1. SUMMARY: WE HAVE BRIEFED FRENCH OFFICIALS IN MIN COOPERATION AND DEVELOPMENT AND MIN EXTERNAL RELATIONS ON REFTEL US THOUGHTS ON LLDC CONFERENCE. FRENCH ARE STILL DEBATING THE POSITIONS THEY WILL TAKE AT CONFERENCE AND FINAL DECISIONS HAVE NOT BEEN MADE ON CERTAIN ISSUES. PRESIDENT MITTERRAND WILL OPEN THE CONFERENCE WITH A SPEECH WHICH WILL UNDOUBTEDLY OUTLINE HIS GOVERNMENT'S POLICY FOR INCREASED AID TO THE THIRD WORLD GENERALLY AND ESPECIALLY TO THE LLDC'S. HE WILL UNDOUBTEDLY REFER TO PREVIOUS STATEMENTS WHICH WOULD COMMIT FRANCE TO INCREASE ITS ODA NOT INCLUDING ASSISTANCE TO THE FRENCH OVERSEAS DEPARTMENTS AND TERRITORIES (DOM-TOM'S) TO 0.7 PERCENT OF GNP OVER A FIVE OR SEVEN YEAR PERIOD, AND WITHIN THAT FIGURE TO PROVIDE Ø.15 PERCENT TO THE LLDC'S. HE WILL UNDOUBTEDLY CALL FOR INTERNATIONAL MOBILIZATION TO ASSIST THE LLDC'S AND MAY MENTION PROPOSALS FOR AN EC STABEX TYPE ARRANGEMENT COVERING ALL LLDC'S AND CALL FOR PARTICIPATION OF OTHER DEVELOPED COUNTRIES IN THIS TYPE OPERATION. CONFERENCE WILL BE CHAIRED BY FRENCH MINISTER OF COOPERATION AND DEVELOPMENT JEAN PIERRE COT IN KEEPING WITH THE ENLARGED ROLE WHICH HE HAS BEEN GIVEN IN DEVELOP-MENT MATTERS, NORTH-SOUTH, AND AS THE RESPONSIBLE MINISTRY FOR SUBSTANTIVE PLANNING FOR DEVELOPMENT CON-FERENCES OF THIS TYPE.

2. EMBASSI/AID OFFICER HAS BEEN IN CONTACT WITH SEVERAL FRENCH OFFICIALS WORKING ON VARIOUS SUBSTANTIVE ASPECTS OF THE LLDC CONFERENCE AND WHO ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR PRE-PARING FRANCE'S POSITION ON VARIOUS ISSUES TO BE TREATED AT THE CONFERENCE. OFFICIALS INCLUDE MEMBERS OF MINISTER COT'S CABINET AND AN OFFICIAL OF ECONOMIC AFFAIRS DIRECTORATE OF THE QUAL, WHO HAS BEEN WORKING ON POLICY DECISIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SEVERAL WEEKS. THESE MEETINGS. WE HAVE INDICATED U.S. CONCERNS AND OBJECTIVES AS SET FORTH IN REPTEL AND PREVIOUS MESSAGES.

3. AFTER MANY HESITATIONS, FRENCE ARE NOW COMING TO GRIPS WITH SUBSTANTIVE QUESTIONS TO DETERMINE FRENCH POSITION TO SATISFACTION OF ELYSEE. MIN EXTERNAL RELATIONS. MIN COOPERATION AND DEVELOPMENT, TREASURY, ETC. OFFICIALS NORMALLY START OUT BY SAYING FORMER GOVERNMENT OFFERED PARIS AS SITE OF CONFERENCE AND THEN DID NOTHING ABOUT IT. LEAVING FULL BURDEN ON NEW ADMINISTRATION. THEY ALSO THEIR DELAY IN FINAL DECISIONS IMPLICITLY BLAME ON THE FACT THAT ISSUES ARE COMPLEX AND THAT THERE HAS BEEN INSUFFICIENT TIME TO PREPARE MORE IN-DEPTH STUDIES.

4. FOLLOWING ARE VARIOUS POINTS WHICH FRENCH OFFICIALS HAVE OUTLINED TO US AS THEIR EXPECTED POSITIONS: (A) FRENCH WANT CONFERENCE TO BE A SUCCESS IN VIEW OF PRESENT GOVERNMENT'S AREN INTEREST IN THE THIRD WORLD, AND PARTICULARLY SINCE CONFERENCE IS IN PARIS. THEY WANT TO AVOID POLEMICS AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE AND KEEP CONFERENCE ON EVEN KERL. GENERALLY. THEY PLAN TO POINT OUT THAT SITUATION OF LLDG'S HAS BEEN CONSTANTLY DETERIORATING AND THAT IT IS NOW ABSOLUTELY CRITICAL TO DO SOMETHING FROM ECONOMIC/SOCIAL POINT OF VIEW. FRANCE WILL THEREFORE CALL UPON THE DEVELOPED WORLD AND OPEC TO SUPPORT EXPANDED DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS IN THESE COUNTRIES AND TO LOOK FOR INNOVATIVE WAYS TO DO THIS IN FULL PARTNERSHIP WITH THE LLDC'S. FRENCH LINEWISE BELIEVE INCREASED AID IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE OF RISKS OF POLITICAL DESTABILIZATION IF NOTHING IS DONE. THIS LATTER POINT MAY NOT BE EMPHASIZED HOWEVER IN OFFICIAL DECLARATIONS. (B) FRENCH AGREE WITH THE U.S. VIEW THAT INCREASED AID IN ITSELF WILL NOT PRODUCE DEVELOPMENT IN MANY COUNTRIES UNLESS POLICY REFORMS ARE UNDERTAKEN AT THE SAME TIME. CERTAIN FRENCH OFFICIALS HAVE THEREFORE SUGGESTED THAT THIS POINT BE MADE BY PRESIDENT MITTERRAND IN HIS SPEECH PERHAPS BY SPEAKING OF A CONTRACTUAL TYPE ARRANGEMENT BETWEEN DONORS AND RECIPIENTS AS FQUAL PARTNERS BUT WHICH WOULD REQUIRE THE NECESSARY UNDERSTANDINGS TO HELP MAKE ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE TRULY EFFECTIVE. THIS MIGHT INCLUDE REVISED OVERALL ECONOMIC ORIENTATIONS AS WELL AS TECHNICAL

- (E) THE FRENCH ARE NOW DISCUSSING WITH THEIR EUROPEAN PARTNERS OF THE EEC A PROPOSAL FOR THE BROADENING OF THE STABEX PRINCIPLE TO INCLUDE OTHER LLDC'S NOT IN THE LOME CONVENTION GROUP (THE ACP). SOME NINE ADDITIONAL LLDC'S WOULD THUS BE GIVEN CERTAIN ADVANTAGES. Has Mitterrand Changed View of Business?

PARIS — President Francois Mitterrand marked his first hundred days in office last week with a tribute to private enterprise — and an unabashed plea for its support — that drew reactions, more or less across the ideological spectrum, of "how's that again?"

Businessmen were settling in nicely to their role of naughty boys who needed to be punished. Mr. Mitterrand had always made them feel they had it coming and since the Socialists came to power on his bandwagon many of them, and not the least, have scolded away in harsh and menacing tones.

What it amounts to — apparently 100 days did the trick — is that the euphoria of victory has largely vanished and Mr. Mitterrand is seeing things more clearly now.

After last week's Cabinet meeting, he had Pierre Beregovoy, secretary general of the presidency, inform the press that "heads of businesses should not be treated as scapegoats, but trusted so they take part in the effort to create jobs, reconquer the domestic market and update technologically.

"For the president," Mr. Beregovoy said, "there is an obvious need to associate the heads of business enterprises with the national job-creation effort and this means defining a coherent policy-toward them."

Quoting this last passage in a front-page editorial the next day, le Monde commented. "It could scarcely be better put that there hasn't been one up to now."

A paper less charitably disposed toward the new regime, le Quotidien de Paris, quipped about the scapegoat line: "how painful it must have been for Francois Mitterrand to say it."

There is very strong evidence that Mr. Mitterrand is not all inclined to leave businessmen with their faces in the corner even if he could get away with it. The point is he cannot.

No matter how many jobs are made in the public sector, no serious, dent can be made in unemployment until the private sector picks up. This is particularly trueof the so-called small and medium-size enterprises—firms with 10 to 500 employees—where a majority of Frenchmen work and turn out more than a third of the country's exports.

Mr. Mitterrand's kind words for business were in fact accompanied by the announcement that he has instructed Prime Minister Pierre Mauroy's government to come up, by Sept. 15, with a set of measures to encourage expansion, and hence employment, by small and medium-size businesses.

Just what they'll be, and more important, whether they'll work, are unanswered questions.

Mr. Mauroy and several of his ministers have done a great deal to undermine business confidence further since Mr. Mitterrand's election.

The prime minister, inaugurating a new highway in Poitiers on July 25, vowed that businessmen whose firms got into difficulty through their own

"incompetence" would be dealt with "sternly," which included the attachment of their "personal chattels."

Business organizations were out-

Who is to judge a businessman's competence in times of worldwide recession and monetary disorder, an employers' association leader from Mr. Mauroy's home district demanded.

