Minister to the United States

During my meeting with Yasuhiro Nakasone on November 18, he expressed his strong wish to come to Washington to visit President Reagan between January 10 and 20 of next year. assumes his selection as the new Japanese Prime Minister later this month.

I strongly recommend that Nakasone be invited to Washington sometime during the time frame he has suggested. One working day would be all that he would need. This could include an hour with the President and a luncheon hosted by the President.

It is essential that we make every effort to establish close working relations with Nakasone as soon as possible. Key decisions on defense and trade matters will be taken by him early in his term of office. He should be made aware of the personal concern of the President and other high-ranking Administration figures that whatever these decisions may be they will have far-reaching effects on U.S.-Japanese relations and that the U.S. regards its relations with Japan as fundamental to peace and security in Asia and the Pacific. An early visit to the United States by Nakasone in January would highlight the special relationship that exists between Washington and Tokyo and would serve to create the kind of personal ties between the President and the Japanese Prime Minister so necessary for the effective implementation of this relationship.

PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE

- 1. (ENTIRE TEXT.)
- 2. SUMMARY: I PAID MY FIRST CALL ON PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE ON NOVEMBER 29. WE COVERED TRADE AND DEFENSE IN SOME DETAIL AND THE POLITICAL FORCES SURROUNDING THESE ISSUES. I FOUND THE PRIME MINISTER CONFIDENT AND COMFORTABLE IN HIS NEW ROLE. END SUMMARY.
- 3. I PAID MY INITIAL CALL ON NEWLY INSTALLED PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE AT THE OFFICIAL RESIDENCE LATE IN THE AFTERNOON (6 P.M.) OF NOVEMBER 29. NAKASONE CONDUCTED THE FIRST BRIEF WELCOMING PORTION OFTHEMEETING--WHILE PRESS WAS PRESENT--IN ENGLISH AND MADE A POINT OF STRESSING HIS APPRECIATION FOR THE PRESIDENT'S PHONE CALL. I DELIVERED THE PRESIDENT'S CONGRATULATION LETTER TO HIM.

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

4. NAKASONE OPENED THE DISCUSSION, FOLLOWING DEPARTURE OF THE PRESS, BY REFERRING TO HIS RECENT PRESS CONFERENCE IN WHICH HE STATED AS A HAJDR GOAL THE STRENGTHENING OF THE BONDS BETWEEN JAPAN AND THE US. I TOLD HIM THIS POSTURE OVER THE YEARS, AND WENT ON TO SAY THAT 1983 PROMISED TO BE THE MOST DIFFICULT YEAR IN OUR RECENT HISTORY. I EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT WORKING TOGETHER OUR TWO COUNTRIES WOULD FIND SOLUTIONS. THE PRIME MINISTER RESPONDED POSITIVELY SAYING THAT HE WAS CONFIDENT THAT, NO MATTER HOW DIFFICULT THE PROBLEM, THE US AND JAPAN COULD RESOLVE IT THROUGH FRANK DISCUSSION.

- 5. I LAID HEAVY EMPHASIS ON THE PROTECTIONIST SENTIMENT CURRENTLY ABROAD IN THE UNITED STATES WHICH HAD RAISED STORM SIGNALS FOR ME. I GAVE HIM MY OPINION THAT THE LOCAL CONTENT LEGISLATION. CURRENTLY INTRODUCED IN BOTH THE HOUSE AND THE SENATE, WILL PASS THE HOUSE IF IT COMES TO THE FLOOR IN THE LAME-DUCK SESSION. THE SENATE. ACCORDING TO SENATOR PACKWOOD WHO WAS RECENTLY HERE AND WHO OPPOSEDTHELEGISLATION. WOULD PROBABLY HOLD FIRM DURING THE LAME-DUCK SESSION BUT MIGHT NOT DO SO NEXT YEAR. THE PRIME MINISTER SAID THAT HE WAS VERY AWARE OF THE LOCAL CONTENT LEGISLATION AS A RESULT OF HIS PARTICIPATION IN THE SUZUKI CABINET. HE EXPRESSED GREAT APPRECIATION FOR THE EFFORTS BEING MADE BY THE REAGAN ADMINISTRATION TO AVOID SUCH LEGISLATION AND HIS HOPE FOR US/ JAPAN COOPERATION TO STRENGTHEN THE HAND OF THOSE IN OPPOSITION TO SUCH LEGISLATION.
- 6. I POINTED OUT THAT WHILE THE PRESIDENT AND HIS ADMINISTRATION SUPPORT FREE TRADE, THE DIFFICULTIES ARE NOT ONLY ECONOMIC BUT ARE POLITICAL AND PSYCHOLOGICAL. THERE IS A NEED TO BUILD A BULWARK OF FRIENDLY SENATORS REPRESENTING STATES PRODUCING TOBACCO, BEEF AND

