

What a State the Queen Is In

San Francisco — So you have this little 56-year-old lady who favors nouveau frump when it comes to clothing and jewelry expensive enough to embarrass the Vatican and a manner of waving at people that suggests she is trying to rub them away — here Queen Elizabeth comes touring California, where, on an average day, there might be mudslides, guerrilla theater and Ronald Reagan dressed as the Lone

It is a state in which there also can be a man reading—really reading—the society pages of the Los Angeles Times while steering south on the San Diego Freeway, and a bar that, each year, gives a prize to the person who does the samplest literary takeoff of Ernest Hemissway Before the judges make their designors, it is considered essential that they get pickled, such is the quality of the competition. This also is the place where a guest can ask the hotel clerk how far one city is from another and get an answer that goes generally like this: "Oh, wow, I don't know firsure, but I make it in two hours, because my boyfriend, like, drives really fast."

Food? Don't mention food. Sure, Queen Elizabeth and His Husbandness Prince Philip have had a

Sure, Queen Elizabeth and His Husbandness Prince Philip have had a slurp of double pheasant consomme here and a taste of toasted coconut snowball there, but when they slogged through seven tons of mud to get to Rancho del Cielo, President Reagan's Levitt House on the Sea, what did the royal couple find waiting for lunch? Tacos. Enchiladas. Refried beans.

There is dignity in the food of all people, of course, but this meal happened to be one set before the queen, a person who hardly seems the type to yell, "Pass the hot sauce." Not only was the President's choice a trifle brazen, but, according to some, it was downright cruel. The queen had just come from Mexico, where, word was, she spent more time than usual in the powder room.


What is a nice historical figure with centuries of tradition behind her doing in a place like this? For the first week of her California tour, Elizabeth must have wondered, too.

San Diego was soaked. Basically a decent American city with clean streets and polite cab drivers, San Diego was a city au jus. The royal yacht, Britannia, 412 feet and 5,769 tons, the largest pleasure craft in the world, could have sailed past the pier and directly up Broadway, although something told the clerk in the discount drug it wouldn't happen. "She's not gonna come downtown," said the clerk, packing disposable razors in a bag. "They never do."

Elizabeth got locked into some odd assignments. They took her to the Scripps Oceanographic Institution and gave her drill bits — really, drill bits — as a memento, and they took her aboard the aircraft carrier USS Ranger during weather conditions that made the scene look like one from Victory at Sea.

She unveiled a statue of Shakespeare and went to church, Episcopal, but didn't take communion because queens, evidently, don't do such things in public. Elizabeth never got to see the restaurant called Fat City, nor did she sip Dos Equis beer at Consuelo's. These may be small pleasures, but, in the opinion of many, they beat standing on the deck of the biggest yacht in the world while your private Marine marching band plays, "Britannia Rules the Waves." After the performance, Elizabeth's guests went down the gangplank and the queen, with Philip, retreated behind windowed doors, the night still young.

Rain, rain, rain. In Los Angeles, rain fell as though intending to do bodily harm and made rivers run in the nicest neighborhoods. Elizabeth went to dinner in a movie studio, and many old men whose faces still are remembered attended with young women in short skirts. How do they do it? asked a

person watching the old men and young women. People debated theories of money and power.

Who thought of Santa Barbara? The Reagan ranch, oh boy. You put the queen of the United Kingdom in a four-wheel drive vehicle and hike her up to the top of the hill, and not only does she get enchiladas, but she gets Ronald Reagan in his Frontier Days costume — jeans, denim jacket, bolo tie, the works. Had she been interested, the queen could have taken her limousine to Taco Bell and perhaps met a genuine California street type, someone like the fellow who calls himself Ned Shrapnel and advocates the decriminalization of hand grenades for personal use. "We spend an awful lot of money on defense and never put it to use," Shrapnel reasons.

Along the line, people got the feeling that Philip was the plugged-in portion of the family. He did not wear white gloves and bowler hats, for one thing, and, for another, he waved with his whole arm, got it right up there. He has a tan complexion and, in San Diego, said something slightly risque while passing the monkey cage at the zoo. San Francisco would

beth and Philip headed for Trader Vic's.

Why, then, why? The queen came to California because Reagan invited her last year. She came during the rainy season because she had other stops to make — Jamaica, Mexico, British Columbia — and planning a royal tour must take many elements into consideration. "No matter when you go, you'd have problems somewhere," said a British press attache. "Of course, what we did not count on was running into the worst weather California has had for 25

years." Always, there are answers.

Even in Yosemite National Park yesterday, the weather was unruly. Elizabeth viewed some of America's most spectacular scenery in the style to which she had become accustomed: through fog and rain. Her Majesty stood at Inspiration Point carrying a furled umbrella and gazed at the wall of sheer granite called El Capitan and then at Bridalveil, a delicate waterfall that spouts on the opposite side of Yosemite Valley. With Philip, the queen gazed at the snowy ridges around them. All was calm. For the next two days the queen's path will be lined by redwoods and sugar pines—not the coarse or the curious. At 4,500 feet, Elizabeth was, at last, above it all.

3 Secret Service Agents Killed in Accident


Yosemite National Park, Calif. (AP) — Three Secret Service agents were killed and two sheriff's deputies were injured in a traffic accident yesterday as Queen Elizabeth II's motorcade headed up a winding mountain highway to Yosemite National Park.

The agents, part of an advance security team, were killed in the head-on collision of their car and a car from the Mariposa County sheriff's department, state trooper Jim Fulton said. The accident occurred "miles ahead" of

the royal party, which detoured around the crash and continued into the park, troopers said. The dead agents were identified as: George P. La Barge, 41; Donald W. Robinson, 38, and Donald A. Bejcek, 29.

"The queen has heard about this very sad accident, and she's of course very saddened by the news," said Michael Shea, her press secretary. President Reagan extended condolences in separate calls to the agents' wives.
