Harry Summers was kind enough to call you about my desire to have the President speak in Los Angeles on behalf of our Southern California Committee. My dilemma is as follows.

Through an officer that works for me at First Interstate Bank, Janet Hansen-Flanigan, who went to high school with Craig Fuller, we initiated our first contact with The White House, through Craig, to see if President Reagan would speak at a luncheon to kickoff the United States Olympic Committee effort in Southern California. As instructed, I wrote a letter to President Reagan (Exhibit A). Janet was called by Craig and told to send a follow-up letter to Greg Newell with more details, which I did (Exhibit B).

Through all of this, I had been talking to Peter Ueberroth, President of the Los Angeles games. Peter and I are good friends, and I have been in touch with him regarding this affair. Subsequent to my letter to Mr. Newell, Peter had occasion to have dinner with Mike Deaver in Washington. As a result, Peter wrote a letter to me (Exhibit C). When we had a chance to get together, Peter said that I would be getting a phone call from The White House and that they were optimistic that the President would be available for an event in Southern California. I then received a phone call from Morgan Mason, in which he told me that Deaver had assigned him to interface with the Olympics overall and that they were encouraged

about the event, but it would be the kickoff for the USOC nationwide. I then cleared this with Bill Simon, President of the USOC, and Don Miller, Executive Director. Attached is a copy of my follow-up letter to Morgan Mason dated December 10, 1981 (Exhibit D).

On February 5, I received a letter from Greg Newell (Exhibit E) declining the President's involvement. What I think has happened is that our formal request, through Newell, has been declined; however, I am hopeful that the Ueberroth/Deaver/Mason route is still alive. This morning, Peter Ueberroth and I were discussing another matter, and I brought this situation up, and he thinks my assumptions may be correct.

Prior to Harry's calling me, I was going to call Morgan Mason to ascertain if my assumptions were correct. As you can appreciate, I don't want to get a third party involved; however, I would appreciate any information you could obtain without upsetting anyone in The White House.

I appreciate your interest, and I am indebted to Harry for his interceding on my half.

Dear President Reagan:

The United States Olympic Committee's primary responsibility is to manage the selection, training and travel of athletes that participate in the Winter and Summer Olympics, as well as the Pan American Games. However, the responsibility to promote overall amateur athletes is becoming an even greater goal of the Committee.

The Committee's training center in Colorado Springs, Colorado grows daily in additional facilities, its training expertise, its sport medicine program, as well as its ability to house and train a greater number of amateur athletes all of which are not world class competitors.

Another important role is the Committee's financial assistance to various national sports governing bodies such as the Amateur Hockey Association, U.S.; U.S.A. Diving, Inc.; U.S. Volleyball Association, to name a few.

The total funding of the United States Olympic Committee, as you are well aware, is from donations by private citizens, business and various sponsored events ... a grassroots ... private enterprise approach.

Let me introduce myself and the purpose of this letter. I am the Southern California Chairman for the United States Olympic Committee. My duties include enhancing the image of the United States Olympic Committee, but primarily I am responsible for fund raising in Southern California. Fund raising in Southern California for the United States Olympic Committee during the next three years is greatly simplified by the fact that the 1984 Games are in Los Angeles and the ground swell of support for the Olympics by the business community.

Despite this "super" attitude in Southern California, and hopefully the entire United States, I respectfully ask for your support to increase the awareness of the United States Olympic Committee in Southern California by being our honored guest at an event (breakfast, lunch or dinner) in Los Angeles as early as possible in 1982.

Dear Mr. Newell:

As a follow up to my November 2, letter, in which I invited the President to be our honored guest at an event to enhance the image of the United States Olympic Committee, I am submitting the following supplemental information, in order to assist you and the White House staff in making a decision on this request:

1) SPONSORING ORGANIZATION -

Southern California Committee, United States Olympic Committee.

2) NATURE OF EVENT -

Breakfast, lunch or dinner (whichever is most compatible with the President's schedule) that will serve as a platform to enhance the image of the United States Olympic Committee and its role in the Olympic movement, plus the importance of grass roots financial support. Any funds raised at the event through ticket sales will be donated to the United States Olympic Committee. However, the importance of funds raised at this event is extremely insignificant compared to the importance of the President's support.

3) DATE -

Open. We would hope that the event could be scheduled sometime early in the Spring of '82. Once again, the specific date would be contingent upon the President's availability.

4) LOCATION -

The event will be held in the Los Angeles area. A major hotel will be booked as soon as we have a date confirmed.

5) PARTICIPANTS -

It is anticipated that we will be able to attract an audience of approximately 1,000 individuals from the greater Southern California business, civic, political and sports communities. Honored guests supportive of the Olympic movement (not yet contacted) would be individuals such as Peter Ueberroth, President, Los Angeles Clympic Committee; Justin Dart, Dart Industries; William Simon, President, United States Olympic Committee; F. Don Miller, Executive Director, United States Olympic Committee; Mayor Bradley; etc.

6) PRESIDENT'S ROLE -

We would hope the President will be the keynote speaker for the event, supporting Olympic goals and the importance of the private enterprise approach to financing our Olympic athletes. Prior to his comments we could have several of the other guests give some background comments on the United States Olympic Committee and its role.

On behalf of the entire Southern California Committee, I urge favorable consideration of this invitation. We are convinced that the President's participation in this kick-off event will underscore the American public's commitment to our United States athletes and the Olympic games.