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

CITRUS, AMONG OTHERS, TO HELP SUSTAIN A VETO
OF PROTECTIONIST BILLS, SHOULD SUCH BE REQUIRED.

- 7. TURNING TO DEFENSE I EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT JAPAN WOULD BUDGET AN INCREASE IN THE COMING FISCAL YEAR THAT WAS AT LEAST EQUIVALENT TO THE INCREASE IN THE CURRENT FISCAL YEAR. I STRESSED THAT WE ARE NOT ASKINGTHATJAPAN DO MORE SO THAT WE CAN DO LESS, BUT RATHER SO WE CAN BOTH IMPROVE OUR DEFENSE POSTURE. I EMPHASIZED THE DEFENSE OF JAPAN INHERENT IN THE CURRENT JAPANESE POSTURE. I ALSO UNDERLINED OUR EFFORTS TO ASSURE OTHERASIANNATIONS THAT OUR HOPES FOR JAPAN DO NOT GO BEYOND HER DEFENSE OF HER
- 8. THE PRIME MINISTER SAID HE UNDERSTOOD THE US POSITION COMPLETELY AND BELIEVES JAPAN SHOULD DEFEND ITSELF. IT THERE ARE GAPS IN THE DEFENSE, THESE WILL BE FILLED THROUGH COOPERATIVE ACTION WITH THE UNITED STATES. SO LONG AS GOOD RELATIONS ARE MAINTAINED WITH THE UNITED STATES, THERE IS

REFERRING TO CHARGES SOMETIMES LEVELED IN JAPAN
THAT THE UNITED STATES PRESSURES JAPAN ON DEFENSE,
THE PRIME MINISTER SAID HE DESCRIBES SUCH DISCUSSIONS AS CONSULTATIONS NOT PRESSURE.

9. WE ALSO DISCUSSED THE SIMILARITIES IN THE POLITICAL PROCESSES OF BOTH OUR COUNTRIES, WITH THE PRESSURES EMANATING FROM THE ELECTORAL DISTRICTS AND FROM VARIOUS PRESSURE GROUPS. AT THE SAME TIME THE OBJECTIVES OF OUR TWO COUNTRIES, IN BOTH TRADE AND DEFENSE, ARE VERY SIMILAR. I POINTED OUT THAT THE PROBLEM IN BOTH DEFENSE AND TRADE WAS ONE OF PACE. MR. ESAKI AND PRIME MINISTER SUZUKI BOTH ANNOUNCED TRADE PACKAGES. WHAT WAS REQUIRED WAS THAT THESE BE FLESHED OUT. WHILE JAPAN IS A SOVEREIGN NATION AND MUST MAKE ITS OWN DECISION, IT HAS BENEFITED GREATLY FROM FREE

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

TRADE. THEREFORE, I SAID I HOPED WE COULD DISCUSS OUR PROBLEMS AS EQUALS, SEEK SOLUTIONS, AND STRENGTHEN THE US/JAPAN RELATIONSHIP WHICH WAS THE MOST IMPORTANT BILATERAL RELATIONSHIP IN THE WORLD.

18. THE PRIME MINISTER CONCLUDED BY SAYING THAT HE HAD ONLY BEEN PRIME MINISTER FOR A FEW DAYS AND COULD STILL BE CONSIDERED A TENDERFOOT (SHINMAE). HE SAID THAT AT PRESENT THE NEW CABINET IS VERY BUSY WITH THE EXTRAORDINARY SESSIONOFTHE DIET. EVEN SO HE WAS VERY MUCH AWARE THAT TRADE AND DEFENSE WERE THE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUES BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES AND HE WISHED EARLY ON TO HAVE FULL DISCUSSIONS WITH HIS CABINET AND THEN

DISCUSS THESE ISSUES WITH US.

