INITIATIVE

Science and technology cooperation is a crucial element in our bilateral relations with India, and the US-India Presidential Science and Technology Initiative (STI) launched by President Reagan and Prime Minister Indira Gandhi in 1982, exemplifies a successful partnership.

Pursuant to President Reagan and Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi's decision last fall to renew the STI for another three years, I plan to travel to India in September to conclude the official renewal and to hold discussions with my Indian counterparts on issues of importance to our expanding science and technology relationship. While in India, I will be visiting a number of research centers to witness first-hand the work of Indian scientists and the progress of collaborative projects under the STI.

I am writing to request that you make Ms. Shirin Tahir-Kheli available to represent the National Security Council on the U.S. delegation. Ms. Tahir-Kheli was instrumental in the decision to renew this initiative, and she played a catalytic role in resolving the monsoon-data impasse, the thorniest problem the STI has encountered. Ms. Tahir-Kheli's participation would underscore to the Indian government the strong U.S. commitment to this program and our expectation that they will reciprocate to ensure the success of the next phase.

The delegation will be in India the week of September 19. Travel and in-country per diem costs will be provided through rupee funds made available for the STI.

I thank you in advance for your support of this effort, and ask that you contact Ms. Deborah Wince, Assistant Director for International Affairs, at 395-7268 as soon as possible about the availability of Ms. Tahir-Kheli.

Issue

Whether to sign the attached letter to President Ershad.

Fact

The letter conveys sympathy and concern for the flood situation and pledges U.S. help.

Discussion

The current floods in Bangladesh have devastated the economy, causing \$1 billion worth of damage and displacing 28 million people. Early U.S. assistance will help the GOB obtain aid from other potential donors. AID will be announcing a relief package on September 9 of \$50-70 million in reprogrammed funds to expedite food deliveries. We are looking at other measures, including a vaccination program against cholera and typhoid, water purification efforts, and provision of helicopters for delivery of food to areas where the roads have been washed away.

Jay Morris, Deputy Administrator of AID, is leaving for Bangladesh on September 9, 1988, and will carry your letter to President Ershad.

As you know, I have been awarded a fellowship starting in January 1989 and plan to leave the NSC prior to my going over to the U.S. Institute for Peace. With NSC approval, I have taught a course on the Persian Gulf at the Johns Hopkins School for Advanced International Studies (SAIS). I have been approached with the possibility (though somewhat distant) of becoming a part of a study program at SAIS following the completion of my fellowship next year.

Saudi funding -- which has been traditional at SAIS -- is one aspect of the proposal. Therefore, in order to avoid any real or even the appearance of a conflict of interest, I would like to recuse myself from matters dealing with Saudi Arabia. Since I do not handle Saudi Arabian affairs in the course of my work at the NSC, I do not believe that the action would impinge on my effectiveness while at the NSC.
