
SUBJECT: Events and Opportunities for Remainder of the Term

## Major Issues/Opportunities for Advancing Our Objectives

- -- Contra battle in the Congress, for which we need comprehensive Central America strategy (Shultz trip, diplomatic track)

SUBJECT: Strategy for Rest of Term

Here is a quick list of items for your consideration:

- Burdensharing: Presidential involvement will mostly entail fighting off punitive amendments. Next DPC (Carlucci attends) is first week of December, 1988. Issue of 401st TFW perhaps most pressing issue.


- Defense Force Building: JCS are tentatively scheduled to meet with President during the first week of August to go over the restructured defense budget and the strategy that guided its formulation.

- Space: Return the Shuttle to safe, reliable operation (launch scheduled for Sep 6; may be delayed). Sign the intergovernmental agreement with friends and allies (Rose Garden ceremony) governing the development and operation of the Space Station (tentatively planned for late Sep 88).

- Telecommunications: Meet with President's National Security Telecommunications Advisory Committee (NSTAC) on Sep 22 to receive report from key industry executives on ways to further improve the survivability and endurability of the nation's commercial telephone networks.

- Budget: Complete actions on the FY89 Defense Budget (Authorization Bill expected from Congress sometime this week -- contains some objectionable features). Appropriations Bill has passed the House (June 21); conference schedule uncertain. Gramm-Rudman review with Presidential notification to Congress approx early September on possible sequester action.

July: Hungarian visit (Grosz) -- chance to demonstrate we support reform and liberalization in Eastern Europe.

Meeting with <u>Franz Josef Strauss</u> -- opportunity to strike a blow for US leadership in Europe. Prove US trustworthy. Dampen down "detente" atmosphere.

<u>August:</u> <u>Cyprus</u>. Visit of new President chance for Administration to get behind negotiations. Counter <u>Dukakis</u>. Support initiative sponsored by UN.

Push for conclusion of negotiations, with <u>Spain and</u> <u>Greece</u>, so that Administration can leave office with <u>Mediterranean</u> base structure in tact.

September: UN speech and meetings in New York. Recommit US to work within boundaries of UN. Defuse Soviet UN strategy. Pledge to pay money we owe and thus retain our vote and influence.

Meeting with <u>Soviet Foreign Minister Shevardnadze</u>. Push for conclusion of START. Control of missile proliferation. Human Rights agenda. Carry out strategy for conventional arms reduction negotiations.

Meeting with <u>Mitterrand</u>. Push theme of European pillar, European unity. Burden-sharing. Coordinate Western policy toward Soviets (who Mitterrand will see in fall) and Eastern Europe.

October-November (probability): Opening of conventional stability talks in Vienna. Chance to nail down Western objectives.

Meetings with <u>Mrs. Thatcher</u> and <u>Chancellor Kohl</u>. Chance to cement ties with key NATO Allies.

NATO Ministerial. Agree on arms control strategy and priorities into 1990 (Paragraph 8 exercise).

Subject: Strategy for Rest of the Term

Here's my quick look at strategies for the rest of the Administration's time. See no particular decisions, although there will be some that relate to the events and opportunities that unfold. EVENTS:

--Cambodia: Jakarta Meeting, July 25; Vietnamese withdrawal, if it occurs; Sihanouk maneuvers, including possible Washington visit.

--Korea: Olympics, Sept 17-Oct 2. President Roh may visit UNGA later in October, possible Washington stopover may be requested if he comes.

--Philippine Base Review: Progress slow thus far, but some decision likely for interim '90-'91 arrangements by Aug 15.

--Trade Bill: If Congress passes "new" trade bill and President signs; Asian countries will see the bill as still protectionist. Some damage limit work will be necessary.

--Marcos Indictment: Possibe decision within next month or so. --Prime Minister Prem (Thailand) July 28 elections may return

him; also a possible October Washington caller.