11. COMMENT: I FOUND THE PRIME MINISTER TO BE VERY CONFIDENT, BOTH IN HIS MANNER AND IN HIS TREATMENT OF THE ISSUES RAISED. HE DID NOT IN ANY WAY BECOME DEFENSIVE WHEN DISCUSSING EITHER TRADE OR DEFENSE, BUT SHOWED A VERY POSITIVE OUTLOOK IN TERMS OF ATTEMPTING TO SEEK SOLUTIONS. I HAD THE STRONG IMPRESSION THAT WE WILL INDEED BE ABLE TO ENGAGE IN FRANK DISCUSSIONS WITH THIS PRIME MINISTER.

1. (CENTIRE TEXT)

- 2. SUMMARY: DURING NOVEMBER 30 CALL ON NEWLY-INSTALLED FOREIGN MINISTER ABE, THE AMBASSADOR EMPHASIZED THE NEED FOR EARLY CONCRETE STEPS ON TRADE AND DEFENSE ISSUES. ABE MADE NO COMMITMENTS BUT EXPRESSED UNDERSTANDING OF THE SERIOUSNESS OF THE SITUATION. HE ALSO EMPHASIZED THE IMPORTANCE HE ATTACHED TO THE OVERALL US-JAPAN RELATIONSHIP AND THE NEED TO RESOLVE SPECIFIC ISSUES WITHIN THIS BROADER CONTEXT. END SUMMARY.
- 3. ON NOVEMBER 3Ø AMBASSADOR MANSFIELD, ACCOMPANIED
 BY DCM, CALLED ON NEWLY-APPOINTED MINISTER DF FOREIGN AFFAIRS
 SHINTARO ABE. THE CALL WAS LIMITED TO 20 MINUTES BECAUSE
 THE FOREIGN MINISTER HAD TO LEAVE FOR A CABINET
 MEETING. THE AMBASSADOR BEGAN BY EXPRESSING
 HIS APPRECIATION TO ABE FOR HIS COOPERATION DURING
 HIS TENURE AS MITH MINISTER AND SAID WE LOOKED

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

FORWARD TO CONTINUING TO WORK CLOSELY TOGETHER IN ADDRESSING THE MUTUAL PROBLEMS WE FACE. ABE RESPONDED THAT HE LOOKED FORWARD TO CLOSE COOPERATION AS HE FACED HIS NEW RESPONSIBILITIES. HE SAID HE SHARED THE AMBASSADOR'S BELIEF THAT THE US-JAPAN BILATERAL RELATIONSHIP WAS THE MOST IMPORTANT IN THE WORLD. HE SAID HE HAD FELT THIS WAY AS MITH MINISTER AND WOULD STICK TO THE SAME PRINCIPLE AS FOREIGN MINISTER, MAKING EVERY EFFORT TO STRENGTHEN AND DEVELOP OUR BILATERAL TIES.

4. THE AMBASSADOR SAID THAT AS MITI MINISTER, ABE HAD DONE A SUPERB JOB OF UNDERSTANDING THE ECONOMIC ISSUES FACING US WHICH WAS EXCELLENT PREPARATION FOR HIS RESPONSIBILITIES AS FOREIGN MINISTER. IN THIS CONNECTION, THE AMBASSADOR SAID, HE WAS AFRAID THAT

1983 MIGHT BE "THE MOST DIFFICULT" YEAR IN OUR RELATIONSHIP. THE PRIMARY ISSUE WAS TRADE; THE SECOND ISSUE
WAS DEFENSE. WITH RESPECT TO THE LATTER THE AMBASSADOR
SAID WE HOPED IT WOULD BE POSSIBLE FOR JAPAN TO INCREASE
ITS FY 1983 DEFENSE BUDGET BY AT LEAST THE SAME PERCENT AS
LAST YEAR;
BUT HE EMPHASIZED THAT THIS ISSUE
WAS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE GOJ. IN ADDITION, THE
AMBASSADOR SAID WE HOPE THAT ARRANGEMENTS COULD BE
MADE SO THAT THE EXCHANGE OF DEFENSE TECHNOLOGY WOULD
BE TRULY RECIPROCAL.

