# Teen-ager to meet idol—the queen

So you want to meet the queen? It's easy — just write the White House and ask them. They'll call right back with the news that "You've got yourself a deal."

That's the unlikely but true-life scenario that will bring a 16-year-old Goleta girl into the presence of Queen Elizabeth II on March 1 when Great Britain's reigning monarch spends the day in Santa Barbara seeing some sights and visting its most notable citizen, President Reagan.

Julie Ohman is the lucky girl whose far-fetched idea secured her a rare entry into the royal presence.

"It seemed like such an off-the-wall idea," Julie said last week in recalling how the once-in-a-lifetime chance is coming about.

It helps, of course, if you're a royalty buff, which describes Julie. The furor over the wedding of Prince Charles and Lady Diana in 1981 and regular trips to England by her aunt and uncle fanned the flames of interest in royalty that the San Marcos High School Junlor had for some time.

Books on royalty, magazines on royalty and calendars on royalty occupy important places in her room. She's a subscriber to "Royalty Monthly."

She's even memorized the layout of Buckingham Palace.

So when Julie learned of the visit by

the queen and Prince Phillip to Santa Barbara and the idea of asking to meet the queen sprang up, she pursued it.

Encouraged by her mother, Carol, a real estate agent, Julie wrote early this month to Sheila Tate, press secretary to Nancy Reagan.

What persuasive force was mustered in the letter?

The exact wording isn't available for history since Julie — like many people who write the White House — neglected to keep a copy.

But, she remembers introducing herself as an honor student with great admiration for the British monarch and the Reagans, and saying she "would like to be part of this historic occasion." Since the queen seems to be

presented a bouquet of flowers whenever she appears in public, Julie suggested she would be more than happy to fill that role March 1.

Then she waited.

"I didn't want to get my hopes up. I was kind of guarded."

A few days later, she was summoned to the office of John Baren, vice principal at the school. "I thought, 'What have I done?'"

"They told me there was a phone call from the White House.

"They sat me down at a desk, all staring at me."

A man whose name she isn't certain of, but who identified himself as a special assistant to the president,

asked, "Did you write a letter to Shella Tate? It's one of the most interesting letters we've had in a long time."

The result of the conversation was the promise from the aide that "You've got yourself a deal."

He said she'd be provided details about dress, whether to curtsy and so on later. He didn't flatly say she'd present flowers to the queen, but Julie notes that's the only role she suggested in the letter.

While Julie — at this stage of tentative planning, at least — apparently will get to brush shoulders with the queen, she may not actually get to present her the flowers.

That usually is done by little girls, and right now the front-runner appears to be 9-year-old Shannon McGraw. Shannon is the daughter of Sandra McGraw, who in turn is the daughter of Dec MacGillivray, who in turn is the wife of former Santa Barbara mayor and Republican state assemblyman W. Don MacGillivray.

The MacGillivrays, in turn, are longtime friends with Mike Deaver, Reagan's deputy chief of staff — the

man and who controls access to the president and is deeply involved in planning the queen's visit. The MacGillivrays and Deaver go back to the days when all were in Sacramento together.

In addition, Mrs. MacGillivray helped set up the White House staff office here for presidential visits and works there when Reagan is at his nearby ranch. And she's involved in planning for the queen's visit.

She says that the latest word from the White House is that Shannon will present the flowers to the queen and Julie will give them to Prince Phillip. The ceremony probably will be held at the Courthouse where the formal welcome by local officialdom will take place.

Regardless of the exact outcome, Julie is overjoyed to be heading for the royal presence.

In her mind, she'll be queen for a day.

Meanwhile, preparations continue apace for the unprecedented visit, with some changes already made in the earlier, tentative schedule, according

to a variety of local people involved in the event.

Latest word is that the queen and prince will come ashore at the harbor from their yacht Britannia at 9:30 a.m. to be greeted by Reagan, who probably will fly by helicopter to the Yacht Club parking lot from his ranch. The harbor ceremony is expected to last just a few minutes, informed sources reported.

The queen then will be driven to the Courthouse for the official local greeting and a mini-Fiesta performance and possible walk to shake hands with local residents.

Earlier, the word was that she would then go to the Mission before driving on to Reagan's ranch for a barbecue lunch and horseback ride. Now, however, Board of Supervisors Chairman Robert Kallman says the Mission visit will be in the afternoon on her way back from the ranch.

While she's at the ranch, the 250 or so crew members of the yacht may be allowed to come ashore, and there is

talk of entertaining them at the Yacht Club.

The State Department will open an office here next month to coordinate the visit and to handle credentials for the army of press expected.

(When the queen visits Yosemite National Park the following weekend, about 220 rooms have been set aside for her and her small staff and the press contingent.)

