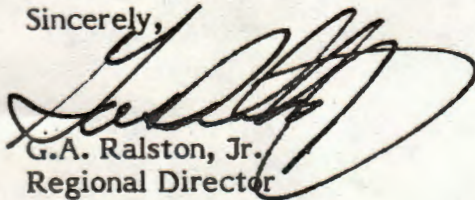

Dear Mr. President,

You said in response to Jimmy Carter, "There you go again", I say to the Chicago office of the United States Attorney, "There you go again". United States District Judge Nicholas Bua said in the United States of America vs. Nick Keller, No. 79 CR 673 on February 19, 1980, "I am sure that Ronald Reagan would like to "bleep out" a couple of phrases or so of remarks that he made toward Ethnic groups. But, unfortunately, it is just not possible." I do not want to "bleep out" the remarks I make, or regret making them, therefore, I direct them to you, the President of the United States.

To insure that the contents of this letter reach you, I am directing copies to your "Big Four", plus Senator Howard Baker, Senator Strom Thurmond, Senator Charles Percy, Representative Robert McClory, Attorney General William French Smith, and fifteen prominent Republicans such as William Graham, Chairman of the Board of Baxter Laboratories and Robert Stuart, Chairman of the Board of Quaker Oats. I am following this course of action because I believe that if the "Big Four" fail to bring this letter to your attention, "someone will". If this letter is not brought to your attention and an inquiry not undertaken into the substance of my complaints, I will simultaneously release this, and other information I possess, to the Democratic Party and investigatory representatives of a network television program.

President Reagan, you are a good and decent man, if this letter reaches your attention, a cover-up or white-wash will not occur, justice will prevail. At the heart of what I ask is the question, "Does the end justify the means?" I seek an inquiry into the actions of the Chicago offices of the United States Attorney, and the FBI regarding the following which occurred primarily prior to 1981.

1. The United States Attorney and the FBI have exercised undue influence over a Northern District of Illinois Federal Judge by covering up for the activities of that Judge in his ALLEGED USE of drugs and his ALLEGED HOMOSEXUAL conduct with minor males. A former Assistant United States Attorney told me that he and the United States Attorney's office had knowledge of the referred to drug and homosexual activity.

2. The United States Attorney and FBI solicited and accepted the services of a man to surveil me and my family and come into my home who according to the man's own admission was under psychiatric care. This man's actions threatened my family and the man admitted that with fear of me, generated by the United States Attorney, he came into presence of my family at Carmel High School, Mundelein, Illinois, armed with a pistol. This man, while injecting himself into my defense effort, was communicating with Assistant United States Attorney Jeffrey Johnson to the detriment of my defense effort.

3. The FBI failed to verify statements which were untrue made by their chief witness because those statements served to help the United States Attorney indict and convict me. The United States Attorney later perjured this witness and I was found not guilty of the specific count involving him, but not before I was found guilty of conspiracy.

4. The Assistant United States Attorney Jeffrey Johnson has misrepresented facts in my case to the Regional Parole Commission.

5. I was solicited for a cash payment to insure the success of my Rule 35. I declined, and I have been denied twice on my Rule 35. This may have been an effort to "set me up".

6. The office of the United States Attorney directly and through their informant leaked information in my case to newspapers to my detriment with Judge Bua and in spite of his admonishment not to release that information.

I would be willing to take a lie detector test to verify my honesty to the above assertions, 1-6.

A meeting took place in Chicago in the Spring of 1978, among myself and three other participants. All participants were known to the FBI, which monitored this meeting, yet in the FBI account made available to my attorney, mention was made of only two participants. One participant not identified in that account informed me to his knowledge, as to the identity of a high ranking member of law enforcement who procured minor boys for the prior referred to Federal Judge. On a later date, this same man informed me that the man, who turned out to be the Government witness against me, was going to offer false testimony connecting me with Loansharking.