- 5. ON TRADE, THE AMBASSADOR CONTINUED, WE FACE A VERY DIFFICULT YEAR. HE SAID IF LOCAL CONTENT LEGISLATION COMES UP THIS YEAR DURING THE LAME DUCK SESSION, IT WILL PASS THE HOUSE BUT NOT THE SENATE. NEXT YEAR THERE WILL BE GREATER DANGERS. THE AMBASSADOR EMPHASIZED THAT THE PROBLEM NEEDED TO BE SEEN NOT SIMPLY IN ECONOMIC TERMS, BUT THE POLITICAL, PSYCHOLOGICAL, AND EMOTIONAL ASPECTS ALSO NEEDED TO BE CONSIDERED. IF THE GOJ INCREASED JAPAN'S IMPORTS OF TOBACCO, CITRUS AND BEEF, THIS WOULD ESTABLISH A BASE IN THE CONGRESS FROM WHICH TO COUNTER PRESSURE FOR PROTECTIONIST LEGISLATION.
- 6. TURNING TO THE BROADER ASPECTS OF OUR RELATIONSHIP, THE AMBASSADOR SAID OUR TASK WAS NOT SIMPLY TO MAINTAIN THIS RELATIONSHIP BUT TO STRENGTHEN IT. THE 21ST CENTURY WOULD BE THE CENTURY OF THE PACIFIC,

MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

AND THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE PACIFIC BASIN WOULD DEPEND UPON THE STRENGTH OF THE US-JAPAN RELATIONSHIP.

- 7. ABE SAID WE FACED A VERY DIFFICULT INTERNATIONAL SITUATION WHICH WAS LIKELY TO CONTINUE THROUGH THE NEXT YEAR. HE SAID HE FULLY UNDERSTOOD THAT THERE WERE VARIOUS BILATERAL PROBLEMS BETWEEN JAPAN AND THE US, BUT HE EMPHASIZED THAT WE MUST MOVE FORWARD THE FUNDAMENTALLY STRONG RELATIONSHIP BASED UPON MUTUAL TRUST. IT IS WITHIN THIS BROADER FRAMEWORK, HE SAID, THAT INDIVIDUAL ISSUES MUST BE ADDRESSED.
- 8. WITH RESPECT TO THE DEFENSE BUDGET, ABE SAID HE WOULD TRY TO INCREASE IT "AS A JAPANESE PROBLEM" BUT WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF STRENGTHENING THE US-JAPAN SECURITY TREATY. HE SAID JAPAN WOULD DO ITS BEST TO RESOLVE THIS ISSUE AND TO IMPROVE MUTUAL UNDERSTANDING ON DEFENSE ISSUES.

9. ON DEFENSE TECHNOLOGY, ABE SAID NO FINAL DECISION HAD BEEN REACHED WITHIN THE GOJ. HE SAID THE ISSUE WOULD CONTINUE TO BE STUDIED "WITHIN THE MUTUAL SECURITY TREATY SYSTEM" AND HE EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT WE WOULD ARRIVE AT AN EARLY CONCLUSION THAT WOULD BE MUTUALLY SATISFACTORY.

10. WITH RESPECT TO TRADE ISSUES, ABE SAID HE WAS VERY FAMILIAR WITH THESE PPOBLEMS. HE ADDED THAT US ECONOMIC DIFFICULTIES AND JAPAN'S FISCAL SITUATION WERE ALSO FACTORS. HE EMPHASIZED THAT THE US AND JAPAN MUST WORK TOGETHER TO PREVENT THE STIMULATION OF PROTECTIONIST PRESSURES AND TO PROMOTE FREE TRADE. HE ADDED THAT AS MITI MINISTER HE HAD CARRIED OUT TRADE LIBERALIZING MEASURES AND WAS FULLY AWARE OF THE DIFFICULTIES INVOLVED. HE NOTED THE CURRENT US-JAPAN NEGOTIATIONS ON TOBACCO AND AGRICULTURE AND EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THESE WOULD MOVE FORWARD. HE SAID THAT AS THE AMBASSADOR FULLY UNDERSTOOD THE DOMESTIC SITUATION IN JAPAN, HE WAS VERY FAMILIAR WITH US DOMESTIC PROBLEMS WITH RESPECT TO TRADE. HE EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT THE TRACE SUBCOMMITTEE AND THE ECONOMIC SUB-CABINET MEETINGS SCHEDULED IN THE NEXT FEW WEEKS WOULD BE SUCCESSFUL.