There is no indication yet of any protests to the visit by local residents. However, Irish-American activist John Maher in San Francisco told reporters he will lead a string of noisy but non-violent demonstrations during the 10-day trip. He promised "demonstrations wherever the queen touches the ground throughout California."

White House aide William Sittman said the queen will ride in bulletproof cars and "the security arrangements will be gigantic."

A security advance team is to visit Santa Barbara next Saturday.

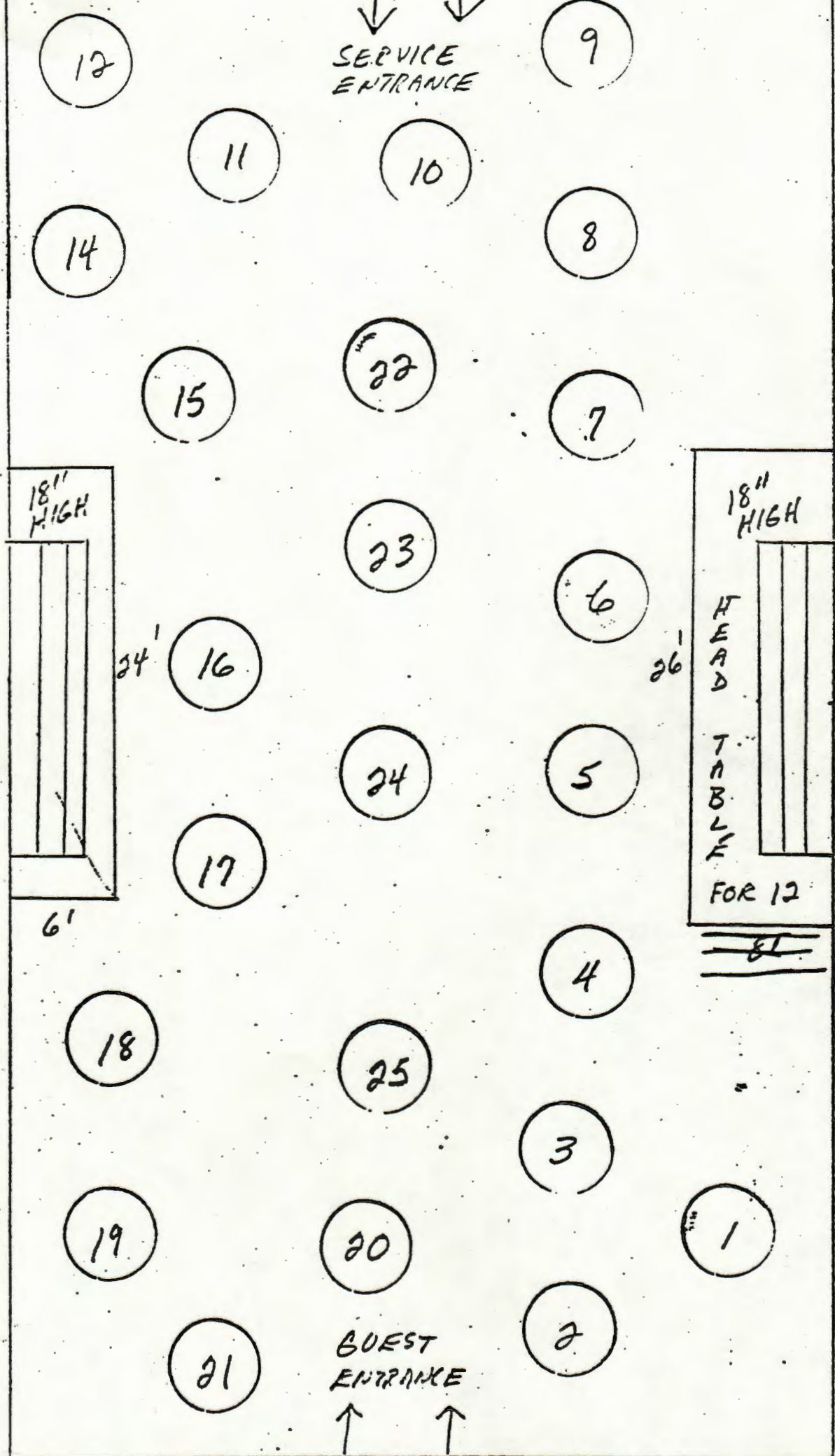

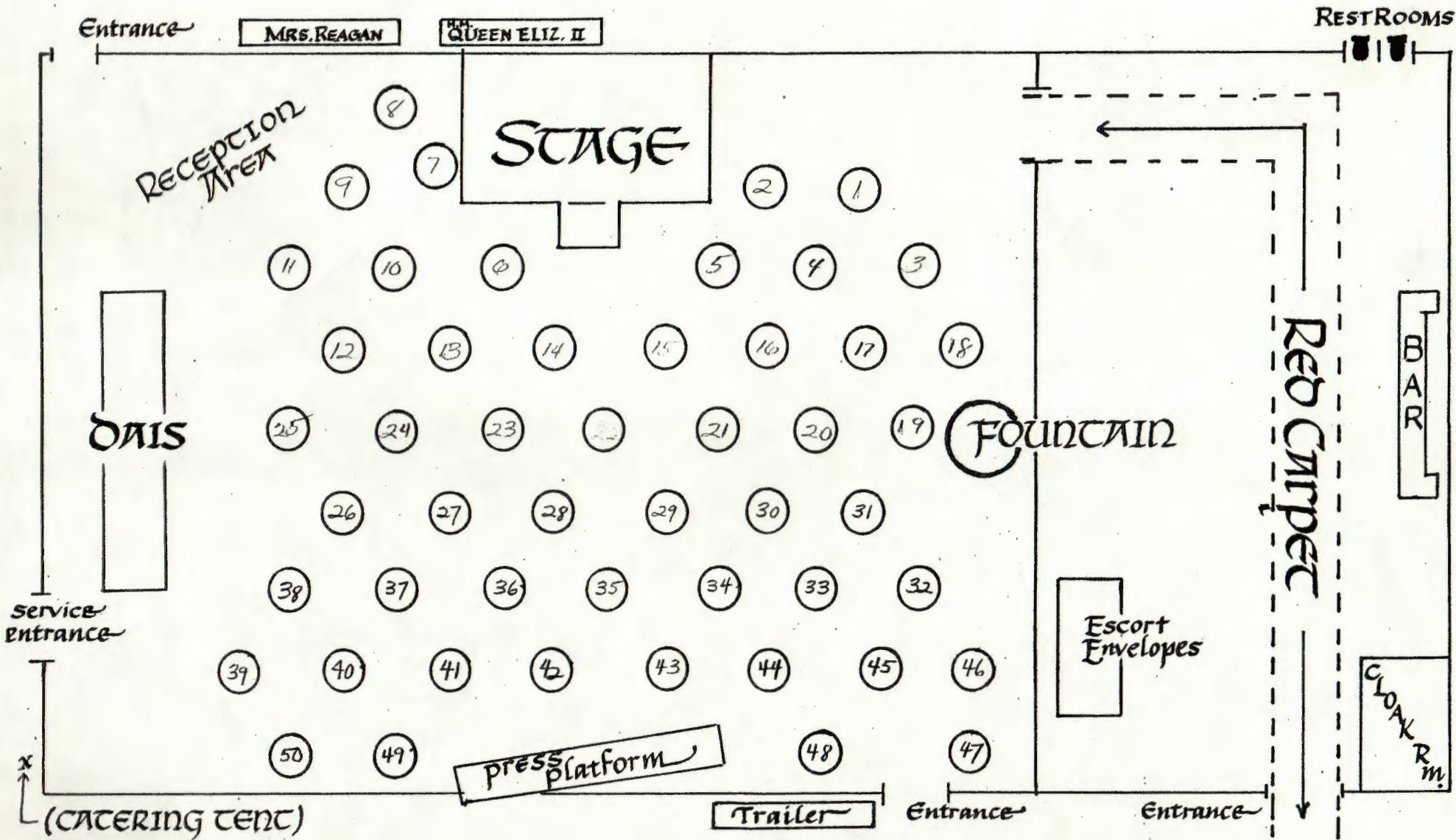

"Inside Reports/A Regal Fiasco" -- By Evans And Novak

Republican politicians are concerned that plans for President Reagan to spend a full week in California accompanying Queen Elizabeth II on her Western visit (Feb. 26-March 7) will reopen complaints of a regal Presidency carried on amidst lingering hard economic times.

In contrast, George Deukmejian, the newly-elected governor of California, has refused to attend any more than two events on the British monarch's tour -- one in San Diego and the other in Sacramento -- despite strong urging to the contrary. But Michael Deaver, Deputy WH Chief of Staff who has spent lots of time in California advancing the Royal visit, has refused suggestions that the President follow the Governor's example.

A footnote: The WH was stunned when it saw the guest list for the Queen's dinner in San Francisco and found a profusion of supporters for Democratic Mayor Feinstein to the exclusion of Republican faithful. Surprisingly, the Reagan aide who went to the mat to change things was National Security Adviser William Clark.

The remaining topics of the article dealt with:

- 1) Bloopers by Senator Glenn.
- 2) The prospect that Democrats could gain control of the Senate because of Sen. Baker's retirement and the possible retirement of Sen. Hatfield
- 3) GOP politicians are furious that the WH did not talk a big-gun into running for Sen. Baker's vacant seat.
- 4) Due to a photo request by Ed Harper's secretary, it is rumored he will leave the WH sometime in mid-1983.
