

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



Press Statement

Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger and Minister of Defense Manfred Woerner had an excellent discussion covering a wide range of defense issues and strategic questions in great depth.

- Among the topics discussed was the requirement to improve the conventional strength of the Alliance, as agreed to at the NATO Summit in Bonn. Secretary Weinberger and Minister Woerner agreed that their governments were determined to move ahead on this initiative.
- Secretary Weinberger expressed his appreciation to MOD Woerner for the German contribution to wartime host nation support and, in particular, for the German determination fully to implement this commitment.
- Secretary Weinberger and MOD Woerner also discussed the funding for NATO infrastructure. Secretary Weinberger was gratified that, in spite of current economic difficulties, MOD Woerner confirmed that the Federal Republic was taking a significant step forward on infrastructure funding.
- The Ministers reaffirmed the "dual track" decision of the Alliance for the deployment of Intermediate Range Nuclear Forces. They reconfirmed that their

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

DRAFT STATEMENT FOR PRESIDENT REAGAN AT WHITE HOUSE SOUTH  
LAWN WELCOMING CEREMONY, MONDAY, NOVEMBER 15

I want to welcome you, Mr. Chancellor, to Washington. We are delighted to have you, Mrs. Kohl, Foreign Minister Genscher, Mrs. Genscher, and your party as our guests, and we look forward to our time together.

The Federal Republic of Germany and the United States are tightly bound together in a friendship and partnership going back many years. Our ties and common interests cover many different fields. Your visit here is a demonstration of how close our relationship is, and we anticipate cordial and productive discussions.

The Western world in general and the NATO Alliance in particular are going through difficult times. World-wide recession and a growing threat to our security from the Soviet Union are significant problems with which we must deal. It is important to remember, though, that US-German cooperation is close and, working together, we have mastered thorny problems before.

We are deeply concerned by the Soviet Union's threat to Western security and by instances of unacceptable Soviet behavior both at home and abroad. In particular, we are concerned about the projection of Soviet military power.

The Soviet invasion of Afghanistan and Soviet behavior in Poland are extremely disturbing, and we have taken appropriate measures in response. It is important to make clear to the Soviet Union that there are limits to unacceptable international behavior, beyond which the cause of world stability and peace is set back appreciably.

At the same time, it should be clearly understood that we do not wish to break off contacts with the Soviet Union. We have continued government-to-government contacts, and we are engaged in serious and complex arms control negotiations with the Soviets in Geneva and Vienna. There remains a large volume of East-West trade. We think it important, however, to regard economic ties with the Soviets in a strategic context, in order to harmonize them with our political and strategic interests. The US, the Federal Republic, and other Allies are working closely on this issue.

Much attention has been paid on both sides of the Atlantic to a so-called "neutralist" and "peace" trend in our publics. It is important to note that the vast majority of our peoples supports the NATO Alliance and our mutual commitment to our common security. As leaders of our countries, however, we have a responsibility to make clear that complex problems touching

our security cannot be dealt with with simple answers. We strive for peace, but in order to have it, we must be ready to defend it. Adequate military strength is one part of what is required.

I would like to mention a few numbers to demonstrate the depth of the connection between our countries. Almost thirty per cent of the American people trace their origins, either wholly or in part, back to Germany. Approximately seven million Germans have immigrated to this country in the three hundred years since a small group left the Rhineland town of Krefeld for the New World in 1683. Famous names abound in this group, and they have enriched immeasurably American life. At the moment, we have with us a group of young Germans who are spending the autumn months living with American families in Henrico County, Virginia. Through such exchanges, we perpetuate the links between our two peoples. I am pleased to welcome this group to Washington.

Both you, Mr. Chancellor, and Foreign Minister Genscher are familiar faces in Washington. As leaders of one of our closest allies, and as our good friends, you are most welcome.

Mr. Chancellor, Mr. Foreign Minister, colleagues and friends:

I think we have made, in the productive meeting we have just finished, good progress in examining the topics before us. Our talks have been cordial and valuable. Our agenda is long, but not because of problems between us. The difficulty is rather that with two allies whose interests are so intertwined, many, many subjects must be discussed. This is a strength of our partnership.

Our discussions are doubly important because such great attention is paid, not only in our countries but in many capitals of the world, to the course of US-German relations. Our partnership is solid and well-founded, based on shared human and democratic values. There are people in both countries, however, who wonder if the relationship is not a bit one-sided, usually in the other partner's favor. Although the facts clearly reveal that this is not the case, this misapprehension is difficult to lay to rest.