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

11. IN CONCLUSION, ABE REITERATED THAT FOR JAPAN ITS RELATIONSHIP WITH THE US WAS THE MOST IMPORTANT RELATIONSHIP AND THAT HE WOULD MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO STRENGTHEN IT. WITHIN THIS FRAMEWORF, HE SAID HE WOULD SEEK TO RESCLVE THE BILATERAL ISSUES WE FACE.

12. COMMENT: ALTHOUGH THIS WAS BASICALLY A COURTESY CALL, I TOOK THE OPPORTUNITY TO TRY TO IMPPESS UPON ABE THE NEED FOR EARLY MOVEMENT ON TRADE AND DEFENSE ISSUES. HE MADE NO SPECIFIC COMMITMENTS, BUT HE IS CLEARLY AWASE OF THE SITUATION. MANSFIELD

PRIME MINISTER.

I POINTED OUT THAT AT URGING OF JAPANESE WE HAD WELCOMED SPIRIT OF MAY PACKAGE WHILE RESERVING JUDGHENT AS TO ITS ADEQUACY AND STRESSING NEED FOR RESULTS. OUR EVALUATION NOW IS THAT RESULTS HAVE NOT BEEN ACHIEVED. THIS PUTS US IN A DIFFICULT POSITION TO RESIST PROTECTIONIST PRESSURE, AND INDEED RAISES QUESTIONS IN SOME QUARTERS AS TO WHETHER THEY SHOULD BE RESISTED.

3. AM NOT SURE TO WHAT EXTENT YAMANAKA GOT MESSAGE.

1. O SUMMARY: ON DECEMBER 3 PRIME MINISTER NAKASONE DELIVERED HIS FIRST FORMAL POLICY SPEECH BEFORE A PLENARY SESSION OF THE DIET. IN IT HE CALLED UPON "EACH CITIZEN TO ACT IN A SPIRIT OF SELF-RELIANCE AND SELF-HELP" AND PRAISED JAPAN'S "NATIONAL TRADITION OF INNER-STRENGTH." NAKASONE AFFIRMED THAT "UNITED STATES IS JAPAN'S MOST IMPORTANT PARTNER" AND SAID THAT HE IS DETERMINED TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE MAINTENANCE OF THE FREE TRADE SYSTEM. HE SAID THAT JAPAN'S FUNDAMENTAL SECURITY POLICY IS TO ADHERE TO THE US-JAPAN SECURITY ARRANGEMENT AND TO ACHIEVE A HIGH LEVEL OF DEFENSE CAPABILITY IN THE CONTEXT OF A STRICTLY DEFENSIVE EFFORT. NAKASONE REITERATED HIS DETERMINATION THAT JAPAN MUST PLAY A LARGER ROLE IN WORLD AFFAIRS AND MUST MAKE A MORE ACTIVE EFFORT TO RESOLVE OUTSTANDING PROBLEMS WITH THE US.

- 2. (N) NAKASONE BEGAN WITH A TONE-SETTING STATE-MENT OF THE PERCEPTIONS THAT WILL GUIDE HIS AD-MINISTRATION. HE POINTED OUT THAT JAPAN FACES SERIOUS PROBLEMS IN ITS FOREIGN RELATIONS AND DOMESTIC AFFAIRS, AND HE SAID HE WOULD MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO "PIERCE THIS GLOOM" AND CALLED UPON THE JAPANESE PEOPLE TO SUPPORT HIS EFFORT.
- 3. (HE SAID HIS PRIMARY POLITICAL OBJECTIVE IS TO "MAINTAIN PEACE IN JAPAN AND THE WORLD" AND TO PROMOTE THE DEVELOPMENT OF JAPAN'S DEMOCRACY, AND THAT HIS SECOND OBJECTIVE IS TO MAKE JAPAN A NATION OF "VIBRANT CULTURE AND WELFARE." TO EXPLAIN THIS CONCEPT HE RELATED THAT WHEN HE WAS FIRST ELECTED TO THE DIET IN 1947 HE HAD TO PICK HIS WAY TO THE DIET BUILDING THROUGH STREETS STREWN WITH RUBBLE AND FILLED WITH BLACK MARKET PEDDLERS. AT THAT TIME HE SAID JAPAN WAS NOT IN A POSITION TO PURSUE ITS IDEAL OF NATIONHOOD, NOW, HOWEVER, HE SAID JAPAN HAS BECOME THE SECOND LARGEST ECO-NOMIC POWER IN THE FREE WORLD AND HAS ESTABLISHED THE ECONOMIC BASIS ON WHICH TO PURSUE ITS SPIRITUAL FULLNESS AND A FAMILY-CENTERED CONCEPT OF WELFARE. HE CALLED ON "EACH CITIZEN TO ACT IN A SPIRIT OF