The man providing me with this information was later murdered, yet what he told me regarding false testimony eventually occurred in my trial, and in the man's Grand Jury testimony. Prior to my indictment when this witness was asked if he wanted to be wired, he refused. Wiring him would have established that he was lying about my involvement as would a Lie Detector test even today. The Special Agent in charge of this case stated that at one time he had between 40 to 50 agents working on this case. Yet when this witness said I was meeting him on a weekly basis for the purpose of collecting Extortionate payments, the FBI never bothered to surveil this man to determine if the witness was telling the truth. Instead the FBI went as far away as New York and Kentucky to wire another individual to attempt to record me in conversations of wrong doing. Hours of recorded conversation proved of no use to the Government, and in the face of the testimony of these two men, the jury found me innocent of Count 6, Extortion.

Without the lies and false testimony associated with Count 6, I may have never been indicted on Count 1, Conspiracy, or even found guilty. I admit that I knew a loansharking business existed although I maintain I was not a part of it, I protected people who were threatened. I would submit to a Lie Detector test to verify this.

My life has been marked forever by this experience. Now I ask that I be able to look forward to parole at the end of one-third of my sentence rather than the twenty-seven months established by the Parole Board. Assistant United States Attorney Jeffrey Johnson lied to the Parole Board regarding the facts in my case. I can prove this.

If I possess the same level of culpability according to the Government as my co-defendant, Frank Butera, which I did not, (the Government placed him on the top level and me on the third level and considered him by far more culpable) if I was identified with 125 loanshark accounts, which I was not, (he was identified with 125 and me with 3) if I committed violence, which I did not, (it was established he committed violence) if I was found guilty of Extortion, which I was not, (he plead guilty to two counts, one of Conspiracy and one of Extortion and I was found guilty of Conspiracy and not guilty of Extortion). Why, then can't I be sentenced like him to 12 months Work-Release, rather than three years imprisonment? I am a first time non-violent offender. Why does the Parole Board require me to serve more time in prison than approximately 90% of all men convicted of a similar offense. I am presently serving a three year sentence at FCI, Sandstone, Minnesota. I am a resident of Waukegan, Illinois, married with nine children, ages five through twenty-two. I am graduate of Marquette University, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, and served as an officer in the United States Army Corps of Engineers. I have been active in the Republican Party and was a Republican Candidate for the

Illinois Legislature in the now famous Orange Ballot State-Wide Election in 1964. I am 46 years old and have been a Stock Broker with a member of the New York Stock Exchange, and more recently a licensed Real Estate Broker in Illinois. My Illinois Real Estate Broker's License was revoked as a result of this conviction.

Prior to committing myself to the custody of the Attorney General, I determined by visiting appropriate agencies, that my family would qualify for welfare and food stamp assistance of over \$800.00 per month. We have never accepted assistance in our lives and thus far, have resisted making application even though we qualify. Instead, seven of our nine children and my wife are employed providing as best they can. My family is experiencing extreme financial hardship, therefore, I am grateful for the limited income my employment in FCI, Sandstone UNICOR provides. I have been working approximately 160 hours a month and as a Grade 3, I earn 60 cents per hour, most of which I send home to support my family. I have worked hard and I attained the highest performance rating of approximately 80 men employed in the UNICOR Glove Factory. Additionally, I am one of just several men who are active members of the Legion of Mary. What we, My children, my wife and myself, cannot understand is what is accomplished by imprisonment beyond 12 months when all I want to do is to return to my family and their support, since I am a non-violent, first time offender. And none of my family has ever been in trouble. Justice is certainly served with 12 months imprisonment. I have lost my license as a Real Estate Broker and must find new employment which I can do. The lost of my license further penalizes me while at the same time three of my co-defendants, being street people, have grown in stature among their contemporaries with their 6 months and 12 month Work-Release sentences.

The Judge demonstrated disparity in sentencing me. For guideline purposes in decision making, I have a Salient Factor Score of 10, (the highest and most favorable) my co-defendants all had lower scores. The primary target of the United States Attorney, James Inendino, a man perceived by the United States Attorney along with Frank Butera as by far the most culpable, were placed on the top level. Inendino and Butera were each identified by all Government witnesses and it was established that they worked with 125 loanshark accounts. I was identified by only one alleged victim and on that account alleging Extortion, I was found not guilty. They each pleaded guilty to one count of Conspiracy and one count of Extortion. The Judge sentenced Inendino to 5 years imprisonment and Butera to 12 months Work-Release and 4 years probation.

The United States Attorney placed unknown parties on the second level and on the third level placed James Inendino's brother, Sam Inendino and myself. Sam Inendino pleaded guilty

to Conspiracy, the count I was found guilty of. The jury acquitted me of the Extortion count in a two week trial. Sam Inendino was sentenced to six (6) months Work-Release and 4½ years probation. I was sentenced to three (3) years in prison. A fifth co-defendant, Emmett Paloian, pleaded guilty to Extortion and received six (6) months Work-Release and 4½ years probation. Paloian was placed on the fourth level with a sixth co-defendant who was acquitted of conspiracy. I sought a jury trial because I believed I was innocent of Extortion, Count 6, yet I did not know what my role would be perceived of by the jury relative to the Conspiracy count.

The United States Attorney through a ledgerbook, wiretaps, and expert testimony connected me to three (3) of 125 alleged accounts. All three (3) of whom were identified and only one of whom testified as the alleged victim on the count I was acquitted. The other two denied my involvement in loansharking in interviews with the FBI. The expert testified that there were thirty (30) names such as mine that appeared next to accounts in the ledger book. I admit to knowing that a loan-shark operation existed, but I had no knowledge of the extent of it. I intervened on behalf of two (2) accounts in the ledger book who were in trouble. Further, at the request of James Inendino and his attorney Julius Echeles, I attended two (2) earlier trials covering a period of four (4) weeks in which James Inendino was the defendant in the Spring of 1978, in Federal District Court. If I were a member of the Chicago Crime Syndicate, I say without any doubt, that they would have not permitted me in Federal Court observing Inendino's trial everyday for a period of one (1) month. I was James Inendino's friend, not a member of his loanshark conspiracy. If I were in the loan shark business, I certainly would have the ability to "supervise" more than three (3) accounts.

While I accept my guilt, as determined by the jury, and I am remorseful for it, I do not believe that I would have been found guilty of Conspiracy if it had not been for the lies associated with the Extortion, Count 6, a count that I was acquitted. Needless to say, my life and the lives of my wife and children have been a nightmare. If I only had to confront the truth, I would not complain, but the United States Attorney misrepresented facts to the Parole Board and then on February 10, 1982, when I attempt to correct the error upon which my guidelines are based, the Board tells me they don't want to retry my case. I don't want to either, but I am in a real "Catch 22" situation. I want to be treated just fairly, why the disparity? Why do I have to say, "There you go again," to Assistant United States Attorney Jeffrey Johnson. Maybe it was for the will of God that Kansas City gave me guidelines of 24-36 months, (which I maintain are in error) and the Parole Board told me to continue to expiration, (27 plus months, allowing for statutory Good Time) based in part on the misrepresentation of Mr. Johnson. For, if that had not occurred, I would not be writing this letter and if abuses exist, they

would be longer in being corrected. If there is substance to my allegations, then my rights as a defendant have been abused as well as the integrity of the court. I am not trying to reargue my case, I ask to be judged by the truth and not misrepresentations by Mr. Johnson or less than honest investigation by the FBI.

Today, in many ways, the world is judging the very will and conscience of a people and nation, we must remember that, "The End Does Not Justify The Means".

Please, Mr. President, inquire into this matter.

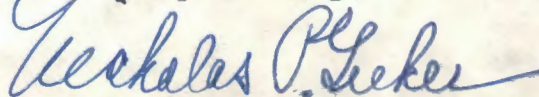

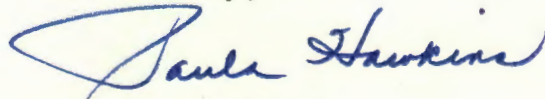

Dear Ron:

This is in further reply to your letter of August 17 to the President commending the establishment of a Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee for the Virgin Islands, but expressing concern that the Committee has not yet developed a Federal law enforcement plan, and urging the selection and appointment of a United States Attorney for the Virgin Islands on an emergency basis. Your concerns and suggestions have been reviewed with the Attorney General and his staff, and you may be assured that the Department of Justice is equally concerned that the United States Virgin Islands community receives the best possible law enforcement.

The Director of the Executive Office for United States Attorneys and members of his staff, have discussed the Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee of the Virgin Islands with Mr. Hugh P. Mabe, III, interim United States Attorney, and has asked him to reconvene the Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee and its subcommittees at the earliest opportunity. In order to ensure that the United States Attorney's Office functions at full strength during this interim period, the Executive Office for United States Attorneys has extended the appointment of a senior Assistant United States Attorney from the District of Columbia to serve as a Special Assistant United States Attorney in the Virgin Islands. An additional Special Assistant United States Attorney position has been authorized on an interim basis. Additionally, the Executive Office for United States Attorneys corresponded with Mr. Donald M. Bouton, former Attorney General for the United States Virgin Islands concerning the appointment of Assistant Attorneys General of the Virgin Islands to be Special Assistant United States Attorneys to assist in the prosecution of cases in United States District Court. Mr. Bouton was requested to contact the United States Attorney directly to work out the specifics of such appointments.

You may be assured that the Attorney General is giving serious attention to the process of selecting a United States Attorney for the Virgin Islands and will recommend the appointment of a well-qualified person to serve as United States Attorney for the Virgin Islands as soon as possible.

Thank you again for your expression of concern.

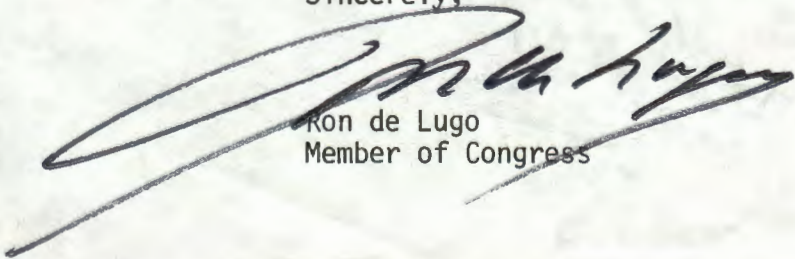
Over the past several months, your Administration has assisted our local law enforcement in several ways, particularly with training courses, in an united effort to combat the wave of violent crime and drug trafficking sweeping our islands. One of the most potentially effective assistance measures offered by the Department of Justice was the establishment of a Law Enforcement Coordinating Committee for the U.S. Virgin Islands. As you know, one of the recommendations in the report of the Attorney General's Task Force on Crime called for the establishment of such committees under the direction of each district's U.S. Attorney.

I was grateful that the Justice Department consented to the establishment of a Coordinating Committee in the U.S. Virgin Islands in March, even before your candidate for U.S. Attorney was designated. This decision had a positive effect on our community and gave added impetus to the development of active, cooperative approaches for dealing with crime. Not coincidentally, the violent crime rate dropped.

However, to date, our Coordinating Committee has held only an organizational meeting, and has not yet developed a federal law enforcement plan. Again, perhaps not coincidentally, the crime rate has begun to increase.

Mr. President, the severity of this problem cannot be overstated. Crime remains the single greatest concern to our citizens and we are greatly distressed that the progress signaled by the establishment of the Coordinating Committee will be further eroded. I urge you and the Attorney General to take whatever steps are necessary to expedite the selection and appointment of an U.S. Attorney for my community on an emergency basis. Your action on this matter will give us renewed hope that we can overcome the grave threat of serious crime in our community.
