Dear Mr.President:


What a fantastic surprise! Your wire and the kind wishes from you and the First Lady to Selma and me made my birthday. I am truly honored.

## TV BLURBS ICING ACTORS' CAKES

### ASHLEY FAMOUS RECORD SET FOR FALL TV SALES

Ashley Famous Agency has set up a record number of sales for the 1966-67 television season for the percentage, with sales having been made for video taping 11 1/2 hours of prime-time programming each week.

Figure for the best selling season the agency has ever had was disclosed by AFA exec vicepres Alden Sumner, who is head of the agency's coast office. It does not include daytime network tv, where the agency has made six deals for next season, nor does it include special shows by the agency.

AFA-repped shows will be on the network every night of the next fall. Sales are "Garry Shandling Show," to CBS-TV; renewal of "Candid Camera," CBS-TV; "Buddy Run," CBS-TV; "The From U.N.C.L.E.," MGM-TV-TV-Productions series, to NBC-TV (AFA reps Aron); renewal on "Danny Kaye Show," CBS-TV. "April Savage," ABC-TV; "Jersey" (Continued on Page 16)

### Up Sheehan To ABC News Chief

Bill Sheehan, ABC News bureau chief in London, has been named successor to TV News v.p. Jesse Zousmer, killed March 4 in the crash of an airliner near Tokyo Airport.

Sheehan joined the network in mid-1961 and has been in London almost four years. He previously worked for stations in Connecticut and Massachusetts, and prior to ABC was news director for WJR, Detroit.

### 33% Of SAG Thesps' \$97M. Earnings Last Year Came From Video Commercials

Television commercials are accounting for a third of the income of Screen Actors Guild, which indicates in the last members have earned \$33,553,400 of a total income of \$97,791,000 from blurbs alone.

Figures derived from actors pay-ments into the SAG health and welfare plans indicate actual totals could be even greater, since these payments are based on limitations of \$100,000 per picture for top price stars and other such limitations in cases of tv series. SAG estimates members' total income last year hit well over \$100,000,000. So income from blurbs could be slightly up too, since some actors doing commercials also derive considerably above \$100,000.

Washington March 14.—Closely different tv network negotiations may be foreshadowed April 12 meeting between Communications Satellite Corp. and the networks, plus other communication entities such as International Telephone & Telegraph.

Contract called the meeting discussed the details of the negotiating possible use of sat-ellite for network feeds. CBS and accepted the invitation, but C is unclear as to whether ABC will attend. ABC had asked FCC permission to build its own domestic satellite for relaying ne-twork programs to affiliated stations rebroadcast, but FCC dismissed application pending further study.

Dear Mike,

The excitement builds for the Queen's visit and the accompanying activities. Already the conversation frequently centers around her visit and, as you might expect, many wine producers would love to contribute. I have just received from Shirley the proposed menu for San Francisco. It certainly is a very exotic menu, well balanced with some unique characteristics. My feelings are that it would be nice if new wines (that is, wines not previously served at the White House) could be selected for these special occasions. Certainly the wines will receive very close scrutiny in California. However, my interest in attempting something special is in an effort to compliment your role as official Host for the Queen's visit. I am sure your enthusiasm for wine and the direction you give to the President in such matters is well noted by an asterick in the Queen's personnel file.

The Lobster Terrine with Golden Caviar and Dill Sauce offers a chance to show California's finest white grape varietal, Chardonnay. The inherent sweetness of lobster is attractively enhanced by the riper more opulent Chardonnays which are not over oaked and demonstrate harmony with balancing acidity. The crisp finish, a result of the acid level, handles the more distinctive flavors of Golden Caviar and Dill Sauce. There are a number of wines I have in mind, and I expect to do a tasting of these with my rendition of the course. A final list will be quickly forwarded to you. One superb wine in consideration is the 1981 Edna Valley Chardonnay, a ripe buttery Montrachet or fuller Meursault styled wine.

The Consomme of Pheasant with Goose Liver Querelles offers a most unique opportunity at a State Dinner -- that of the potential service of one of California's superb sherries. Very few things are more English than

sherry. The word Sherry is an anglicized version of Jerez (de la Frontera), the primary city in Spain for sherry production and for centuries the name most closely associated with the wine from that region. It is believed by some that the regular export of sherry to England began with the reign of Henry VII when the ties between the two countries were enhanced by the marriage of Henry's son to the daughter of Ferdinand and Isabella of Spain. Regardless of its beginnings, sherry holds an important economic, social and historic position in England's past.