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

SELF-RELIANCE AND SELF-HELP TO FULFILL HIS OWN RESPONSIBILITIES. "

4. W TURNING THEN TO SPECIFIC POLICY AREAS, NAKASONE SAID HE IS COMMITTED TO PURSUING ADMINI-STRATIVE REFORM AND HE PLEDGED TO RESPECT THE RECOMMENDATIONS MADE LAST JULY BY THE EXTRA-ORDINARY COMMISSION ON ADMINISTRATIVE REFORM. RE-ORGANIZATION OF THE JAPAN NATIONAL RAILWAY IS ESPECIALLY URGENT, HE SAID, AND LEGISLATION TO ESTABLISH A COUNCIL TO OVERSEE THAT TASK WOULD BE PROPOSED DURING THIS DIET SESSION. HE WARNED THAT JAPAN SHOULD "KICK ITS DEPENDENCE" ON ISSUANCE OF DEFICIT-FINANCING NATIONAL BONDS, BUT THAT THIS GOAL WOULD BE HARD TO MEET. HE POINTED OUT THAT AT PRESENT THE JAPANESE ECONOMY IS IN DECLINE AND THAT A SERIOUS REVENUE SHORTFALL HAS RESULTED. HE PROMISED NEVERTHELESS TO MAKE MAXIMUM EFFORTS TO REDUCE GOVERNMENT SPENDING AND SAID MEASURES TO INCREASE REVENUE WOULD ALSO BE STUDIED WITHIN THE GENERAL PRINCIPLE OF AVOIDING A TAX INCREASE.

- FOR POINTING OUT THAT JAPAN'S ECONOMIC SLUGGISHNESS IS PART OF A GLOBAL ECONOMIC DOWNTURN, NAKASONE SAID HE WOULD SEEK TO EXPAND DOMESTIC DEMAND WHILE ALSO TAKING MEASURES TO AID THOSE INDUSTRIES HARD-HIT BY THE RECESSION, ESPECIALLY SMALL BUSINESSES. HE SAID JAPAN'S TASK IS TO PROMOTE "STABLE AND SUSTAINED ECONOMIC GROWTH" AND THAT CREATIVE AND INNOVATIVE POLICIES TO ACHIEVE THAT GOAL MUST BE DEVISED. HE SAID HE PLANS TO DRAW UP A NEW LONG-TERM SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC PLAN TO ELUCIDATE "THE FUTURE SHAPE OF THE JAPANESE ECONOMY AND SOCIETY."
- 6. (N) THEN TAKING UP FOREIGN POLICY, NAKASONE EMPHASIZED THAT "THE UNITED STATES IS JAPAN'S MOST IMPORTANT PARTNER." AND SAID HE HOPES TO FURTHER STRENGTHEN THE RELATIONSHIP OF TRUST BE-TWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND JAPAN. HE SAID HE ALSO INTENDS TO IMPROVE RELATIONS WITH THE COUNTRIES OF ASIA AND THAT, WITH A NEW LEADERSHIP NOW IN PLACE IN THE SOVIET UNION, HE IS DETERMINED TO TRY TO RESOLVE THE NORTHERN TERRITORIES ISSUE AND CON-CLUDE A PEACE TREATY WITH THE SOVIET UNION. HE SAID THAT IN THE AREA OF INTERNATIONAL ECONOMICS THE GREATEST ISSUE IS HOW TO STEM THE RISING TIDE OF PROTECTIONISM, AND HE SAID HE IS DETERMINED TO "CONTRIBUTE TO THE MAINTENANCE AND STRENGTHEN-ING OF THEFREE TRADE SYSTEM AND THE REVITALIZATION OF THE WORLD ECONOMY."
- 7. ON SECURITY MATTERS NAKASONE SAID THAT JAPAN'S BASIC STANCE IS TO ADHERE TO JAPAN-U.S. SECURITY ARRANGEMENTS AND TO ACHIEVE A "HIGH LEVEL OF DEFENSE CAPABILITY LIMITED TO THAT NECESSARY FOR STRICTLY SELF-DEFENSE." HE SAID JAPAN WILL AVOID BECOMING A MILITARY POWER OR POSING A

