URGENT

Statement on PanAm Hijack

The hijacking of a Pan American Airways jumbo jet at Pakistan's Karachi Airport yesterday morning was a cruel terrorist act. Our hearts are filled with sympathy for the families of those innocents killed or injured.

The Government of Pakistan acted boldly and decisively to bring this nightmare to an end. We applaud its exemplary resolve in doing so.

There is no crime more despicable and cowardly than to threaten the innocent passengers of a crowded airliner -- men and women, young and old -- with the weapons of modern war. Nothing can justify such barbarism. I can think of no punishment too severe for the criminals responsible. We will work closely with the Government of Pakistan to ensure that justice is done.

We thank God the crisis is now ended, with the safe deliverance of most of those who had to endure the ordeal inflicted on them and on all of civilized society. We express our condolences to the families of those killed, pray for the speedy recovery of those injured, and look to the safe and speedy reunion of all the passengers with their families and loved ones.