A few days earlier, the minister of labor, Jean Auroux, had issued a statement on the pending amnesty law saying that it would be "very liberal" to workers sentenced for offenses committed during labor disputes but "much stricter regarding offenses committed by employers."

The Consell National du Patronat Français — the national employers association — came out with a strong statement decrying the injustice of applying a law differently according to the social origin of the offender.

However, the law has been passed as the Socialists drafted it and firms are being forced to take back men

fired for illegal acts.

Last week, for example, Groupe des Assurances Nationales, a nationalized insurance company, agreed to rehire a shop steward belonging to the communist-led CGT who was fired for illegal restraint of the company chairman in 1979. Five CGT militants are being taken back into the Paris bus and subway system and four national railways engineer trainees who didn't make the grade are to be given another chance.

From the union point of view, of course, this is only justice. Unfortunately, it seems to have bred an atmosphere in which unions take the law into their own hands with impunity these days.

Recently union members have "confiscated" a shipment of videodisc components to prevent Thomson-Brandt, the large electronics group slated for nationalization, from going through with a deal for manufacture in Japan.

And unions at the state tobacco

monopoly seized all foreign cigarettes at a warehouse to force people to "smoke French." The action was touched off by the three-week layoff of 223 workers manufacturing the French Gitanes brand because of lagging sales and huge stocks.

It is of course nationalization itself, and its use by unions to increase "worker power" in enterprises, that most disturbs businessmen.

And the unions are making it increasingly plain that they will not hesitate to act against the new administration, by strike if necessary, to increase their power.

In view of all this, business

In view of all this, business spokesmen have remained highly skeptical of Mr. Mitterrand's appeal for their support. They are telling him what they expect; it remains to be seen how much they'll get.

At this writing, it doesn't look all bad. If, on Thursday, Michel Rolant, a national secretary of the CFDT was able to claim "substantial and positive progress" at a meeting with Jean le Garrec, the secretary of state in charge of nationalization, the same day Mr. Auroux, the labor minister, affirmed that unions would not be given veto power over an employer's decision to cut staff.

If that holds true, and Mr. Mitterrand comes through with the help for small and medium businesses he has promised, then his unexpected tribute to the private sector may indeed mark a turning point.

However, the informed reader is advised to draw no conclusion.

Jacques Attali, one of Mr. Mitterrand's key economic advisers, explained in his 1978 book "La Nouvelle Economie Francaise" that small and medium-size private enterprises are indispensable to Socialist plans.

"Better than others, they can adjust rapidly to demand, develop innovations, get small teams of specialists to cooperate and have favorable relations with their customers and suppliers," he wrote (on page 206).

But on page 207 he noted: "when

But on page 207 he noted: "when they become significantly influential over modes of production, they will be nationalized."

1. SUMMARY

THE WEAKNESS OF THE FRANC HAS CONTINUED BEYOND THE AUGUST 15 "TARGET DATE" FOR EMS REALIGNMENT. THE BANK OF FRANCE HAS STABILIZED MONEY MARKET RATES. ABANDONING, AT LEAST FOR NOW, ATTEMPTS TO MOVE DOWN DOMESTIC INTEREST RATES RELATIVE TO THOSE PREVAILING INTERNATIONALLY.

PRESIDENT MITTERRAND HAS ASKED THAT MEASURES BE TAKEN IN SEPTEMBER "TO ACCELERATE THE RECOVERY IN ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, " AFTER NOTING THE CONTINUING RISE IN UNEMPLOYMENT. IN JULY, THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE ROSE TO 8.1 PERCENT. HOWEVER, THE INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF NEW UNEMPLOYED IS SLOWING DOWN. THERE ARE OTHER INDICATIONS THAT THE WORST MAY BE OVER FOR ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN FRANCE. INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION ROSE IN JUNE, AND THE JULY BANK OF FRANCE SURVEY ALSO INDICATES AN IMPROVEMENT IN PRODUCTION, THOUGH A VERY LIMITED AND FRAGILE ONE. RETAIL PRICES ROSE 1.7 PERCENT IN JULY, DUE IN LARGE MEASURE TO PUBLIC SECTOR PRICE INCREASES. THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS DEFICIT NARROYED SHARPLY IN THE SECOND QUARTER, THE RESULT OF LOWER IMPORT GROWTH DUE TO THE WEAKNESS OF THE DOMESTIC ECONOMY AND MORE BUOYANT EXPORTS. THE SERVICES ACCOUNTS IMPROVED AS WELL. HOWEVER, THERE WAS A FF 22 BILLION DROP IN FRANCE'S EXTERNAL MONETARY POSITION REFLECTING CAPITAL OUTFLOWS LINKED TO THE ELECTORAL SEASON'S POLITICAL CLIMATE. BUDGET MINISTER FABIUS IN A RECENT INTERVIEW SAID THAT FF 30 BILLION IN ADDITION-AL RECEIPS MUST BE FOUND TO LIMIT THE 1982 DEFICIT TO FF 95 BILLION, AND CONFIRMD THAT A WEALTH TAX WILL BE IMPOSED TO SUPPLY PART OF THE NECESSARY ADDITIONAL FUNDS. THE 1981 BUDGET DEFICIT DURING THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS WAS, ACCORDING TO DATA ON TREASURY OPERATIONS, 38 PERCENT LARGER THAN THE PRECEDING YEAR DEFICIT. THE GOF ANNOUNCED THAT IT WILL FLOAT ITS FIRST POST ELECTION BOND ISSUE IN SEPTEMBER.

BEYOND AUGUST 15. THE FOCUS DATE FOR EXCHANGE MARKET EXPECTATIONS OF EMS REALIGNMENT. AS OF THE 20TH, THE BANK OF FRANCE'S FOREIGN EXCHANGE RESERVES HAD DROPPED FF 9 BILLION FROM AMOUNTS REPORTED AT THE END OF JULY. THE BANK OF FRANCE HAS STABILIZED ITS MONEY MARKET INTERVENTION RATES, AND MONEY MARKET RATES AT LONGER TERM HAVE MOVED UP SINCE, IN VIEW OF THE WEAKNESS OF THE FRANC, PEOPLE NO LONGER EXPECT THE BANK TO ACTIVELY PUSH INTEREST RATES DOWN. INTEREST RATES ON BONDS, ON THE OTHER HAND, MOVED DOWN A LITTLE OVER THE PERIOD, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF GOF ISSUES. FRENCH STOCK MARKET PRICES ROSE IN THE BASIS OF GOF STATEMENTS THAT THE "LOI MONORY" GIVING FAVORABLE TAX TREATMENT TO STOCK INVESTMENT WILL NOT BE RESCINDED, AND A BELIEF AMONG SOME INVESTORS THAT NATIONALIZATION WILL BE LIMITED TO HOLDING COMPANIES AND THAT COMPENSATION WILL BE ADEQUATE. THE PREMIUM OF THE "DIVISE-TITRE" OVER THE MARKET \$/FF EXCHANGE RATE STABILIZED AT 21 PERCENT. PRICES OF FOREIGN STOCKS FELL, REFLECTING TRENDS IN THE U.S. MARKETS AND THE DEPRECIATION OF DOLLAR.

-4. MITTERRAND: RECOVERY MUST BE ACCELERATED

DURING LAST WEEK'S COUNCIL OF MINISTERS MEETING. PRESIDENT MITTERRAND NOTED THE CONTINUING RISE IN UNEMPLOYMENT AND ASKED THAT MEASURES BE TAKEN IN SEPTEMBER "TO ACCELERATE THE RECOVERY OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, PARTICULARLY IN JOB-CREATING SECTORS", MEANING SMALL AND MEDIUM-SIZED FIRMS. ACCORDING TO ELYSEE SECRETARY-GENERAL BEREGOVOY, "FOR THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC, THE NECESSITY TO ASSOCIATE BUSINESS LEADERS TO THE NATIONAL EFFORT TO CREATE EMPLOYMENT IS EVIDENT AND THAT REQUIRES THE DEFINITION OF A COHERENT POLICY RELATIVE TO THEM. THIS POLICY SHOULD CLARIFY THE ECONOMIC RULES OF THE GAME, ELIMINATE OBSTACLES TO INVESTMENT AND JOB CREATION, IMPROVE THE IMAGE OF BUSINESS LEADERS IN THE COUNTRY AND ASSURE THAT THE CONDITIONS EXIST FOR A REAL COOPERATION BETWEEN HEADS OF BUSINESS AND EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATIONS IN THE SMALL AND MEDIUM-SIZED FIRMS." SPECIAL MEASURES FOR THESE FIRMS HAVE ALREADY BEEN PROVIDEO: GOVERNMENT PAYMENT FOR PART OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY COSTS NORMALLY PAID BY THE EMPLOYER, PREFERENTIAL INTEREST RATES AND LOANS FUNDS.