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MILITARY THREAT TO ITS NEIGHBORS. HE SAID THAT IN LINE WITH JAPAN'S CONCEPT OF COMPREHENSIVE SECURITY JAPAN WILL ALSO SEEK TO ENHANCE ITS SECURITY BY PROMOTING FREE TRADE, BY SEEKING ECONOMIC COOPERATION WITH OTHER NATIONS, AND BY SEEKING TO OBTAIN STABLE SOURCES OF ENERGY, FOODSTUFFS, AND RAW MATERIALS.

- 8. NU IN HIS CONCLUDING REMARKS NAKASONE SAID THAT AN ERA OF UNCERTAINTY AND DIFFICULTY FACES JAPAN. HE INTENDS TO TELL THE PEOPLE THE FACTS. SEEK THEIR VIEWS, AND AT TIMES REQUEST THEIR PATIENCE AND FOREBEARANCE. SINCE THE MEILL RESTORATION LAPAN HAS FACED NUMEROUS NATIONAL TRIALS, BUT EACH TIME HAS OVERCOME ITS HARDSHIPS SPLENDIDLY. THIS SUCCESS, NAKASONE SAID, IS DUE TO "OUR NATIONAL TRADITION OF INNER STRENGTH." NOTING THAT WITH EACH PASSING YEAR THE WORLD IS INCREASINGLY EXPECTING JAPAN TO PLAY A LARGER ROLE IN THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY. 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IN THE FIELD OF ENERGY, WE PROPOSE THE CREATION OF AN AD HOC SUMMIT GROUP ON ENERGY TO CONDUCT THE ENERGY STUDY REFERRED TO IN THE "SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS." THIS GROUP WOULD BE EXPANDED TO INCLUDE OTHER DIRECTLY CONCERNED COUNTRIES. THE AD HOC GROUP WOULD COMMISSION THE OECD COMBINED ENERGY SECRETARIAT TO PREPARE THE ENERGY STUDY BASED ON TERMS OF REFERENCE AND GUIDANCE FROM THE GROUP. IN ADDITION, WE PROPOSE THAT THE FEBRUARY MEETING REVIEW THE EFFECTIVENESS AND RESPONSIVENESS OF COCOM IN GENERAL AND WHAT SHOULD BE DONE TO STRENGTHEN COCOM INSTITUTIONALLY.

REMEMBER THAT WE ALL ATTACHED GREAT IMPORTANCE TO THIS EFFORT, AS IT WILL PROVIDE US WITH A COMMON ASSESSMENT OF EAST-WEST ECONOMIC RELATIONS AND THEREBY ENABLE US TO IMPLEMENT THE PRINCIPLES ON WHICH WE AGREED. IN OUR VIEW, A SPECIAL GROUP SHOULD BE FORMED TO CONDUCT THIS STUDY ON THE BASIS OF CONTRIBUTIONS FROM THE PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES. AMBASSADOR MANSFIELD, AMBASSADOR ADELMAN, MICHAEL GUNIN, AND MARC BAAS ACCOMPANIED RUMSFELD.
- 3. RUMSFELD OPENED MEETING BY EXTENDING PRESIDENT REAGAN'S IVITATION TO MEET WITH NAKASONE IN WASHINGTON ON JANUARY 18. NAKASONE WELCOMED THE GOOD NEWS AND HAPPILY ACCEPTED THE INVITATION. HE APPRECIATED PRESIDENT REAGAN'S LETTER ON LAW OF THE SEA TREATY AND NOTED THAT:
