2. I CONCLUDED THE AFRICAN SEGMENT OF MY CONSULTATIONS TODAY (11/6) WITH A MEETING WITH KENYAN PRESIDENT AND OAU CHAIRMAN MOI. MOI WAS AFFABLE AND HELPFUL THROUGHOUT OUR DISCUSSION. AS I LED THE CONTACT GROUP IN NAIROBI, I OUTLINED THE PROGRESS OF OUR MISSION AND THE AIMS OF THE CG EXERCISE. THE KENYAN REPLIED IN GENERAL TERMS EXHORTING US TO WORK TO END THE KILLING AND DESTRUCTION IN NAMIBIA AND SOUTHERN ANGOLA. HE ACCEPTED OUR VIEW OF THE NEED FOR CONFIDENCE-BUILDING MEASURES DIRECTED AT THE SAG AND OTHERS. MOI DECLINED TO RECEIVE A DETAILED BRIEFING ON OUR CONSTITUTIONAL PRINCIPLES OR THE INTERNATIONAL STATUS PAPER. HE DID, HOWEVER, AGREE THAT BOTH PAPERS WERE USEFUL.
3. MOI CAUTIONED THE CONTACT GROUP AGAINST BEING OVERLY ENTHUSIASTIC IN PROMOTING REGIONAL GOVERNMENT IN NAMIBIA. WHILE HE SUPPORTS OUR IDEA OF LOCAL SELF-GOVERNMENT, HE FEARS "REGIONAL" DIVISIONS WILL ONLY UNDERMINE THE STRUCTURE OF A SINGLE STATE. HE ALSO CALLED FOR AN IMMEDIATE CEASEFIRE TO EASE TENSIONS AND "CLEAR THE AIR" FOR NEGOTIATIONS. MOI PREDICTED THAT ONCE IN POWER SWAPO'S LEADERS WOULD BECOME MORE MODERATE AS THEY FACED THE REALITIES OF GOVERNING.
4. MOI'S LIEUTENANTS, VICE PRESIDENT KIBAKI AND MINISTER OF STATE BIWOTT, RAISED THE FEW HARD ISSUES OF THE MEETING. KIBAKI ASKED ABOUT THE STATUS OF WALVIS BAY AND READILY ACCEPTED OUR POINT THAT IT WAS TO BE DISCUSSED

3. THE BRITISH ARE WORKING HARD FOR A FINAL POSITIVE DECISION. THE FOREIGN OFFICE IS STILL DISCUSSING TERMS OF REFERENCE WITH FRENCH AND ITALIAN COLLEAGUES, WHO ARE COMING TO LONDON OCTOBER 21 TO COMPLETE WORK ON THE EC PACKAGE. IN THE U.K., THE FINISHED PRODUCT WILL BE SUBMITTED TO THE MINISTRY OF DEFENSE FOR CLEARANCE, AND LAST TO THATCHER FOR CONCURRENCE. THE BRITISH WILL THEN CONVEY THE TERMS OF REFERENCE TO THE U.S. VIA VELIOTES WHILE HE IS HERE.
4. IF THE U. S. HAS OBJECTIONS TO THE TERMS OF REFERENCE, THERE WILL BE AMPLE OPPORTUNITY TO RESPOND AT THIS POINT. BY THE STANDARDS OF MIDDLE EAST PEACE NEGOTIATIONS, WE WOULD NOT EXPECT THE ENSUING NEGOTIATIONS TO BE ARDUOUS.