--Emperor Hirohito: No predictions, but CIA still holds that Emperorwon't survive 1988. Major event at death plus 30 days. DIPLOMATIC OPPORTUNITIES:

--Cambodia: Issue will stay acive.

--Korea: Possible initiatives with North orchestrated with ROK.

--POW-MIA: Vietnam signalling progress throughout fall; will want to take advantage, and build momentum for transition on this.

--Economic work with NIES: Some new consultation may be necessary with these more important new economies, if only to not concede leadership role to Japan.

--Ballistic Missile Controls: Will work on China, but wider effort toward other proliferators necessary.

--Setting the legacy of a successful Asia/Pacific policy. Possible Presid- ential talk; papers and briefs for transition are a part of this.

Peter, here is the best thoughts from my group as of COB on Monday.

INF: We are now in the implementation process. We would not expect anything that involves the President during the remainder of the term on this.

START: There are a few events that can be considered:

- Shevardnadze visit in September (associated with openning of UNGA).
- 2. USG tabling of the last elements of its START position in Geneva no earlier than LATE October. (87

DEFENSE & SPACE: Similar events and timing as START. (U)

ABM TREATY REVIEW: 5-year review must begin before 2 October. (U)

NUCLEAR TESTING:

- US Joint Verificantion Experiment explosion in Nevada on 17 August.
- 2. Soviet JVE explosion in USSR on 9 September.
- 3. We may be able to conclude and sign TTBT & PNET by 1 November.
- 4. Submit TTBT & PNET to Congress in January for ratification.

NUCLEAR RISK REDUCTION:

 1. 1st anniversary of signing of NRRC agreement on 15 September. (U)

A July 8 NSC-only meeting agreed that the Administration should give global missile proliferation a high priority in the next six months. Because proliferation encompasses such diverse areas as missiles, nuclear weapons, biological and chemical warfare, the consensus was to focus our attention in the remaining time of this Administration on building on the Soviet's interest expressed during the Summit to exchange exper ts' views on missile proliferation, and, in our view, the missile technology control regime. We are currently pursuing bilaterals with our missile tech partners to enlist their support for our Soviet initiative. In addition to to our approach to the Soviet Union, the consensus was to expand the effort to the PRC as well, but to do it multilaterally. To now, only the US has expressed concern with Chinese missile sales in the Middle East. Achieving cooperation in the prevention of missile proliferation from the Soviet Union and China in the next six months will ensure the successful culmination of this Administration's commitment to the broader area of arms control.


Funding, the President will have to determine whether UN reforms justify releasing \$44 million in FY-88 funds being withheld under Kassebaum-Solomon restrictions pending UN reforms. The crux may be timing: Whether, as UN and USUN argue, determination can be made now to avoid politically damaging special UNGA session; or, as State argues, it must wait until after a September CPC (budget) meeting acts to meet Congressional concerns.

UNGA: the President's sixth and last visit to the UNGA September 26 (4 27th7) should be a major event combining substantive and ceremonial events.

Other issues which involve the UN: Persian Gulf, Afghanistan, Angola-Namibia, Cambodia.

SUBJECT: Possible Topics for Action in East-West Technology Transfer Policy

No NSDD on technology transfer policy was ever put out by this Administration. Parts of the overall policy exist in the NSDDs on the Soviet Union, China, Eastern Europe. Major areas of the policy have never flowed from White House direction: COCOM, third country initiative (strategic trade controls in key non-COCOM countries), technology control lists, export licensing, and dispute resolution.

A broad policy directions NSDD was attempted in 1983. A government operations NSDD was attempted in 1987. Neither ever made it to completion because of the unresolved disputes among the agencies.

I do not believe a broad policy directions NSDD would be wise now. However, a series of directives or one large directive dealing with government operations issues could still be beneficial.