THE ADDITIONAL MEASURES UNDER CONSIDERATION REPORTEDLY INCLUDE THE INCLUSION OF SMALL FIRMS IN CONTRACTS ARISING FROM THE GOF'S INDUSTRIAL POLICY TO ENCOURAGE INNOVATION, AND THE USE OF REGIONAL REFORM MEASURES TO PERMIT SELECTIVE ECONOMIC STIMULUS. THERE ARE, IN ADDITION, MEASURES UNDER CONSIDERATION TO FACILITATE SMALL AND MEDIUM FIRMS' ACCESS TO CAPITAL, MEASURES TO REDUCE INHERITANCE TAXES AS THEY AFFECT SMALLER FIRMS, A REVISION OF THE SYSTEM OF PAYMENTS TO BENEFIT SMALLER FIRMS, AND THE WAIVING OF A POSSIBLE FUTURE GOF VETO ON LAYOFFS. SPECIFIC MEASURES UNDER CONSIDERATION REPORTEDLY INCLUDE THE USE OF NATIONALIZED FIRMS TO DIRECT SUB-CONTRACTS TO SMALLER FIRMS, AND A REQUIREMENT THAT LARGE INSTITUTIONAL INVESTORS USE A PART OF THEIR FUNDS TO PURCHASE STOCK OF SMALLER COMPANIES. -S. UNEMPLOYMENT -- JUL/

THE SEASONALLY ADJUSTED NUMBER OF JOB SEEKERS INCREASED 1.3 PERCENT FOLLOWING A 1.7 PERCENT JUNE INCREASE, 25.8 PERCENT UP FROM M YEAR AGO. THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE WAS 8.1 PERCENT IN JULY. HOWEVER, THE WORSENING OF THE EMPLOYMENT SITUATION REDUCTIOSEEMS TO BE SLOWING, SINCE THESE MONTHLY INCREASES ARE MUCH LOWER THAN EARLIER INFILLED VACANCIES DECREASED 0.9 PERCENT AS WELL FOLLOWING A 4.1 PERCENT JUNE DECREASE, 22.7 PERCENT DOWN FROM A YEAR AGO.

-8. GOF BOND ISSUE

THE GOF HAS ANNOUNCED THAT IT WILL OFFER A FF 8 BILLION, 6-YEAR BOND ISSUE AT A RATE OF 16.75 PERCENT ON SEPTEMBER 1Ø. IT WILL BE THE FIRST SUCH ISSUE SINCE THE ELECTION AND ONLY THE SECOND THIS YEAR -- THE FIRST ISSUE, FOR 1Ø BILLION, WAS PLACED IN JANUARY. THE ISSUE WILL PROVIDE THE SAME TAX ADVANTAGES AS OTHER GOF BONDS -- A FF 3,000 DEDUCTION FOR INTEREST EARNINGS, A PREFERENTIAL TAX RATE ON EARNINGS ALONE FF 3,000, AND EXEMPTION FROM WITHHOLDING. HOWEVER, IT WILL BE REIMBURSABLE ONLY AT THE END OF THE SIX YEARS.

- SOCIETE GENERALE WILL BE THE LEAD BANK OF A CONSORTIUM OF 15 AND A TOTAL OF 60 CONTRACTING INSTITUTIONS.
- THE INTEREST RATE OFFERED IS A LITTLE ABOVE THE PRESENT MARKET RETURN ON SIMILAR ISSUES, AND HAS LED TO A SLIGHT INCREASE IN MARKET RATES THIS WEEK. THE ISSUE IS REGARDED AS A FIRST TEST OF INVESTORS' ATTITUDES TOWARD THE NEW GOVERNMENT, WHICH WILL HAVE TO CONTINUE COMING TO THE MARKET FOR FUNDS TO FINANCE THE MUCH LARGER BUDGET DEFICITS FORECAST THIS YEAR AND NEXT. THE INTEREST COST ON THE ISSUE IS ESTIMATED AT FF 1.35 BILLION PER YEAR AND TOTAL COST AT THE END OF 6 YEARS AT FF 16 BILLION.
- -9. BANK OF FRANCE JUNE INDUSTRIAL SURVEY

RESULTS OF THE BANK OF FRANCE INDUSTRIAL SURVEY COVERING JUNE ACTIVITY SHOW, AS DID THE INSEE SURVEY FOR THE SAME PERIOD, A SLIGHT INCREASE IN PRODUCTION, BUT WITH ACTIVITY STILL REMAINING AT A LEVEL LOWER THAN A YEAR AGO. UNLIKE INSEE, THE BANK ATTRIBUTES THIS SLIGHT INCREASE ESSENTIALLY TO "TECHNICAL AND SEASONAL FACTORS." THE INCREASE IN CAPACITY UTILIZATION IS CONSIDERED

DUE TO A PICK-UP THAT HAS OCCURRED AFTER INVENTORIES WERE ALLOWED TO DIMINISH, PARTICULARLY IN THE INTERMEDIATE GOODS SECTORS, BUT IT MAY BE ONLY A TEMPORARY ADJUSTMENT. CONSUMER GOODS PRODUCTION SHOWED A SEASONAL INCREASE; HOWEVER, NO IMPROVEMENT OCCURRED IN CAPITAL GOODS PRODUCTION, WHICH HAS BEEN DECLINING SINCE MAY. UNEMPLOYMENT FURTHER INCREASED DURING JUNE IN MANY INDUSTRIES.

- DEMAND SHOWED A SLIGHT INCREASE. THE
 POSSIBLE DOMESTIC CAUSE MAY BE STOCKBUILDING
 IN ANTICIPATION OF HIGHER PRICES. THE INCREASE
 IN FOREIGN DEMAND IS PRESUMABLY DUE TO IMPROVED
 COMPETITIVENESS FROM A DEPRECIATING FRANC.
 OVERALL, INCREASED DOMESTIC DEMAND WAS SOMEWHAT
 STRONGER THAN FOREIGN DEMAND AND THE BANK NOTES
 THAT FRENCH BUSINESS USUALLY REACTS IN THIS
 WAY PRIOR TO EXPECTED PRICE INCREASES. STILL,
 THE INCREASE IN DEMAND IS VIEWED AS VERY LIMITED,
 AS THE INCREASED COST OF MONEY IS SEEN AS A PRINCIPAL
 CAUSE FOR INVENTORIES STILL TO BE VERY HEAVY AND
 CAPITAL GOODS ORDERS TO BE LOW.
- BUSINESS FORECASTS WERE MIXED: THE VIEW FOR JULY WAS GOOD BUT THERE IS CONSIDERABLE UNCERTAINTY ABOUT THE POST-VACATION PERIOD. INTERMEDIATE GOODS PRODUCTION, WITH THE MAJOR EXCEPTION OF BUILDING INDUSTRIES, SHOWED VARYING DEGREES OF IMPROVEMENT IN JUNE, DUE TO WHAT ARE CONSIDERED TO BE LARGELY TECHNICAL ADJUSTMENTS. BEYOND THIS, BUSINESS FORECASTS ARE FOR A RETURN TO FLAT ACTIVITY. CAPITAL GOODS WERE THOUGHT TO BE THE SECTOR HARDEST HIT BY HIGH INTEREST RATES.

THE TWO INDUSTRIES WHICH HAVE DONE WELL IN PAST MONTHS, AIRCRAFT AND ELECTRONICS, STILL SHOW THE BEST PRODUCTION, BUT SHOW THEY, TOO, ARE ENCOUNTERING DIFFICULTIES. NO IMPROVEMENT IS FORESEEN IN CAPITAL GOODS PRODUCTION IN COMING MONTHS. CONSUMER GOODS DID WELL IN JUNE, BUT THIS WAS PRINCIPALLY DUE TO FOOD INDUSTRIES. OVER THE SHORT-TERM, THE SAME LEVEL OF ACTIVITY SHOULD CONTINUE.

- OUTPUT IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY STAGNATED IN JULY, WITH AN INCREASE EXPECTED ONLY AT THE END OF THE YEAR WHEN GOF INCENTIVE MEASURES SHOULD BEGIN TO AFFECT ACTIVITY. RETAIL SALES PICKED UP IN JUNE. STOCKS OF INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTS ARE NOW CONSIDERED AT BELOW NORMAL LEVELS, AND EXPECTATIONS OF STRONGER SALES AFTER THE SUMMER HOLIDAYS, TOGETHER WITH ANTICIPATIONS OF HIGHER INFLATION, HAVE LED TRADERS TO CONSIDER NCREASING ORDERS.

~18. BALANCE OF PAYMENTS -- SECOND QUARTER 1981

THE CURRENT ACCOUNT DEFICIT, S.A., NARROWED SUBSTANTIALLY IN THE SECOND QUARTER DUE TO BOTH A REDUCTION IN THE TRADE DEFICIT AND A LARGER SURPLUS ON THE SERVICES ACCOUNTS. THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE TRADE ACCOUNT WAS DUE TO BOTH A SLOWER RISE IN IMPORTS AND MUCH FASTER EXPORT GROWTH. THE SLOWDOWN IN IMPORT VALUE WAS LIMITED, HOWEVER, BY THE LARGE INCREASE IN THE ENERGY BILL LINKED TO DOLLAR APPRECIATION (FF 48.5 BILLION AND FF 77.2 FOR THE FIRST HALF, COMPARED TO FF 72.6 BILLION IN FIRST HALF 1980), DESPITE A SHARP DROP IN THE VOLUME OF IMPORTED OIL. BUOYANT AGRICULTURAL SALES CONTRIBUTED TO THIS YEAR'S RECOVERY IN EXPORTS.

