF ITS DELEGATION AND HAD TAKEN NOTE OF THE PRESIDENT'S PLEDGE TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF THE OLYMPIC PARTICIPANTS. HE SAID THAT HIS GOVERNMENT EXPECTED THAT

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ANTI-CHINA ELEMENTS PEANNED TO CREATE INCIDENTS AND WAS PARTICULARLY CONCERNED BY REPORTS THAT GROUPS WHICH HAS CRIGINALLY TARGETTED THE SOVIETS WOULD HOW TUPN THE ATTENTION AGAINST THE CHINESE GELEGATION. THE CHINESE OLYMPIC COMMITTEE HAD, THUS SENT A LETTER TO THE LOS ANGELES OLYMPIC ORGANIZING COMMITTEE ASKING THAT IT ADOPT EVERY POSSIBLE MEASURE TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF CHINESE ATHLETES AND TO PREVENT UNFRIENDLY ACTS, ABDUCTIONS, AND OTHER HARASSMENT WHICH COULD PREVENT THE ATHLETES FROM REACHING THEIR MAXIMUM PERFORMANCE LEVELS. IHANG BELIEVED IT WAS IMPORTANT TO SEEK THE U.S. GOVERNMENT COOPERATION IN ADDRESSING THESE CONCERNS. HE SAID THAT THE DEPUTY PRINCIPAL OFFICER AT CHINA'S CONSULATE GENERAL IN SAN FRANCISCO, GAO YOUNTAN VOULD BE IN CLOSE TOUCH WITH SECURITY OFFICIALS TO HELP COORDINATE EFFORTS

6. ZHANG ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN THAT THE PARTICIPATION OF THE CHINESE TAIPET DLYMPIC ATHLETES MIGHT LEAD TO INCIDENTS THAT WOULD INDICATE THE U.S. IS FOLLOWING A TWO-CHINA OR A ONE CHINA, ONE TAIWAN POLICY. HE SUGGESTED THAT PRO-TAINAN GROUPS LIKED TO EXPLOIT OPPORTUNITIES SUCH AS THESE TO PROMOTE THEIR OBJECTIVES. HE ASKED THAT THE USG TAKE EVERY POSSIBLE MEASURE TO LIMIT SUCH ACTIVITIES AND AVOID OFFICIAL PARTICIPATION. FOLLOWING HIS PRESENTATION,

- 7. THANG STRESSED THAT HE WAS UNDER INSTRUCTIONS BY HIS GOVERNMENT TO APPROACH THE U.S. GOVERNMENT ON THESE ISSUES AND TO ELICIT ITS COOPERATION AND RESPONSE. HE NOTED THAT CHINA'S PARTICIPATION CONSTITUTED AN IMPORTANT FACET OF US/CHINA RELATIONS. WHILE CHINA EXPECTED TO TAKE GOOD CARE OF ITS ATHLETES, HE UNDERSCORED THE IMPORTANCE OF U.S. COOPERATION IN ENSURING THAT "PEOPLE WITH ULTERIOR MOTIVES NOT BE PERMITTED TO DISRUPT THEIR PARTICIPATION."
- 8. WOLFOWITZ WELCOMED THE WIGH EEVEL OF CHINESE PARTICIPATION IN THE GAMES. HE AGREED THAT IT WAS IN THE U.S. INTEREST TO ENSURE THAT ALL GOES SMOOTHLY AND TO HOLD THE GAMES WITHOUT POLITICS INTRUDING. THE U.S. WOULD ALSO NOT WANT TO LEND CREDENCE TO THE SOVIET CHARGE THAT THE U.S. WAS UNABLE TO GUARANTEE THE SAFETY OF THE VISITING ATHLETES. WOLFOWITZ SAID THE DEPARTMENT WOULD SEE THAT GAO WAS GIVEN A POINT OF CONTACT IN WASHINGTON TO HANDLE PROBLEMS AS THEY AROSE AND WOULD ESTABLISH POINTS OF CONTACT IN THE STATE AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS AND IN THE L.A. OLYMPIC COMMITTEE TO ENSURE EFFECTIVE COORDINATION WOLFOWITZ JUDGED THAT THE SECURITY ISSUE WAS PROBABLY MORE MANAGEABLE THAN THANG'S SECOND CONCERN. HE REMINDED ZHANG THAT WE ARE UNABLE TO CONTROL ACTIVITIES SPONSORED BY LOCAL OFFICIALS OR PRIVATE INDIVIDUALS THAT MIGHT SUGGEST A TWO-CHINA OR A ONE CHINA, DHE TAIWAN POLICY; WE COULD INFORM THEM DF OUR OFFICIAL GUIDELINES BUT COULD NOT DEMAND COMPLIANCE.
- 9. DEPARTMENT WILL PROVIDE ADDRESSEES WITH NAMES OF POINTS OF CONTACT AND WITH FOLLOW-UP ACTIONS AND GUIDELINES AS THEY ARE DEVELOPED. ARMACOST

THE SOVIET PRESS HAS GIVEN LIMITED COVERAGE --SOURCED TO FOREIGN NEWS AGENCIES -- OF THE ALLEGED RECENT KKK DEATH THREATS TO AFRICAN NATIONAL OLYMPIC COMMITTEES (NOCS)

- A JULY 9 ENGLISH LANGUAGE TASS RELEASE ALLEGES THAT FOREIGN NEWS AGENCIES HAVE REPORTED THE RECEIPT OF KKK DEATH THREATS BY THE NOCS OF A NUMBER OF ASIAN AND AFRICAN COUNTRIES. THE ARTICLE SPECIFICALLY MENTIONS THE NOC OF MALAYSIA AS ONE RECIPIENT. A PORTION OF THE KKK MESSAGE IS QUOTED AS FOLLOWS: "THE BLACK AND THE YELLOW WILL NOT DEFILE AMERICAN STADIUMS. Shall not permit the Subhumans to take part in the OLYMPICS, AND IF THEY COME WE SHALL SHOOT OR HANG THEM." THE TASS RELEASE WAS CARRIED IN THE NEXT DAY'S ISSUE (JULY 10) OF "SOVETSKIY SPORT" AS WELL.
- THE JULY 10 ISSUE OF "IZVESTIYA" CITES A REUTERS REPORT THAT THE NOC OF SRI LANKA ALSO RECEIVED THREATS FROM THE KKK. THEY WERE ALLEGEDLY WARNED THAT "OLYMPIC MEDALS ARE ONLY FOR WHITES" AND THAT THEIR TEAM WOULD BE SUBJECT TO "TERRORIST ATTACKS" IF THEY DARED TO "PLACE IN DOUBT THE SUPERIORITY OF THE WHITE RACE.
- A MORE RECENT TASS RELEASE PRINTED IN THE JULY 12 ISSUE OF "FOMSOMOLSKAYA PRAVDA" INDICATED THAT STANLEY MACCULLUM (SIC), A RULING FIGURE IN THE KKK, HAD TOLD THE WASHINGTON POST THAT THIS PROVOCATION WAS "THE HANDIWORK OF HIS ORGANIZATION. " HARTMAN
