#### SIGNIFICANT ACTIVITIES

- VFW Voice of Democracy student winners meeting with the President in the State Dining Room.

#### RED FLAGS

- Reports from supporters in the evangelical community indicate that leaders of old line protestant denominations are having a meeting to plan a joint strategy for the religious leaders meeting with the President on April 13. This meeting for national religious organization leaders is well planned and includes a preponderance of supporters of the President.
  - Conservative movement leaders, in a cordial meeting with Secretary Lewis, warned that surfacing any proposal this year to raise gasoline taxes would be politically disastrous, undercutting the President's successes in cutting taxes and reducing gasoline prices.
- Real outrage in protestant fundamental community over Administration's decision not to grant visa to Ian Paisley, Member of British Parliament and Parliament of Europe. Paisley, who has spoken annually at Bob Jones University for 20 years was refused entry into the U.S. for a religious meeting April 3 at Bob Jones University.

#### MISCELLANEOUS

- Conservative movement's alternative budget to be unveiled next week and pushed by radio commercials funded by Terry Dolan, NCPAC.
- New Right and conservative religious communities pleased but skeptical at indications that Administration may soon move forcefully on behalf of voluntary school prayer.
- Virtually all grass roots groups supporting the President are encouraged at indications that Administration is about to put its weight behind a balanced budget - tax limitation amendment.
