U.S.-Soviet Consultations on Grains

Under the terms of our current Long Term Agreement (LTA) with the Soviet Union, which expires September 30, periodic consultations are to be held on implementation of the agreement. Since the lifting of the embargo we have been discussing with the Soviets the time and place for a resumption of these consultations. In response to a Soviet invitation to Moscow, we proposed that we meet in Paris on June 9-10. We and the Soviets have now agreed to London on June 8, 9, or 10. The purpose of these consultations will be to agree on the amounts of grain we will make available for Soviet purchase and delivery before September 30, 1981, and on an interim basis in the following year.

Jack Block and Bill Brock have indicated publicly our interest in exploring possibilities for a new LTA. However, it is our collective judgment that we should not give the Soviets any indication that we are committed to such an agreement. An interagency group is now studying whether a new agreement is beneficial to our interests and, if so, what might be included in that agreement. Even if we wanted to pursue an agreement, over-eagerness would weaken our negotiating ability to secure a favorable one.

Accordingly, the U.S. delegation would simply be instructed to inquire as to Soviet views on future grain trading relationships following the expiration of the current LTA, and to raise specific questions with the Soviets about their future intentions and about any ideas they suggest. The delegation would indicate to the Soviets that while we have an interest in exploring the possibility of a new LTA, we have not yet made any decision as to





whether a new LTA, extension of the old one, or a less formal arrangement would be desirable. The delegation would indicate that it was interested in Soviet views, that it would report them back to Washington, and that we would soon be back in touch with the Soviets. Arrangements for any future meetings would be discussed at that time.

Schmidt's Meeting with Mitterrand

The Germans have provided our Charge in Bonn with a full read-out on Schmidt's May 24 meeting with Mitterrand. In addition to the discussion of possible U.S.-French contacts, which I reported to you separately, the highlights were as follows:

- -- Schmidt conveyed your greetings to Mitterrand, told him you wanted close relations with the Allies based on active consultations, and looked forward to close cooperation with Mitterrand. Mitterrand listened carefully and said he considered this an important message. Schmidt's impression was that Mitterrand wanted good and productive relations with us.
- -- Schmidt gave Mitterrand his impressions of his Washington visit and they spoke about the French role in the Alliance.

 Mitterrand indicated there would be no change in the French attitude. He endorsed the NATO double decision on Theater

 Nuclear Forces installation and negotiation.
- -- Mitterrand said he would not change his previous positive attitude toward Israel, though he acknowledged the need for good relations with the Arabs. Mitterrand noted that two cabinet appointments (Foreign Minister Cheysson and Foreign Trade Minister Jobert) had been made with the Arabs in mind, and that he would send an emissary to the Arabs soon.
- -- Mitterrand expressed concern over U.S. interest rate policies and hoped U.S. economic policy would not adversely affect his own hopes for French economic resurgence.

 Mitterrand said he would defend the franc and was not considering devaluation. France would stay in the European Monetary System. Schmidt promised to be helpful.

- -- Mitterrand said <u>he would participate in the North-South</u> Summit in Mexico next October.
- -- Mitterrand shared Schmidt's misgivings over the recent arrangement to limit Japanese auto exports to the U.S.
- -- The Germans say Mitterrand wants to continue and develop close Franco-German relations within the European Community setting. A Franco-German Summit has been advanced to July, before the Ottawa Summit.
- -- Our German interlocutor <u>did not know whether Schmidt</u> <u>had raised with Mitterrand our concerns</u> over the possibility that Communists would be included in the French government.

I SUGGESTED THAT IF CHEYSSON WAS REALLY SERIOUS ABOUT ACHIEVING PESULTS FROM A GLOBAL DIALOGUE A MUCH MORE LIMITED FORUM WHULD HAVE TO BE ENVISIONED. I. SETTING

Mitterrand's election has brought a period of uncertainty for France. His policies will be determined largely by the outcome of the legislative elections June 14 and 21. He will adjust to the left or right depending on the coalition he forms to obtain a majority in the National Assembly. One possibility is a coalition with the Communists, which would clearly have a negative effect on the quality of our relations with France.

Regardless of the composition of the French government, French policy cooperation on a broad range of world issues will be important to us. Cheysson's early visit to Washington shows that Mitterrand also wants -- and needs -- good relations with us. Cheysson will want to reassure you that there will be continuity in French policies and that the Socialist government will act responsibly. He will hope that his visit demonstrates to the French electorate Washington's acceptance of Mitterrand. We want to establish a productive dialogue between our governments, to influence the formulation of French policies and to convey privately our concern that US-French relations will suffer if Mitterrand includes Communists in his government.

II. OBJECTIVES

Establish a productive dialogue.

Influence French policies on key issues.

Express concern over possible policy conflicts.

Discuss future meetings with Mitterrand.

6. Future Meetings with Mitterrand

We have reports that Mitterrand may wish to visit the US very soon -- possibly after the Ottawa Summit. We should be cautious until we know whether there will be Communists in his government. Depending on that outcome, we are considering recommending that you invite Mitterrand to Washington in connection with the bicentennial of the Yorktown battle, next October. You should say you look forward to seeing Mitterrand in Ottawa and not commit yourself further.

7. The Vice President's Visit to Paris

If you agree, you could ask Cheysson to convey to Mitterrand your interest in sending the Vice President to Paris after the French legislative elections and before the Ottawa Summit, to establish contact with Mitterrand and Prime Minister Mauroy, if mutually convenient dates can be found. We do not want to pin this down until we see whether the French Government includes Communists.

State sent over an excellent, concise (and timely) briefing memo for the Cheysson visit. I have written a short cover memo for your signature and added the bio. Also included is a 3X5 card, in case they are still in vogue. (U)

In your briefing of the President, you should emphasize that the outcome of the legislative elections next week is far from clear: there might well be a right-wing majority which would be more sympathetic with this Administration's values, but which would leave France with a split and less effective government. There might be a left majority, including communists, which would make it necessary for Mitterrand to bargain with the communists in order to have a working parliamentary majority. We do not want the White House visit to be seen as an endorsement for the French Socialist Party. We are meeting Cheysson because he is Mitterrand's chief foreign policy advisor and official. (C)



Electoral Support

Embassy Paris reports that the Socialists and Communists yesterday announced agreement that will assure mutual support of each party's candidacy in the second round of legislative elections. The agreement notes areas of agreement and disagreement and postpones the issue of eventual communist participation in the government. The embassy comments that the Socialists appear to have concluded that it is not in their interest to decide on the eventual presence of communist ministers in the government prior to the elections since it would lessen chances of attracting centrist and moderate votes.

The Socialists also announced electoral agreement with two other smaller parties of the moderate left -- the Left Radicals and Socialist Unified Party. In conspicuous contrast to the Socialist-Communist communique, the three parties agreed to the following foreign policy positions:

- -- condemnation of the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan;
- -- recognition of the full sovereignty of Poland;
- -- solidarity with the struggle of the peoples of the third world especially El Salvador. \mathcal{H}