There is another paradox in our partnership. Although we Americans clearly see our world role and fully intend to be equal to the burden, the United States is historically a reluctant great power. The Federal Republic, although a

prosperous, strong, and democratic society, is sometimes hesitant about translating that strength into power of its own. Nevertheless, much of the world looks to the two of us for guidance and help. We must be ready to meet that challenge.

As I indicated earlier this morning when you arrived, Mr. Chancellor, the difficult period we are going through in the Western world has a peculiar aspect which complicates our situation. As the threat to our security and the expansion of military power by the Soviet Union have increased, we find ourselves in economic straits which provoke tensions within the Alliance and make taking adequate countermeasures to the Soviet threat difficult. At the same time, the fear of nuclear war has gripped segments of our peoples to such an extent that they do not pay adequate attention to our own security. As demonstrated by the recent allied agreement on East-West economic relations, we are, nevertheless, making great progress toward resolution of the current issues. We are also deeply engaged in enhancing our security by various measures. It is important to remember that the Alliance has weathered storms before that were more serious, and the degree of Alliance cohesion and common purpose will see us through this present difficult period.

We have taken note of and appreciate, Mr. Chancellor, your government's intention to adhere firmly to the connection with the US. We realize also that you have particular interests in your neighbor directly to the East, the German Democratic Republic. Although Germans live in both states, they are still separated by concrete, machine guns, and barbed wire, and the people who put those inhuman barriers there show no intention of taking them down. We support your efforts to maintain contact with the GDR; what concerns us is the GDR's willingness to be a stalking horse for Soviet political and economic interests. Nevertheless, you can count on sympathetic understanding from us as you tackle this difficult problem.

Mr. Chancellor, Mr. Foreign Minister, we are pleased to have you at our table. The bond between us which your visit represents is strong and healthy. Gentlemen, please join me in toasting our distinguished colleagues and the Federal Republic of Germany.

Chancellor Kohl and I have just concluded a series of conversations which covered a wide range of political, security, and economic issues of mutual interest to our countries. We agreed that close consultations are necessary, as in the past, and we fully intend to stay in close touch. I would like on the occasion of the visit of Chancellor Kohl and Foreign Minister Genscher to make an announcement.

As part of our initiative to increase contacts between the German and American peoples, I have formed a Presidential Commission for the US-German Tricentennial. Chancellor Kohl and I, accompanied by Secretary Shultz and Foreign Minister Genscher, met with the Commission several minutes ago.

The year 1983 marks the 300th anniversary of the arrival in the New World of the first group of German settlers, who founded Germantown, Pennsylvania, now a part of Philadelphia. That first hardy band and their ship, the "Concord," have been followed by millions of German immigrants to this country. Almost thirty per cent of the American people trace their origins, wholly or in part, to Germany. In 1983, we will commemorate the innumerable contributions made to American society by our fellow citizens of German descent, including Secretary Shultz, whose forebears came from Southwest Germany. Events to celebrate the anniversary are planned by many communities in both countries.

I have appointed the Commission to represent me throughout the commemoration. Chief Justice Warren Burger and other distinguished Americans have agreed to serve. One of the high points of the celebration will take place in Philadelphia in October, 1983, at a gala banquet, which both President Carstens of the Federal Republic of Germany and I hope to attend. The US Congress has also chosen to mark the occasion; the Senate has passed, and there is now before the House, a joint resolution marking 1983 as the tricentennial year. I am sure that this commemoration will be a great success in celebrating the deep and lasting friendship between our two countries.

Mr. Chancellor, Mrs. Kohl, colleagues and friends:  
Nancy and I are very pleased to have the opportunity and the honor to welcome this select and distinguished group to our table. I am happy to reciprocate your hospitality of last night. The food has been superb, the company delightful, and the occasion a happy one for all of us.

As we expected, we have had ample reason to observe today how deep and lasting is the relationship between the Federal Republic of Germany and the United States. Our relations are and have always been excellent, and one reason for this is that both of us consider close consultations between us as vital. Today's discussions, over the full range of issues of mutual interest, were yet another link in a long chain of such cordial and valuable talks. We are allies, partners, and friends. That relationship is crucial to the preservation of our precious liberties. It also enables us to offer hope to those, not having freedom, who seek it.

As you know, freedom such as we enjoy is a scarce possession in today's world, and it is not won easily. We admire greatly the efforts of the Federal German government, the German political parties, and the German people to nurture it in their homeland and throughout the world.

We are also very interested in bringing our two peoples ever closer together. I have mentioned earlier today our efforts to pass on to our successor generations the common sense of purpose we feel so deeply and the 1983 commemoration of all that the millions of immigrants to these shores from Germany have added to American life. We are pleased that the Federal German government, and our guests tonight personally, are so deeply committed to these efforts and that considerable work on them has already been done in the Federal Republic. We in the United States will also give of our best.
