George Shultz was prompted initially by an earlier prof suggesting we get the Secretary to take the lead.

I think State is already moving in that direction at speed. Mort Abramowitz wrote Judge Webster last week asking that CIA develop a brief quickly. Because of the seriousness we attached to the situation, Mort argued that we should be prepared to share with the Soviets the imagery--or at least show it to them.

think the argument fairly represents States sentiment but I know that elsewhere there are serious reservations to using the crown jewels with the Soviets. Ric h

Armitage is not prepared to go that far and I know others in the Intelligence Community do not think we should court another compromise of sensitive collection methodology.

All along, our view has been that the briefing should be kept in the forefront, not the methodology of the briefing. I think our case can be made strongly wit h

line drawings, artist renditions, or what have you--the Soviets have their own capabilities to verify this if they haven't already. The important point is that we should not get bogged down arguing over the use of imagery; we won't ge

a brief out of the bureaucracy until June if we start haggling. I suggest we tell both CIA and State to go ahead with a briefing package that does not rely on showing imagery.

I think we can finesse the question of US intentions by avoiding any specific discussions and rather imply the seriousness by stating that we treat this with the same concern that we did the La Belle disco bombing.

Sorry for the delay on this. These 21st century machines continue to defeat my 19th century skills.





If/when it is, Fritz believes information inevitably will filter back to Western sources, perhaps precisely at the time that GPS is engaged with Shevy and the CW Conf. in Paris -- compounding the problem already faced vis-a-vis the Libyans and setting the stage for a very ugly situation considering Gorbachev's professed interest in control of CW and the high priority being accorded this by the incoming Administration. Fritz' point was merely to make sure that this was on your mind, and very careful consideration being given to how the USG shd handle whether pre- or post-attack.

Want to raise with GPS when you meet with him. I am copying Sandy Charles on this note: she has been in touch with State through the day on other developments concerning Afghanistan, all of which seem to contraindicate the sort of move that Fritz is concerned about. Sandy will be providing more info to put this into a larger perspective, including INR's thinking and that of Armacost's office.



I am concerned that there is some misunderstanding over the nature of an agreement General Powell may have reached with General Lindsay on bringing an officer on board to run LIC full time. An Army officer told a joint LIC conference this week that he would be coming to the NSC to manage the Board for LIC and that the assignment was the result of a deal between Generals Powell and Lindsay. This does not match up with our understanding of General Powell's guidance on moving the LIC structure through the transition period.

Don Snider and I checked with the Chief of Staff of the Army's office. The Chief understands that Gen's Lindsay and Powell discussed the issue, and intends to support whatever agreement was made by selecting and nominating an Army officer whenever the agreement calls for that to be done.

I recommend that you pass the above on to General Powell. If appropriate, we need to know the nature of his agreement with General Lindsay so that we can inform the LIC community and the Chief's office.
