

I introduced House Concurrent Resolution 260, and I am pleased to say that it won the bipartisan support of 239 of my colleagues who cosponsored this bill.

Particularly in the age of glasnost and perestroika, when the Soviet Union has decided to reexamine past events and to clarify and correct its erroneous interpretation of certain aspects of Soviet history, the brutality of the Soviet invasion of Afghanistan cannot be consigned to the dim recesses of history. It is vital that the memory of this event be one that is true to the reality of the invasion and the subsequent occupation, a reality which the 'Soviets tried to keep within the borders of Afghanistan. The very fact of this attempt to supress international awareness of actions inside Afghanistan must also become part of the memory of Afghanistan during the last nine years. In order that this may be accomplished, I urge President Reagan to grant the stated desire of the House of Representatives and to award the Presidential Medal of Freedom to these three very deserving men.
