Dear Mr. President:

I am writing to you on behalf of Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #3866 in Thousand Daks, California. We are deeply concerned about the fate of the 2,500 servicemen still unaccounted for and missing in action in Southeast Asia. Our Post has been very active with regards to making the public aware of our POW/MIA's, and has sponsored ceremonies such as "A DAY TO REMEMBER", held on April 9, 1983, and also a POW/MIA float in Conejo Valley Days parade, which was awarded the second place prize.

During the fair we had a public awareness booth, at which time we collected the signatures of over 4,000 residents who share our concern regarding our POW/MIAs. At the ceremonies on April 9, we collected over 200 signatures, which were delivered to your office by Congresswoman Bobbi Fiedler.

On June 5, 1983 a contingency from our Post will be going to Washington for seven days to stand vigil at the Vietnam Memorial. It is our sincere hope that at sometime during that week we could deliver those signed petitions to you. I am enclosing a blank petition for your preview.

For your information, I would like to give you some background on Post 3866. In December, 1982 the Post consisted of about 41 members and the Post was slowly dying out. Several of the members rekindled the dying embers by reminding the members of the POW/MIA's. Though the Post's efforts to make the public aware other veterans began to join and participate in our activities. Today we are on the verge of increasing out Post by 300% and will likely go over that mark before the membership drive ends in May.