Possibly Shakespeare's famous contribution -- Falstaff's speech in favor of the effects of sack (sherry) most clearly identifies the English love of sherry. I am sure that 1½ or 2-ounce sherry glasses are available, and the nutty flavors of one of California's Amontillado-styled sherries would be an exquisite and, as the English say "civilized", accompaniment to the double consomme.

The main course of Loin of Veal with Puree of Morels again offers the opportunity to display one of California's finest, Cabernet Sauvignon. Selection of the Cabernet Sauvignon should lean to the elegant style; however, with some maturity, softer and lighter with developed bottle bouquet. The English association with Bordeaux or Claret is actually a long love affair resulting from a royal marriage and the accompanying dowry.

In 1152 Henry Plantagenet married Eleanor of Aquitaine. Henry was 19; Eleanor 30 (progressive young man). She brought with her a tremendous dowry -- most of western France. In 1154 when King Stephen died, Henry and Eleanor became king and queen of England, bringing to England Bordeaux. With no export taxes or import taxes going to England, Bordeaux enjoyed an active trade and business relations with England, and the consequences were a less expensive wine for the English and the beginning of developed preference for Bordeaux or Claret as it came to be called. By the way, it was during this time of English control (300 years) that many of the great chateaux of Bordeaux were built. Examples are Chateaux Lafite and Mouton Rothschild.

One Cabernet Sauvignon for tasting and consideration is the highly acclaimed 1976 Conn Creek. The interesting coincidence and possibly politically appropriate consideration is the fact that Conn Creek is the only winery in California with English partners (at least to my knowledge). The Ropers,

a well known English family, are limited partners in the winery. Certainly the family is well known to Buckingham Palace. One member of the family is a member of Parliament; David Ropner recently retired as President of the British Shipbuilders; closer to home, Sophia Ropner was, according to my sources, a regular companion of Prince Andrew. The family holdings are in shipping, insurance and manufacturing. Interestingly, the other limited partners in Conn Creek are the Woltners -- owners of Chateau La Misson Haut Brion in Graves, France. The owner, Bill Collins, has offered 10 cases, the quantity required for 250 - 270 people. Regardless of the Cabernet Sauvignon selected, it can be easily carried into the goat cheese course. Walter Sullivan has offered 1970 Beaulieu Cabernet Sauvignon; however, it is very expensive and has been used previously -- coincidentally for Prince Charles. In addition, the wine required decanting, and 10 cases of decanting (120 bottles) is truly an exhausting process as well as time consuming. I would suggest a few bottles, possibly utilizing their offer for service on the Britannia.

For dessert, the Aurora Pacifica, now changed, I believe, to Floating Island Pacifica. 1981 Piper Sonoma has offered, as you know, to 1-supply wine; 2-to do a special label. I talked with them, and they still feel they can complete the special label prior to the State Dinner. The wine exhibits a fruity though elegant nose with some hints of yeast. The flavor is full and demonstrates breeding and finesse associated with its heritage and the youthful exuberance of California.

The arrangement of wines -- Chardonnay, Sherry, Cabernet Sauvignon, and Champagne -- may seem lengthy, but remember that in most cases it is a single glass over an extended period, and the sherry only represents two ounces. Certainly the concept of wines is as sophisticated (particularly with the inclusion of sherry with soup) as the menu and represents a very elegant evening in harmony.

Assuming that these suggestions prove acceptable, I will follow this letter with specific recommendations for each course following a weekend of tasting.

(Can I get a copy of your diet?) My own New Year's resolution has demonstrated little success.