The topics that need coverage now are:

- a) dispute resolution in export cases
  - best done as an executive order in my view
  - principles and procedures have already been worked out in the 1987 NSDD effort
- b) full automation of export licensing process
  - need to set goals, target dates, interagency requirements, determine what kind of system will ultimately emerge
- c) COCOM policy and practices
  - forward goals needed here
  - time to reexamine "no exceptions" policy to Soviets coming soon
  - also need to focus on the consequences for COCOM of the 1992 decision in the EC

d) formulation of export control lists

- this process needs serious reform
  - DOD thoroughly dominates now. Overkill results with attendant loss of political support in Congress, allied capitals, business community.
  - Need a way to prune out dead wood and to get hard decisions to senior levels of government.
  - Numerous reform ideas around: CIA, Bucy Report, Sam Nunn, earlier NSDDs. They never come to fruition.
- e) Third Country Initiative
  - Needs to be codified and systematized. Forward goals need to be set for all non-COCOM countries.
  - Major policy successes could be lost without some continuity between this and the next Administration.

Other topics of lesser magnitude can be brought forward later if this overall approach has any interest.

SUBJECT: Possible Presidential Activities Related to Africa through November, 1988

The following areas of activity in U.S./Africa relations might lend themselves to presidential involvement between now and the end of November, 1988.

### Angola/Namibia Negotiations

Assuming these talks continue to move forward at a brisk pace, we might see something of presidential significance by the end of September. In the event of such a success, the President may wish to have a White House event which could reflect his longstanding support for the negotiating process and for the U.S. commitment to a just solution. In the event serious glitches arise, we may wish to call upon the President to use his influence with one or more of the leaders involved. This might be done during his visit to the UNGA. We will probably have a better idea of the potential here after the next two rounds of talks in August.

## Visit of the OAU President

President Mousa Traore of Mali was elected president of the Organization of African Unity in May at the annual summit conference. He will be visiting the U.S. in October for the UNGA and to receive an honorary degree in the Midwest. I have already recommended an official working visit, and have volunteered him for a state visit in the event a higher priority chief of state is not available. I believe such an event in October would enable the White House and George Bush to exercise additional outreach to the black community. The President would also be able to use the forum to stress national reconciliation in Angola and to give a boost to his hunger initiative. (One black friend of mine from the business community told me that an OAU state dinner in October would have a tremendous impact domestically.)

## UNGA

The President's UNGA visit could be centered on the theme of "peace through negotiations," with Angola as just one of several, including Afghanistan, Kampuchea, Mozambique/South Africa, Sudan, etc. I believe this would go over well with the Africans in general. -ULVIIL-



#### Strategy Meeting July 21, 1988 -- Santa Barbara SUBJECT:

On Thursday, July 21, 1988 at 9:00 a.m., a Stragegy Meeting will be conducted in Santa Barbara for certain senior White House staff (see attached agenda/participants paper).

#### PURPOSE:

The purpose of this meeting is to define the overall goals and objectives for the duration of this administration . . . a game plan. The plan will develop realistic measurable objectives that can be achieved.

## DISCUSSION:

The meeting will be divided into three subsets: (A) Wirthlin Presentation -- that will inform all participants of the need for such a plan and the requirement for goals and objectives on many fronts. The Wirthlin brief will address general themes that require development. (B) <u>Presentations by Principal</u> Assistants to the President -- identifying the "hot buttons" in their respective jurisdictions and a general overview of expected major developments within their areas of responsibility; and (C) A Discussion/Debate Phase to attempt to marry the themes outlined by Wirthlin to a specific course of action supported by the information afforded in the briefings.

Clearly our number one objective must be the election of George Bush as President. But, on a par, our objective must be keeping RR a major factor in dealings with the Congress, in foreign policy, in Federal/state elections, etc. Other important goals are: maintaining/sustaining the budget agreement, progress in arms control and improvements on the domestic agenda (i.e., drug initiatives, the fight against AIDS, and education improvements).

## ACTION:

You are requested to prepare a <u>30</u> minute briefing for the Stragegy Meeting that will present the major issues within your jurisdiction that will impact on the development of the plan. Please provide an outline of your presentation to the Chief of Staff by the close of business July 19th.
