Following our talk last month I promised to let you have names of people who might be invited to the President's dinner for the Queen in San Francisco.

In the categories you suggested, we have not yet completed our lists of Rhodes and Marshall scholars or of Captains of Industries. I hope to let you have these next week.

In the meantime, I enclose a list of US citizens who shared Nobel Prizes with British Citizens of whom one Professor Berg, is at Stanford. I also enclose a list of Americans holding Honorary Knighthoods together with a note of the position they occupy, where this is not obvious.

Our Consuls-General will be letting me have next week their suggestions for guests to the dinners and receptions the Queen will be giving in San Diego, Los Angeles and San Francisco. We have agreed with Mike Deaver and Bill Sittmann that we will show them these lists so that we can avoid duplication and so that you can let us know of any additional names who might need to be included. This applies particularly to the Queen's dinner in honour of the President and Mrs Reagan in San Francisco on 4 March. But we would welcome your guidance at other points as well.