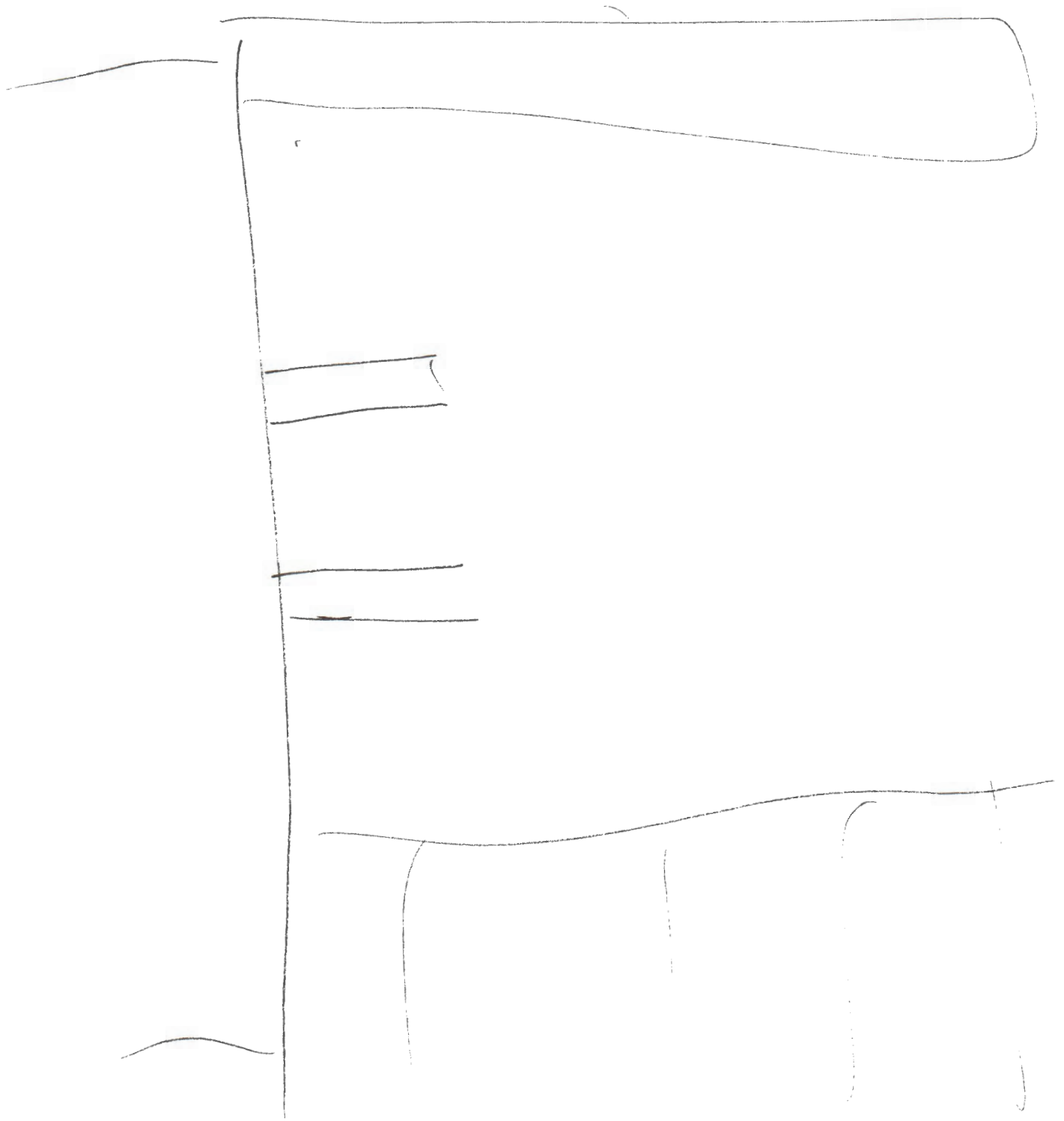

SUBJECT: Invitations to Events Involving  
Queen Elizabeth in California

I have reviewed the proposed guest lists for the visit of Queen Elizabeth to California and from a foreign policy perspective, I have the following comments:

With respect to the dinner on HMY BRITANNIA the evening of March 4, Prime Minister Fraser of Australia should be invited -- inasmuch as he is arriving in San Francisco the afternoon of March 4 and is meeting with the President on March 5.

With respect to the dinner on HMY BRITANNIA the evening of February 26 in San Diego, there appears to be an inordinate number of naval and ex-naval personnel. My comments are attached at Tab A.

I feel I should bring to your attention another observation from a political perspective. Being somewhat familiar with the California political scene and concerned about the President's image in California in the case of the re-election campaign, the lists appear to lack invitations to many of the people, with whom I am familiar, who have been politically associated with the President over the past years -- including members of the President's past administration while governor, and those people who have both contributed their time and efforts on behalf of the President's campaigns. Ignoring this large body of loyal Reaganites could prove to be not only embarrassing to the President but would immediately become widely known throughout the state, and could have a very detrimental effect on organizational efforts in the future -- both in California and in other states. Attached at Tab B are some recommendations and suggestions of people who should be included, and some additional questions concerning the appropriateness of certain invitees.

I have communicated to Jim Rosebush my recommendation that Secretary Weinberger, Justice Frank Richardson, and Robert Kane be invited to the State Dinner in San Francisco. I have previously recommended that Dr. Spencer be invited to the dinner in Los Angeles.

Norman Roberts -- San Diego county co-chairman from 1966 on for all Reagan campaigns

Mrs. Robert Tyson -- major fund raiser and organizer for Reagan and all campaigns since 1966

Richard Tuthill -- major fund-raiser and donor for all Republican campaigns and specifically the Reagan campaign in San Diego

Dan Larson -- both he and his wife are major civic leaders; campaign chairman for Republican candidates; loyal Reagan supporters and fund-raisers