- ALTHOUGH INCOME IN SERVICES ROSE SHARPLY
IN THE SECOND QUARTER, RECEIPTS FOR THE FIRST
HALF AS A WHOLE WERE SLIGHTLY BELOW FIRST HALF 1988.
THE BETTER TREND ON NET INVISIBLES IN THE SECOND
QUARTER WAS DUE IN PART TO THE END OF THE EXCEPTIONAL
BROKERAGE PAYMENTS RELATED TO EMERGENCY
OIL SUPPLY CONTRACTS ARRANGED TO COMPENSATE FOR
SUPPLY DISRUPTIONS AT THE BEGINNING OF THE
IRAN-IRAQI WAR. INCOME FROM LARGE PROJECTS ROSE
LARGELY BECAUSE OF CONTRACTS CONCLUDED
WITH SAUDI ARABIA. RECEIPTS ON TOURISM WERE UP

SHARPLY IN THE SECOND QUARTER, BUT FOR THE FIRST HALF WERE ONLY A LITTLE UP FROM A YEAR AGO. ON THE OTHER HAND, THE DEFICIT ON TRADE-RELATED SERVICES ROSE, PARTLY AS A RESULT OF DOLLAR APPRECIATION. THE INVESTMENT INCOME ACCOUNT SHIFTED INTO SURPLUS IN THE SECOND QUARTER FROM A DEFICIT IN THE FIRST BUT WAS STILL SUBSTANTIALLY BELOW LASTYEAR'S SURPLUS, LARGELY BECAUSEOF LARGER PUBLIC AND PRIVATE DEBT SERVICE PAYMENTS. HIGHER INTEREST EARNINGS ON FRENCH FOREIGN EXCHANGE RESERVES LARGELY OFFSET THE HIGHER INTEREST PAYMENTS ROSE SHARPLY, THE RESULT OFSUBSTANTIALLY HIGHER WORKERS' REMITTANCES.

THERE WAS A VERY LARGE NEGATIVE SWING IN THE LONG-TERM CAPITAL ACCOUNT IN THE SECOND QUARTER. FRENCH EXTENSION OF EXPORT CREDIT EXPANDED AT THE SAME TIME AS FRENCH DIRECT AND ESPECIALLY PORTFOLIO INVESTMENT ABROAD SKYROCKETED. INVARD INVESTMENT, BOTH DIRECT AND PORTFOLIO, STABILIZED. THE OUTFLOW OF LONG-TERM CAPITAL WAS PARTIALLY LIMITED BY LARGER DRAWINGS UNDER THE NATIONALIZED ENTERPRISE BORROWING PROGRAM. INFLOWS OF SHORTTERM PRIVATE SECTOR CAPITAL ROSE, BUT THERE WAS A FF 14 BILLION NEGATIVE SHIFT IN THE ADJUSTMENT AND ERRORS AND OMISSIONS LINE.

THE GOF MUST FIND FF 30 BILLION IN ADDITIONAL RECEIPTS TO LIMIT THE1982 DEFICIT TO FF 95 BILLION, SINCE SPENDING IS EXPECTED TO GROW ABOUT 25 PERCENT. FINAL DECISIONS HAVE REPORTEDLY NOT BEEN MADE, BUT FABIUS CONFIRMED THAT THE GOF WOULD IMPOSE A WEALTH TAX, WHICHWOULD EEMPT THE FIRST FF 3 MILLION, AND TAX THE REST PROBABLY AT A RATE SIGNIFICANTLY UNDER 5 PERCENT. THE TAX WILL, ACCORDINGTO FABIUS, AFFECT ONLY 1-2 PERCENT OF TAXPAYERS. CONTRARY TO CAMPAIGN PROMISES. THE TAX WILL PROBABLY FALL ON PRODUCTIVE CAPACITY THOUGH PROBABLY WITH A PREFERENTIAL DEDUCTION. IN ADDITION, HE SAID THAT TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR DEPENDENTS WHICH HAVE BEEN UNIMITED IN MOST CASES WILL NOW HAVE A CEILING PLACED ON THEM.

THIS HAS THE EFFECT OF MAKING THE PERSONAL INCOME TAX MORE PROGRESSIVE.

ON THE QUESTION OF WHERE THE FF 30 BILIN IN NEW TAXES WILL BE RAISED, LE MONDE REPORTS THAT ABOUT HALF SHOULD COME FROM DIRECT TAXES, HALF FROM INDIRECTTAXES. THE WEALTH TAX IS EXPECTED TO YIELD BETWEEN FF 5 AND 10 BILLION. IN ADDITION, AN INCREASE IN THE PROGRESSIVITY OF THE TAX SYSTEM, WITH A NEW UPPER BRACKET OF 65 PERCENT, IS UNDER DISCUSSION. AMONG INDIRECT TAXES, A CHOICE IS TO BE MADE BETWEEN AN INCREASE IN TAXES ON PETROLEUM AND AN INCREASE IN THE VALUE-ADDED TAX.

1. SUMMARY

THE WEAKNESS OF THE FRANC HAS CONTINUED BEYOND THE AUGUST 15 "TARGET DATE" FOR EMS REALIGNMENT. THE BANK OF FRANCE HAS STABILIZED MONEY MARKET RATES, ABANDONING, AT LEAST FOR NOW, ATTEMPTS TO MOVE DOWN DOMESTIC INTEREST RATES RELATIVE TO THOSE PREVAILING INTERNATIONALLY.

PRESIDENT MITTERRAND HAS ASKED THAT MEASURES BE TAKEN IN SEPTEMBER "TO ACCELERATE THE RECOVERY IN ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, " AFTER NOTING THE CONTINUING RISE IN UNEMPLOYMENT. IN JULY, THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE ROSE TO 8.1 PERCENT. HOWEVER, THE INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF NEW UNEMPLOYED IS SLOWING DOWN. THERE ARE OTHER INDICATIONS THAT THE WORST MAY BE OVER FOR ECONOMIC ACTIVITY IN FRANCE. INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION ROSE IN JUNE, AND THE JULY BANK OF FRANCE SURVEY ALSO INDICATES AN IMPROVEMENT IN PRODUCTION, THOUGH A VERY LIMITED AND FRAGILE ONE. RETAIL PRICES ROSE 1.7 PERCENT IN JULY, DUE IN LARGE MEASURE TO PUBLIC SECTOR PRICE INCREASES. THE BALANCE OF PAYMENTS DEFICIT NARROWED SHARPLY IN THE SECOND QUARTER, THE RESULT OF LOWER IMPORT GROWTH DUE TO THE WEAKNESS OF THE DOMESTIC ECONOMY AND MORE BUOYANT EXPORTS. THE SERVICES ACCOUNTS IMPROVED AS WELL. HOWEVER, THERE WAS A FF 22 BILLION DROP IN FRANCE'S EXTERNAL MONETARY POSITION REFLECTING CAPITAL OUTFLOWS LINKED TO THE ELECTORAL SEASON'S POLITICAL CLIMATE. BUDGET MINISTER FABIUS IN A RECENT INTERVIEW SAID THAT FF 30 BILLION IN ADDITION-AL RECEIPS MUST BE FOUND TO LIMIT THE 1982 DEFICIT TO FF 95 BILLION, AND CONFIRMD THAT A WEALTH TAX WILL BE IMPOSED TO SUPPLY PART OF THE NECESSARY ADDITIONAL FUNDS. THE 1981 BUDGET DEFICIT DURING THE FIRST FOUR MONTHS WAS, ACCORDING TO DATA ON TREASURY OPERATIONS, 38 PERCENT LARGER THAN THE PRECEDING YEAR DEFICIT. THE GOF ANNOUNCED THAT IT WILL FLOAT ITS FIRST POST ELECTION BOND ISSUE IN SEPTEMBER.

MONORY" GIVING FAVORABLE TAX TREATMENT TO STOCK INVESTMENT WILL NOT BE RESCINDED, AND A BELIEF AMONG SOME INVESTORS THAT NATIONALIZATION WILL BE LIMITED TO HOLDING COMPANIES AND THAT COMPENSATION WILL BE ADEQUATE. THE PREMIUM OF THE "DIVISE-TITRE" OVER THE MARKET \$/FF EXCHANGE RATE \$TABILIZED AT 21 PERCENT. PRICES OF FOREIGN STOCKS FELL. REFLECTING TRENDS IN THE U.S. MARKETS AND THE DEPRECIATION OF DOLLAR.

-4. MITTERRAND: RECOVERY MUST BE ACCELERATED

DURING LAST WEEK'S COUNCIL OF MINISTERS MEETING. PRESIDENT MITTERRAND NOTED THE CONTINUING RISE IN UNEMPLOYMENT AND ASKED THAT MEASURES BE TAKEN IN SEPTEMBER "TO ACCELERATE THE RECOVERY OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY, PARTICULARLY IN JOB-CREATING SECTORS", MEANING SMALL AND MEDIUM-SIZED FIRMS. ACCORDING TO ELYSEE SECRETARY-GENERAL BEREGOVOY, "FOR THE PRESIDENT OF THE REPUBLIC, THE NECESSITY TO ASSOCIATE BUSINESS LEADERS TO THE NATIONAL EFFORT TO CREATE EMPLOYMENT IS EVIDENT AND THAT REQUIRES THE DEFINITION OF A COHERENT POLICY RELATIVE TO THEM. THIS POLICY SHOULD CLARIFY THE ECONOMIC RULES OF THE GAME, ELIMINATE OBSTACLES TO INVESTMENT AND JOB CREATION, IMPROVE THE IMAGE OF BUSINESS LEADERS IN THE COUNTRY AND ASSURE THAT THE CONDITIONS EXIST FOR A REAL COOPERATION BETWEEN HEADS OF BUSINESS AND EMPLOYEE ORGANIZATIONS IN THE SMALL AND MEDIUM-SIZED FIRMS." SPECIAL MEASURES FOR THESE FIRMS HAVE ALREADY BEEN PROVIDED: GOVERNMENT PAYMENT FOR PART OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY COSTS NORMALLY PAID BY THE EMPLOYER, PREFERENTIAL INTEREST RATES AND LOANS FUNDS.

THE ADDITIONAL MEASURES UNDER CONSIDERATION REPORTEDLY INCLUDE THE INCLUSION OF SMALL FIRMS IN CONTRACTS ARISING FROM THE GOF'S INDUSTRIAL POLICY TO ENCOURAGE INNOVATION, AND THE USE OF REGIONAL REFORM MEASURES TO PERMIT SELECTIVE ECONOMIC STIMULUS. THERE ARE, IN ADDITION, MEASURES UNDER CONSIDERATION TO FACILITATE SMALL AND MEDIUM FIRMS' ACCESS TO CAPITAL. MEASURES TO REDUCE INHERITANCE TAXES AS THEY AFFECT SMALLER FIRMS, A REVISION OF THE SYSTEM OF PAYMENTS TO BENEFIT SMALLER FIRMS, AND THE WAIVING OF A POSSIBLE FUTURE GOF VETO ON LAYOFFS. SPECIFIC MEASURES UNDER CONSIDERATION REPORTEDLY INCLUDE THE USE OF NATIONALIZED FIRMS TO DIRECT SUB-CONTRACTS TO SMALLER FIRMS, AND A REQUIREMENT THAT LARGE INSTITUTIONAL INVESTORS USE A PART OF THEIR FUNDS TO PURCHASE STOCK OF SMALLER COMPANIES. -5. UNEMPLOYMENT -- JULY

THE SEASONALLY ADJUSTED NUMBER OF JOB SEEKERS INCREASED 1.3 PERCENT FOLLOWING A 1.7 PERCENT JUNE INCREASE, 25.8 PERCENT UP FROM M YEAR AGO. THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE WAS 8.1 PERCENT IN JULY. HOWEVER, THE WORSENING OF THE EMPLOYMENT SITUATION REDUCTIOSEEMS TO BE SLOWING, SINCE THESE MONTHLY INCREASES ARE MUCH LOWER THAN EARLIER IN THE YEAR. THE SEASONALLY ADJUSTED NUMBER OF UNFILLED VACANCIES DECREASED 8.9 PERCENT AS WELL FOLLOWING A 4.1 PERCENT JUNE DECREASE, 22.7 PERCENT DOWN FROM A YEAR AGO.

HOWEVER, IT WILL BE REIMBURSABLE ONLY AT THE END OF THE

- SOCIETE GENERALE WILL BE THE LEAD BANK OF A CONSORTIUM OF 15 AND A TOTAL OF 60 CONTRACTING INSTITUTIONS.
- THE INTEREST RATE OFFERED IS A LITTLE ABOVE THE PRESENT MARKET RETURN ON SIMILAR ISSUES, AND HAS LED TO A SLIGHT INCREASE IN MARKET RATES THIS WEEK. THE ISSUE IS REGARDED AS A FIRST TEST OF INVESTORS' ATTITUDES TOWARD THE NEW GOVERNMENT, WHICH WILL HAVE TO CONTINUE COMING TO THE MARKET FOR FÜNDS TO FINANCE THE MUCH LARGER BUDGET DEFICITS FORECAST THIS YEAR AND NEXT. THE INTEREST COST ON THE ISSUE IS ESTIMATED AT FF 1.35 BILLION PER YEAR AND TOTAL COST AT THE END OF 6 YEARS AT FF 16 BILLION.
- -9. BANK OF FRANCE JUNE INDUSTRIAL SURVEY

RESULTS OF THE BANK OF FRANCE INDUSTRIAL SURVEY COVERING JUNE ACTIVITY SHOW, AS DID THE INSEE SURVEY FOR THE SAME PERIOD, A SLIGHT INCREASE IN PRODUCTION, BUT WITH ACTIVITY STILL REMAINING AT A LEVEL LOWER THAN A YEAR AGO. UNLIKE INSEE, THE BANK ATTRIBUTES THIS SLIGHT INCREASE ESSENTIALLY TO "TECHNICAL AND SEASONAL FACTORS." THE INCREASE IN CAPACITY UTILIZATION IS CONSIDERED

DUE TO A PICK-UP THAT HAS OCCURRED AFTER INVENTORIES WERE ALLOWED TO DIMINISH, PARTICULARLY IN THE INTERMEDIATE GOODS SECTORS, BUT IT MAY BE ONLY A TEMPORARY ADJUSTMENT. CONSUMER GOODS PRODUCTION SHOWED A SEASONAL INCREASE; HOWEVER, MO IMPROVEMENT OCCURRED IN CAPITAL GOODS PRODUCTION, WHICH HAS BEEN DECLINING SINCE MAY, UNEMPLOYMENT FURTHER INCREASED DURING JUNE IN MANY INDUSTRIES.

- DEMAND SHOWED A SLIGHT INCREASE. THE

BEYOND THIS, BUSINESS FORECASTS ARE FOR A RETURN TO FLAT ACTIVITY. CAPITAL GOODS WERE THOUGHT TO BE THE SECTOR HARDEST HIT BY HIGH INTEREST RATES.

THE TWO INDUSTRIES WHICH HAVE DONE WELL IN PAST MONTHS, AIRCRAFT AND ELECTRONICS, STILL SHOW THE BEST PRODUCTION, BUT SHOW THEY, TOO, ARE ENCOUNTERING DIFFICULTIES. NO IMPROVEMENT IS FORESEEN IN CAPITAL GOODS PRODUCTION IN COMING MONTHS.

CONSUMER GOODS DID WELL IN JUNE, BUT THIS WAS PRINCIPALLY DUE TO FOOD INDUSTRIES. OVER THE SHORT-TERM, THE SAME LEVEL OF ACTIVITY SHOULD CONTINUE.

- OUTPUT IN THE CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRY STAGNATED IN JULY, WITH AN INCREASE EXPECTED ONLY AT THE END OF THE YEAR WHEN GOF INCENTIVE MEASURES SHOULD BEGIN TO AFFECT ACTIVITY. RETAIL SALES PICKED UP IN JUNE. STOCKS OF INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTS ARE NOW CONSIDERED AT BELOW NORMAL LEVELS, AND EXPECTATIONS OF STRONGER SALES AFTER THE SUMMER HOLIDAYS, TOGETHER WITH ANTICIPATIONS OF HIGHER INFLATION, HAVE LED TRADERS TO CONSIDER NCREASING ORDERS.

-10. BALANCE OF PAYMENTS -- SECOND QUARTER 1981

THE CURRENT ACCOUNT DEFICIT, S.A., NARROWED SUBSTANTIALLY IN THE SECOND QUARTER DUE TO BOTH A REDUCTION IN THE TRADE DEFICIT AND A LARGER SURPLUS ON THE SERVICES ACCOUNTS. THE IMPROVEMENT OF THE TRADE ACCOUNT WAS DUE TO BOTH A SLOWER RISE IN IMPORTS AND MUCH FASTER EXPORT GROWTH. THE SLOWDOWN IN IMPORT VALUE WAS LIMITED, HOWEVER, BY THE LARGE INCREASE IN THE ENERGY BILL LINKED TO DOLLAR APPRECIATION (FF 4Ø.5 BILLION AND FF 77.2 FOR THE FIRST HALF, COMPARED TO FF 72.6 BILLION IN FIRST HALF 1980), DESPITE A SHARP DROP IN THE VOLUME OF IMPORTED OIL. BUOYANT AGRICULTURAL SALES CONTRIBUTED TO THIS YEAR'S RECOVERY IN EXPORTS.

- ALTHOUGH INCOME IN SERVICES ROSE SHARPLY
IN THE SECOND QUARTER, RECEIPTS FOR THE FIRST
HALF AS A WHOLE WERE SLIGHTLY BELOW FIRST HALF 1988.
THE BETTER TREND ON NET INVISIBLES IN THE SECOND
QUARTER WAS DUE IN PART TO THE END OF THE EXCEPTIONAL
BROKERAGE PAYMENTS RELATED TO EMERGENCY
OIL SUPPLY CONTRACTS ARRANGED TO COMPENSATE FOR
SUPPLY DISRUPTIONS AT THE BEGINNING OF THE
IRAN-IRAQI WAR. INCOME FROM LARGE PROJECTS ROSE
LARGELY BECAUSE OF CONTRACTS CONCLUDED
WITH SAUDI ARABIA. RECEIPTS ON TOURISM WERE UP

SHARPLY IN THE SECOND QUARTER, BUT FOR THE FIRST HALF WERE ONLY A LITTLE UP FROM A YEAR AGO.

ON THE OTHER HAND, THE DEFICIT ON TRADE-RELATED SERVICES ROSE, PARTLY AS A RESULT OF DOLLAR APPRECIATION. THE INVESTMENT INCOME ACCOUNT SHIFTED INTO SURPLUS IN THE SECOND QUARTER FROM A DEFICIT IN THE FIRST BUT WAS STILL SUBSTANTIALLY BELOW LASTYEAR'S SURPLUS, LARGELY BECAUSEOF LARGER PUBLIC AND PRIVATE DEBT SERVICE PAYMENTS. HIGHER INTEREST EARNINGS ON FRENCH FOREIGN EXCHANGE RESERVES LARGELY OFFSET THE HIGHER INTEREST PAYMENTS ROSE SHARPLY, THE RESULT OFSUBSTANTIALLY HIGHER WORKERS' REMITTANCES.

THERE WAS A VERY LARGE NEGATIVE SWING IN THE LONG-TERM CAPITAL ACCOUNT IN THE SECOND QUARTER. FRENCH EXTENSION OF EXPORT CREDIT EXPANDED AT THE SAME TIME AS FRENCH DIRECT AND ESPECIALLY PORTFOLIO INVESTMENT ABROAD SKYROCKETED. INWARD INVESTMENT, BOTH DIRECT AND PORTFOLIO, STABILIZED. IN ATS AUGUST 23 INTERVIEW, FABIUS REAFF; RMED THAT "THE 1982 BUDGET WILL BE USED AS A WEAPON IN THE WAR AGAINST UNEMPLOYMENT." HE SAID THE 1982 BUDGET DEFICIT WAS SET AT FF 95 BILLION, COMPARED TO EARLIER PREDICTIONS OF FF 180-85 BILLION.

ACCORDING TO FABIUS, "THE DEFICIT IN PERCENTAGE TERMS WILL BE EQUIVALENT TO THAT OF 1975 WHEN VALERY GISCARD D'ESTAING, JACQUES CHIRAC AND JEAN-PIERRE FOURCADE ENACTED AN ECONOMIC RECOVERY PROGRAM." MR. FABIUS SAID THE DEFICIT WOULD BE THE EQUIVALENT OF "ONLY" 2.6 PERCENT OF GDP IN 1982, AND MADE THE POINT THAT IN A NATONAL ACCOUNTS BASIS THE PUBLIC SECTOR DEFICIT WOULD BE SMALLER THAN THESE OF ITS MAJOR TRADING PARTNERS, AT 2.4 PERCENT IN 1981 AND "SLIGHTLY HIGHER" IN 1982.

THE GOF MUST FIND FF 30 BILLION IN ADDITIONAL RECEIPTS TO LIMIT THE1982 DEFICIT TO FF 95 BILLION, SINCE SPENDING IS EXPECTED TO GROW ABOUT 25 PERCENT. FINAL DECISIONS HAVE REPORTEDLY NOT BEEN MADE, BUT FABIUS CONFIRMED THAT THE GOF WOULD IMPOSE A WEALTH TAX, WHICHWOULD EEMPT THE FIRST FF 3 MILLION, AND TAX THE REST PROBABLY AT A RATE SIGNIFICANTLY UNDER 5 PERCENT. THE TAX WILL, ACCORDINGTO FABIUS, AFFECT ONLY 1-2 PERCENT OF TAXPAYERS. CONTRARY TO CAMPAIGN PROMISES, THE TAX WILL PROBABLY FALL ON PRODUCTIVE CAPACITY THOUGH PROBABLY WITH A PREFERENTIAL DEDUCTION. IN ADDITION, HE SAID THAT TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR DEPENDENTS WHICH HAVE BEEN UNIMITED IN MOST CASES WILL NOW HAVE A CEILING PLACED ON THEM.

THIS HAS THE EFFECT OF MAKING THE PERSONAL INCOME TAX MORE PROGRESSIVE.

- ON THE QUESTION OF WHERE THE FF 3Ø BILIN IN NEW TAXES WILL BE RAISED, LE MONDE REPORTS THAT ABOUT HALF SHOULD COME FROM DIRECT TAXES, HALF FROM INDIRECTTAXES. THE WEALTH TAX IS EXPECTED TO YIELD BETWEEN FF 5 AND 1Ø BILLION. IN ADDITION, AN INCREASE IN THE PROGRESSIVITY OF THE TAX SYSTEM, WITH A NEW UPPER BRACKET OF 65 PERCENT, IS UNDER DISCUSSION. AMONG INDIRECT TAXES, A CHOICE IS TO BE MADE BETWEEN AN INCREASE IN TAXES ON PETROLEUM AND AN INCREASE IN THE VALUE-ADDED TAX.

BLAREL, WHO ATTENDED THREE AND ONE-BALF HOUR SESSION WITH FOREIGN MINISTER RAO AND OTHER MEA OFFICIALS, OVER HALF THE MEETING WAS DEVOTED TO NORTH! SOUTH ISSUES. INSTEAD, THE FOLLOWING

SIX MEASURES WERE ADOPTED:

- THE MINIMUM WAGE (SMIC) WAS INCREASED BY 19 PERCENT, EFFECTIVE JULY 1 (PROPOSITION 31).
- THE MINIMUM OLD AGE BENEFIT WAS INCREASED BY 20 PERCENT, EFFECTIVE JULY 1 (PROPOSITION 31).
- THE FAMILY ALLOWANCE WAS INCREASED BY 25 PER-CENT, EFFECTIVE JULY 1 (PROPOSITION 31).
- THE ALLOWANCE FOR HANDICAPPED ADULTS WAS INCREASED 20 PERCENT, EFFECTIVE JULY 1 (PROPOSITION 31).
- THE HOUSING ALLOWANCE WAS INCREASED 50 PERCENT TO PERCENT JULY 1; 25 PERCENT DECEMBER 1 (PROPOSITION 31)
- ADDITIONAL EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS TO SOCIAL SECURITY -- DUE TO THE INCREASE IN THE SMIC -- WERE REDUCED BY 50 PERCENT (PROPOSITION 30).
- 6. THOSE MEASURES WERE FOLLOWED ON JUNE 17 BY A COUNCIL OF MINISTERS DECISION TO EXTEND THE GISCARD-BARRE GOVERNMENT'S THIRD EMPLOYMENT PACT TO JUNE 1982. SURPRISINGLY FEW CHANGES WERE MADE IN THE PACT --

WHICH, DURING THE PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN, THE SOCIALISTS ATTACKED AS SCARCELY MORE THAN AN EXERCISE IN COSMETICS -- TO TRIM UNEMPLOYMENT STATISTICS. AMONG THE FEW CHANGES INCORPORATED IN THE REVISED PACT WERE:

- ITS EXTENSION TO AN ADDITIONAL 100,000 150,000 PERSONS.
- A PROLONGATION FROM 6 TO 12 MONTHS OF THE JOB GUARANTEE, IN EXCHANGE FOR WHICH, A 50 PERCENT EXEMPTION ON EMPLOYER CONTRIBUTIONS TO SOCIAL SECURITY.
- A BONUS OF F 5000 TO SELF-EMPLOYED WORKERS HIRING THEIR FIRST HELPER.
- INTRODUCTION OF SAFEGUARDS AGAINST SEX
 DISCRIMINATION IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PACT.

THESE CHANGES REPRESENTED A PARTIAL RESPONSE TO PROPOSITIONS 15, 28 AND 30.

- 7. PROPOSITION NO. 22 WAS PARTIALLY ADDRESSED BY A GOVERNMENT DECISION TO DISCOURAGE TEMPORARY EMPLOYMENT BY LEVYING AN ADDITIONAL 5 PERCENT TAX ON THE PROFITS REALIZED BY AGENCIES SPECIALIZING IN THE SUPPLY OF "TEMPORARIES."
- 8. ON THE CRUCIAL QUESTION OF EMPLOYMENT, PROPOSITION NO. 18 FOUND SCHE RESPONSE IN SECRETARY OF STATE FOR THE AGING JOSEPH FRANCESCHI'S ANNOUNCEMENT IN EARLY JULY THAT 5,000 FULL-TIME AND 15,000 PART-TIME JOBS WOULD BE CREATED TO PROVIDE "HOME HELP" FOR THE AGED. MINISTER FOR THE PUBLIC SERVICE ANGIET LE PORS (COMMUNIST) TOPPED THIS WITH AN AUGUST 18 DECISION TO BLOCK THE DISCHARGE OF NON-TENURED CIVIL SERVANTS AND TO PROCEED STRAIGHTAWAY TO THE EMPLOYMENT OF 37,700 ADDITIONAL PUBLIC SERVICE WORKERS, FUNDS FOR WHICH WERE AUTHORIZED IN THE JULY SUPPLEMENT TO THE 1981 BUDGET.
- 9. ALTHOUGH A SUBSTANTIAL INCREASE IN UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION (PROPOSITION 31) HAS NOT BEEN FORTH-COMING, THE MAUROY GOVERNMENT ON JULY 17 INCREASED THE GOVERNMENT SUBSIDY TO PARTIAL UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION, RAISING THE LIMITATION ON THIS BENEFIT FROM 400 TO 600 HOURS MAXIMUM.
- 10. RESPONDING TO NO SPECIFIC ITEM AMONG THE "110

PROPOSITIONS," GOVERNMENT INCLUDED IN ITS AUGUST 4, 1981, AMMESTY LAW A PROVISION CLEANSING THE RECORD IN THE CASE OF EMPLOYER SANCTIONS IMPOSED AT THE WORK PLACE PRIOR TO MAY 22, 1981. IN THE CASE OF TRADE UNION AND/OR OTHER ELECTED WORKER REPRESENTATIVES DISMISSED AFTER JANUARY 1, 1975, BY REASON OF A DISPUTE INVOLVING THEIR REPRESENTATIVE FUNCTION, THE EMPLOYER IS REQUIRED TO REHIRE THE INDIVIDUAL UPON HIS REQUEST. (THIS LATTER HAS AN OBLIQUE CONNECTION WITH PROPOSITION 22).

- 11. PROPOSITION 80 PROMISING EQUALITY OF RIGHTS FOR IMMIGRANT WORKERS FOUND AMPLE RESPONSE IN A NEW IMMIGRATION POLICY (REF "A") WHICH HELD THE LINE AGAINST FURTHER IMMIGRATION BUT LIBERALIZED REGULARIZATION OF STATUS FOR CLANDESTINE WORKERS ALREADY IN FRANCE. THE PROPOSAL THAT FOREIGN WORKERS BE ALLOWED TO VOTE IN MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS SPARKED A CONTROVERSY WHICH OPPOSED TWO GOVERNMENT MEMBERS -- FOREIGN MINISTER CLAUDE CHEYSSON (PRO) AND STATE SECRETARY FOR IMMIGRATION FRANCOIS AUTAIN (CON). FOR THE PRESENT, THIS PROPOSAL REMAINS IN LIMBO.
- 12. PROPOSITIONS NOS. 22 AND 60 ARE TO FIND EXPRESSION IN A PROPOSED LAW BEING JOINTLY DEVELOPED BY THE MINISTERS OF LABOR AND PUBLIC SERVICE. THE LATTER, A COMMUNIST, JUMPED THE GUN A BIT WITH HIS AUGUST 25 ANNOUNCEMENT THAT, HENCEFORTH, WORKERS WILL PARTICIPATE IN THE MANAGEMENT OF THEIR SERVICES THROUGH REVIVED LABOR-MANAGEMENT TECHNICAL COMMITTEES; THAT POLICY WILL BE LIBERALIZED TO EXCUSE ABSENCES TO ALLOW ATTENDANCE AT TRADE UNION CONGRESSES; AND THAT PUBLIC PREMISES WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR AFTER-HOURS TRADE UNION MEETINGS ON VIRTUALLY ANY SUBJECT, INCLUDING POLITICAL.

- 13. AGAIN WITH REFERENCE TO PROPOSITIONS 22 AND 60. MINISTER OF LABOR JEAN AUROUX HAS BEEN CHARGED WITH PREPARING A REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING EXTENDED RIGHTS FOR WORKERS. MUCH OF HIS REPORT --WHICH IS NOT DUE UNTIL SEPTEMBER 15 -- HAS ALREADY LEAKED TO THE PRESS. IT, AND THE LEGISLATION WHICH PRESUMABLY WILL FOLLOW, REPORTEDLY FEATURE THE FOLLOWING:
- ---- (A) THE EXTENSION OF WORKER INSTITUTIONS (E.G. THE COMITE D'ENTREPRISE) TO SMALLER FIRMS HERETOFORE EXEMPT BY REASON OF NUMBER OF EMPLOYEES. THE NUMERICAL THRESHOLDS ARE RETAINED BUT THE APPLICATION IS STRICTER -- INCLUDING IN THE WORKFORCE COUNT "TEMPORARY" AND LIMITED-TERM CONTRACT WORKERS:
- (B) CREATION OF AN "INTERNAL RIGHT OF ALERT" --I.E. PLANT COMMITTEES WILL BE EMPOWERED TO GIVE A TIMELY SIGNAL OF LOOMING ECONOMIC DIFFICULTIES AND. IN SOME CASES, TO "SUSPEND" (NOT VETO) MANAGEMENT DECISIONS TO PROCEED TO COLLECTIVE LAYOFFS;
- (C) ESTABLISHMENT OF AN OBLIGATION ON THE PART OF THE EMPLOYER TO BARGAIN IN GODD FAITH AT THE PLANT LEVEL. THE AREA OF OBLIGATORY BARGAINING WAS NOT DEFINED; AND
- (D) THE POWER OF THE MINISTER TO DEAL WITH BAR-GAINING IMPASSES IS TO BE REINFORCED.

AUROUX ALSO ANNOUNCED PLANS TO REFORM THE NATIONAL EMPLOYMENT SERVICE (ANPE) AND THE VOCATIONAL TRAINING AUTHORITY (AFPA) -- CREATING 500 NEW JOBS AT ANPE, 300 AT AFPA (PROPOSITION NO. 24).

14. FOLLOWING A JUNE 12 TRI-PARTITE MEETING CALLED BY GOVERNMENT TO LAUNCH TALKS ON REDUCED WORKING TIME, TRADE UNION AND EMPLOYER REPRESENTATIVES AGREED ON JULY 18 TO AN ACCORD WHICH, IN EXCHANGE FOR GREATER EMPLOYER FLEXIBILITY IN WORK SCHEDULING, WOULD REDUCE THE LEGAL WORKWEEK FROM 48 TO 39 HOURS AND GENERALIZE A 5TH WEEK OF PAID VACATION. DETAILS OF THE AGREEMENT REMAIN TO BE WORKED OUT AT THE SECTOR LEVEL, AND THE LABOR CODE HAS YET TO BE REVISED TO REFLECT THESE AGREED CHANGES. THIS ACTION REPRESENTS A FIRST STEP TOWARDS FULFILLMENT OF THE PROMISES MADE IN PROPOSITION NO.

ACCORDING TO AN AUGUST 26 ANNOUNCEMENT OF GOVERNMENT'S AGENDA FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE YEAR, LEGISLATION ON THIS SUBJECT WILL BE CONSIDERED IN NOVEMBER. THIS REPORTEDLY WAS A CAMPAIGN COMMITMENT AD LIBBED INTO THE RECORD BY MITTERRAND. IT HAS PROVED TO BE AN EXTREMELY COMPLICATED (AND POTENTIALLY COSTLY) SUBJECT
- (B) INCREASED UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS (PROPOSITION 31). NO ACTION THUS FAR. WITH THE NUMBER OF COMPENSATED UNEMPLOYED PERSONS CONTINUING TO INCREASE (UP 40 PERCENT OVER THE LAST YEAR), AND THE FUND ALREADY FF 6 BILLION IN THE RED, SUB-STANTIAL INCREASES IN BENEFITS SEEM UNLIKELY. CONCEIVABLY, HOWEVER, THE MATTER COULD COME UP FOR DISCUSSION IN SEPTEMBER WHEN GOVERNMENT IS TO RE-EXAMINE THE SOCIAL SECURITY AND UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION PROGRAMS

- (A) WAGES

THE 10 PERCENT INCREASE IN THE MINIMUMWAGE (SMIC) GRANTED JULY 1 WAS ROUGHLY ONLY HALFTHAT DEMANDED BY ORGANIZED LABOR AS NECESSARY TO RESTORE THE PURCHASING POWER OF THE LOWEST PAID. AND EVEN THAT INCREMENT HAS BEEN ERODED BY COL INCREASES WHICH HAVE AVERAGED 1.2 PERCENT OVER THE LAST THREE MONTHS. BOTH THE COMMUNIST-CONTROLLED CGT AND THE CFDT TRADE UNIONS HAVE BEEN CALLING FOR FURTHER UPWARD REVISIONS, BUT NOTHING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED. FOR FEAR OF WAGE-PUSH INFLATION, GOVERNMENT WOULD LIKE TO LIMIT THE ECHO EFFECT OF THESE SMIC INCREASES ACROSS THE WAGE SPECTRUM. ON THE OTHER HAND, INCREASED WORKER PURCHASING POWER IS AT THE HEART OF THE SOCIALISTS' REFLATIONARY POLICY. THE -TEST WILL COME WITH THE SEPTEMBER WAGE ROUND -- ALL EYES ON THE GOF TO SEE WHAT WILL HAPPEN IN THE PUBLIC SECTOR. AT THE RENTREE THE OVERALL WAGE OBJECTIVE OF MOST TRADE UNION LEADERS AT THE NATIONAL LEVEL IS THAT OF PRESERVING PURCHASING POWER, WITH -- HOPEFULLY -- SOME SLIGHT ADVANCE AT THE LOWER END OF THE SCALE. THUS, IF GOVERNMENT HOPES TO HOLD THE LINE ON WAGES WITHOUT ALIENATING ITS LABOR BASE, IT WILL HAVE EITHER TO GET A GRIP ON INFLATION OR TO INCREASE TRANSFER PAYMENTS (ALREADY 32.4 PERCENT OF TOTAL HOUSEHOLD INCOME).

