I am totally openminded. Please go over your priority suggestions with Jennifer Fitzgerald and others from pre-advance. I cannot comment on delaying departure time etc., but perhaps advance team can give you some indication on that.

I want to work hard while I am there, saving only a little time for rest and maybe an hour per day to run and stay in shape.

I appreciate your sugestions for speech material.

I would speak for less than 20 minutes at whatever event is arranged. I prefer the American groups you suggested.

I will be meeting with Japanese journalists here prior to trip and would really prefer not to do a morning television appearance. I will make arrival and departure statements and take questions from the press after the departure statement.

Names of official party will be sent separately. Will arrive and depart Haneda as you suggest.

Barbara and I really look forward to seeing you both soon.


Japanese Help with our Chinese Problems

Attached is a very informative cable from Tokyo. It indicates that:

BEGIN TEXT: I AM WRITING TO EXPRESS MY SERIOUS CONCERN WITH DEVOLOPMENTS AT THE LAW OF THE SEA CONFERENCE IN NEW YORK. UNFORTUNATFLY, SO FAR DURING THIS SESSION, THERE HAS BEEN NO SERIOUS NEGOTIATION OF THE US CONCERNS WITH THE DEEP SEABED PROVISIONS OF THE TREATY, ALTHOUGH THESE ISSUES ARE OF MAJOR IMPORTANCE TO THIS COUNTRY. THE US DELEGATION HAS MADE EVERY EFFORT TO MEET THE TIMETABLE ADOPTED BY THE CONFERENCE AND TO PRESENT ITS PROPOSALS IN THE FORM DESIRED BY THE OTHER DELEGATIONS. DESPITE THAT, THE US PROPOSALS HAVE NOT BEEN GIVEN A FULL HEARING.

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

WE ARE GRATEFUL THAT YOU HAVE INDICATED THAT US PARTI-CIPATION IN THE LOS TREATY IS INDISPENSABLE FOR A

MEANINGFUL LAW OF THE SEA AGREEMENT.

UNFORTUNATELY, THERE IS STILL A WIDELY HELD VIEW THAT JAPAN AND OTHER MAJOR INDUSTRIALIZED COUNTRIES WILL SIGN THE PRESENT LOS CONVENTION WITH FEW IF ANY CHANGES. IF THIS PERCEPTION IS NOT DISPELLED, THE CONFERENCE LEADERSHIP WILL PRODABLY BRING THE CONFERENCE TO A CONCLUSION IN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS, PRODUCING A CONVENTION THAT THE US CANNOT ACCEPT.

- WITHOUT NEGOTIATION, THERE IS NO WAY OF CREATING A TEXT WHICH WILL PESCOND TO PRESIDENT REAGAN'S OBJECTIVES.

US PARTICIPATION IN AN LOS TREATY WOULD THEN BE FORECLOSED. ON THE OTHER HAND, WE ARE CONVINCED THAT WERE THE CONFERENCE TO ENGAGE IN SERIOUS NEGOTIATIONS, AN ACCEPTABLE COMPROMISE WOULD EMERGE.

- CUR TWO GOVERNMENTS ARE NOW PURSUING SOLUTIONS TO A NUMBER OF PROBLEMS WE BOTH FACE, AND I AM PLEASED WITH OUR PROGRESS. I MUST ASK FOR YOUR SPECIFIC ASSISTANCE NOW TO MAKE SUCH NEGOTIATIONS A REALITY. IN THIS REGARD, I WOULD APPRECIATE YOUR ASSISTANCE, IN KEEPING WITH YOUR INDICATIONS TO ME DURING OUR CONVERSATION OF MARCH 23 THAT YOU WANTED TO BE HELPFUL AND THAT I SHOULD LET YOU KNOW ADOUT ANY PARTICULAR PROBLEMS.

IT WOULD ENCOURAGE A FCS1:IVE ATMOSPHERE FOR THE NEGOTIATIONS IF YOU COULD STATE PUBLICLY WHAT YOU TOLD ME: "UNITED STATES PARTICIPATION IS INDISPENSABLE FOR A MEANINGFUL AGREEMENT" AND ALSO ADD THAT THE LOS TEXT IN ITS FRIEDRIFICAM REQUIRES SIGNIFICANT REVISION TO OBTAIN SUCH U.S. PARTICIPATION. IT WOULD BE VERY HELPFUL IF YOU MIGHT SUGGEST IN ADDITION THAT IT WOULD BE VERY DIFFICULT OR IMPOSSIBLE FOR JAPAN TO SIGN AND RATIFY ANY LOS TREATY WITHOUT U.S. PARTICIPATION. HAIG

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
