- **Shirin Tahir-Kheli**, Director of Near East and South Asian Affairs, National Security Council. Washington, DC. Tahir-Kheli will examine how a relative stability has been achieved between India and Pakistan and how it may be maintained following the Soviet departure from Afghanistan; and

- **Goshu Wolde**, former Foreign Minister of Ethiopia, currently living in Pennsylvania. Wolde will study possible regional efforts to reduce conflicts and increase cooperation in the Horn of Africa.

Finally, you are quite right with respect to our soldiers and their commanders. Not only would I not want to compete with these guys as Brigade Commanders, the Company Commanders scare me to death! I never even came close to them.

The Senate and the House of Representatives of the United States Congress have passed a Joint Resolution which establishes again a German-American Day to be celebrated on October 6, 1988, and to be officially proclaimed by the President of the United States of America. We appreciate very much your personal involvement in last year's White House ceremony.

I would like to inform you about the ongoing considerations how the German-American Day could be celebrated in Washigton.

The Congressional Study Group on Germany (Chairman Rep. Lee H. Hamilton) intends to address a letter to the President proposing that the said presidential proclamation be signed on October 6, 1988 in the White House in the presence of German and American parliamentarians. The reception will take place in the Caucus Room of the Cannon Building of the U.S. Congress. Ambassador Ruhfus will be giving a reception in the evening of the same day. Besides that, thanks to the initiative of the many German-American groups all over the United States festivities and celebrations will be organized throughout the country. Many Governors and Mayors are expected to issue proclamations on the occasion of German-American day 1988.

In his proclamation in 1987 President Reagan mentioned that few people have blended so completely in the multi-cultural tapestry of American society and yet have made such singular economic, political, social, scientific and cultural contributions to the growth and success of the United States as have Americans of German extraction.

I am very pleased that again in 1988 the Joint Resolution of Senate and House offers the opportunity to celebrate German-American partnership.

I would be delighted to keep you informed about the ongoing planning for the celebrations of the German-American Day 1988.



INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

The renewal of the President's Science and Technology Initiative (STI) with India is in serious jeopardy because of the Department of State's continued efforts to reject a unanimous policy decision the sub-Cabinet Trade Policy Review Group (TPRG) reached in July on intellectual property rights (IPR) protection and allocation in U.S.-India science and technology cooperation. In addition, I am deeply concerned about the repeated attempts of certain bureaus in the Department of State to evoke narrow, parochial interests to challenge long-standing Presidential initiatives and Administration policies, in this particular instance, those pertaining to intellectual property.

During the past year, appropriate sub-Cabinet fora have thoroughly discussed and reviewed the U.S. technical proposals for the next phase of the STI, and the difficult question of how to manage intellectual property rights in the renewal of the STI as well as in all our other extensive science and technology programs with India. The scientific, economic, and foreign policy interests of the United States have been carefully considered and weighed in developing these U.S. policy positions. In each step of this interagency process, the Department of State has fully participated and concurred.

In July, the TPRG, established by statute and reporting to the President's Economic Policy Council, addressed the IPR question, as they have addressed all other intellectual property issues in this Administration. The TPRG reached a unanimous decision on a U.S. position that is sensitive to the foreign policy