- (B) WORKING TIME

HAVING OPTED FOR THE ROLE OF CATALYTIC AGENT IN THE REDUCTION OF THE WORKWEEK GOVERNMENT HOPES TO REAP SOME BENEFIT IN THE FORI. JF INCREASED EMPLOYMENT. BUT, CONTENT APPARENTLY TO ENACT INTO LAW WHAT IS WORKED OUT IN LABOR-MANAGEMENT NEGOTIATIONS, GOVERNMENT RUNS THE RISK OF SEEING CONCLUDED SECTOR AGREEMENTS WHICH WILL ADD TO PRODUCTION COSTS (AND HENCE TO INFLATION) WITHOUT REALIZING THE ANTICIPATED EFFECT ON EMPLOYMENT. LEGISLATION ON WORKING TIME IS SCHEDULED FOR DISCUSSION IN NOVEMBER.

- (C) WORKER RIGHTS

THE DOSSIER ON WORKER RIGHTS IS A DELICATE ONE.
THE RECOMMENDATIONS REPORTEDLY CONTAINED IN MINISTER
OF LABOR AUROUX'S REPORT (SUPRA) SMACK CLEARLY OF
CFDT INFLUENCE (REF "B"). BUT AUROUX'S RECOMMENDATIONS WILL NOT FULLY SATISFY EITHER THE CGT (WHICH
WOULD HAVE GONE MUCH FURTHER) OR FORCE OUVRIERE
(WHICH IS APPREHENSIVE OF PLANT-LEVEL BARGAINING).
THOUGH AUROUX MANAGED TO FINESSE THE CONTROVERSY

OVER A PLANT COMMITTEE VETO ON MANAGEMENT DECISIONS TO LAY OFF WORKERS, THE WORKER CHALLENGE TO EMPLOYER AUTHORITY REMAINS IMPLICIT IN HIS RECOMMENDATIONS. IF INCORPORATED IN THE LABOR CODE, THESE MEASURES WILL DO NOTHING TO REASSURE ENTREPRENEURS WHOM GOVERNMENT HAS COME TO RECOGNIZE (ALBEIT BELATEDLY) AS THE PRINCIPAL ACTORS IN JOB CREATION. ON THE QUESTION OF PLANT-LEVEL BARGAINING, FRENCH EMPLOYERS ARE HESITANT BUT NOT INALTERABLY OPPOSED. THEY SEE IN THE PROPOSAL A REHOTE POSSIBILITY THAT SOMETHING AKIN TO NEAR-BINDING U.S.-STYLE CONTRACT BARGAINING MIGHT EVOLVE. THIS IS A DEBATE WHICH SHOULD PEAK IN DECEMBER WHEN GOVERNMENT CONSIDERS THE WHOLE THORNY QUESTION OF EXTENDED WORKER RIGHTS AT THE ENTERPRISE LEVEL.

- (D) IMMIGRANT WORKERS

THE REGULATORY REMEDIES IN FAVOR OF IMMIGRANT WORKERS (SUPRA) ARE OF A PROVISIONAL NATURE. LEGISLATION PROJECTED FOR SEPTEMBER WILL PROBABLY PRESERVE A LENIENT ATTITUDE TOWARDS ALIEN WORKERS (DECLARED AND CLANDESTINE) ALREADY IN FRANCE, BUT TAKE A FIRMER STAND WITH RESPECT TO ILLEGAL ENTRANTS. IN THE ABSENCE OF SUPPORTIVE PUBLIC OPINION, IT NOW SEEMS UNLIKELY THAT IMMIGRANT WORKERS WILL BE ACCORDED THE RIGHT TO VOTE IN MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS (PROPOSITION NO. 8g).

- (L) SOCIAL SECURITY AND UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION

CURRENT PROJECTIONS ARE FOR A FF 7 BILLION DEFICIT IN THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACCOUNT AND A IF 6 MILLION DEFICET IN UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FUNDS FOR 1981. THE SOCIAL SECURITY DEFICIT PROJECTED FOR 1982 IS FF 20 BILLION. THE FINANCING OF THE SOCIAL SECURITY AND UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION SYSTEMS ARE TO BE THE SUBJECT OF LEGISLATION SCHEDULED FOR CONSIDERATION IN SEPTEMBER THE MOST LIKELY POSSIBILITIES FOR REFORM IN SOCIAL SECURITY FINANCING ARE RESUMPTION (IN MODIFIED FORM) OF THE RECENTLY SUPPRISSED GISCARD BARRE ONE PERCENT INCREMENT IN CONTRIBUTIONS, AND REMOVAL OF THE WAGE CLILINGS ON WHICH MOST CONTRIBUTIONS ARE CURRENTLY CALCULATED. THE REFORM IN UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FUNDING COULD INCLUDE HIGHER CONTRIBUTIONS (WITH PERHAPS AN INCREASED GOF SUBSIDY), AND "SOLIDARITY" CONTRIBUTIONS FROM CIVIL SERVANTS HERETOFORE EXEMPTED BECAUSE THEY HAVE VIRTUALLY ABSOLUTE JOB SECURITY. IN BOTH CASES, HOWEVER, THESE ADDED CONTRIBUTIONS WOULD REPRESENT DEBITS AGAINST PURCHASING POWER -- WHICH WOULD REAPPEAR AS WAGE DEMANDS, WITH CLEAR IMPLICATIONS FOR INFLATION. ANOTHER POSSIBILITY, SUGGESTED BY FORCE OUVRIERE SECRETARY GENERAL ANDRE BERGERON, 13 THAT OF TAKING A LONG-TERM LOAN IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT TO TIDE THE FUND OVER WHAT BERGERON REGARDS AS A TEMPORARY CRISIS WHICH WILL EVENTUALLY BE REVERSED BY DEMOGRAPHIC CHANGE.

- (F) EMPLOYMENT CREATION

CLEARLY THE MOST EMBARRASSING AND DIFFICULT PROBLEM FACING THE NEW SOCIALIST REGIME IS UNEMPLOYMENT --NOW AT 1.849 MILLION (APPROXINATELY 8 PERCENT OF THE WORKFORCE) AND LIKELY TO TOP A NEW PSYCHOLOGICAL THRESHOLD OF 2 MILLION BY THE END OF THE YEAR. IN THE WORDS OF THE PRIME MINISTER. THE IMMEDIATE OBJECTIVE IS CONTAINMENT, IMPROVEMENT BEING AT LEAST 18 MONTHS AWAY. THE 210,000 PROJECTED PUBLIC SERVICE JOBS FIGURE AS SCARGELY MORE THAN A PR GESTURE. MAUROY HAS SAID ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS THAT HE EXPECTS TO NET 900,000 ADDITIONAL JOBS WITH THE REDUCTION OF THE WORKWEEK TO 35 HOURS. BUT, AS THE 35-HOUR WORKWEEK HAS RECEDED INTO THE INDEFINITE FUTURE, SO HAVE THE 900,000 JOBS. FRUSTRATION ON THIS SCORE HAS PRODUCED SOME INTERESTING ALIBIS: HIGH US INTEREST RATES, EMPLOYER PERFIDY, ETC. BUT, FOR FORM'S SAKE AT LEAST, GOVERNMENT WILL WANT TO BE SEEN TO BE ACTIVE IN THIS FIELD. IN THE COMING MONTHS A NUMBER OF REGULATORY MEASURES ARE TO BE DISCUSSED: "COMPUTERIZATION AND EMPLOYMENT" (OCTOBER); "YOUTH AND WORK" (NOVEMBER); AND THE

"REFORM OF VOCATIONAL TRAINING" (DECEMBER). THE ONLY DIRECT APPROACH WITH PROMISE WOULD BE A JOB CREATION LEFORT LINNED TO THE COMMITMENT (PROPOSITION NO. 16) TO LAUNCH A LARGE PUBLIC WORKS PROGRAM.

17. COMMENT

ON ANY FAIR READING OF THE SCORFCARD, IT MUST BE CONCEDED THAT THE SOCIALISTS HAVE BEEN AS GOOD (ALMOST) AS THEIR WORD. BUT WHETHER THE PANACHE OF MITTERRAND S FIRST HUNDRED DAYS CAN BE SUSTAINED IS ANOTHER MATTER. IN LABOR'S OPILG, HIS POSITIVE PERFORMANCE TO DATE WILL TEND TO EXTEND THE PERFOD OF "GRACE" WHICH THE TRADE UNIONS. HAVE THUS FAR ACCORDED HIM. FEW ARE INCLINED TO FAULT HIM FOR NOT HAVING FOUND AN INSTANT SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEM (UNEMPLOYMENT) WHICH HADRIS KEYNESIANS AND SUPPLY SIDERS ALIKE. SOME SYMPATHIZERS FEAR HOWEVER THAT, WHILE WRESTLING WITH THIS INTRACTABLE PROBLEM. MITTERRAND MAY BE TEMPTED TO "NON BUDGETARY," IDEOLOGICALLY MOTIVATED DIVERSIONS WHICH COULD DIVIDE HIS ELECTORATE AND WEAREN THE ECONOMIC STRUCTURE OF THE COUNTRY.

KNOWLEDGEABLE OBSERVERS HAVE SAID ALL ALONG THAT THE NEW REGIME'S FIRST REAL TEST WHIL COME IN THE FALL. FALL HAS COME.
