We have received a troubling CIA assessment on the potential market for Soviet gas in European markets through use of only one strand of the Siberian pipeline and full use of existing infrastructure. This illustrates very clearly that unless we can get a commitment from the Europeans to limit their gas contracts to present levels, the Soviets will capture most of the market of the 1990s and drive out the competitive alternatives.

Attached (Tab I) are three visuals which tell the story.

Case I is the no Siberian gas case. The key here is that Dutch gas would have to be increased over the short term, but over the longer term, Norwegian and North African producers can meet This is the President's original alternative energy case.

Case II assumes that the first strand of the pipeline is completed but that there are no more gas contracts with the Soviet Union. As you can see, there is still room for alternatives, particularly Norwegian gas. Sufficient market is preserved to allow development of the giant Troll field.

Case III shows how big a chunk the Soviets can take out of the market with only one strand, if some limitation is not imposed on contracts. The results are dismaying. They can effectively block out all large scale alternatives. Only the Sleipner field in Norway is assumed to be developed. Troll is knocked out.


Bottom line: The Foreign Ministers communique is presently inadequate because it does not contain a statement to limit gas purchases over the longer term. If we do not get this commitment, then economic momentum will be on the side of the Soviets. They have all the advantages. We must even the scales. I think that the President must be made aware of this analytical evidence and the consequences of not pressing the Europeans now to limit their gas purchases over the longer term.








Case III - Soviet Domination

of 3 Market with Only One


Strand and Full Use of Existing

Maximum Utilization of Existing and Planned Soviet Pipelines






Case II -- Limitation of

- 3. TARASENKO MADE NO SUBSTANTIVE REPLY. HE SAID HE WOULD IMMEDIATELY PASS THE U. S. PROPOSAL TO HIS "EXPERTS", AND WOULD BE BACK TO US AS SOON AS POSSIBLE WITH COMMENTS.

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

- 4. JOYCE MET LATER IN THE DAY WITH OFFICIALS OF THE STATE COMMITTEE FOR UTILIZATION OF ATOMIC ENERGY TO PASS THEM A COPY OF THE U. S. PROPOSED SCHEDULE AND AGENDA. IN MOROZOV'S ABSENCE. M. N. RYZHOV OF SCAE'S FOREIGN RELATIONS DEPARTMENT ACCEPTED THE PROPOSAL AND SAID HE WOULD BRING IT TO MORDZOV'S ATTENTION ASAP,
- 5. COMMENT: WE NOTE WITH SOME CONCERN THAT THE LIST DE TOPICS IN OUR PROPOSAL HAS OMITTED ALL REGIONAL ISSUES. WE BELIEVE THE SOVIETS WILL FIND THIS ODD, AND MAY COMMENT ON IT.

6. EVEN IF THEY DO NOT, HOWEVER, WE WONDER WHAT THE RATIONALE WAS BEHIND THEIR OMISSION. IF THE DECISION WAS THAT THERE WAS LITTLE CHANCE OF USEFUL DISCUSSION ON THEM, WE DISAGREE. WE SEE THE FOLLOWING PROBABILITY. IN DESCENDING RANK ORDER, OF USEFUL DISCUSSIONS ON REGIONAL TOPICS:

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- KOREA: UNLESS THE DEPARTMENT HAS HAD FURTHER CONTACTS WITH THE SOVIETS ON THIS THAT WE KNOW NOTHING ABOUT, WE JUDGE THAT THE SOVIETS WOULD BE WILLING TO DISCUSS RECENT DEVELOPMENTS IN THE MORTHERN HALF OF THAT PENINSULA, AND SHARE AT - LEAST SOME INFORMATION WITH US.
- SOUTH AMERICAN THRESHOLD STATES: THEY HAVE COMMERCIAL/GRAIN SUPPLY INTERESTS TO PROTECT HERE, BUT STILL SHOULD BE WILLING TO DISCUSS THE SITUATION FAIRLY OBJECTIVELY. - SOUTH AFRICA: HERE THE SOVIETS ARE FAR TOO DEPENDENT ON WESTERN MEDIA FOR THEIR VIEWS ON WHAT WE ARE DOING OR NOT DOING IN THE NUCLEAR FIELD. THE USUAL MEDIA INACCURACIES ARE EXAGGERATED IN THEIR MINDS BECAUSE THEY ARE UNABLE TO INTERPRET THEM AGAINST A FULL UNDERSTANDING

OF COMMERCIAL AND POLITICAL LIFE IN THE WEST. A CLEAR AND FULL EXPLANATION OF OUR POLICY SHOULD DIMINISH THEIR CONCERN SOMEWHAT.

#### MECSAGE (CONTINUED):

- NDIA/PAKISTAN: THIS DISCUSSION COULD HARDLY AVOID LAPPING OVER INTO AFGHANISTAN, BUT WOULD BE USEFUL IF FOR NO OTHER REASON THAN TO SHOW THEM THAT THE SOVIET INVASION HAS FORCED US INTO A STANCE ON PAKISTAN WHICH REDUCES (THOUGH DOES NOT DO AWAY WITH ENTIRELY) OUR ABILITY TO DISCOURAGE PAKISTANI NUCLEAR AMBITIONS. - ISRAEL: GIVEN PRESENT HIGH EMOTIONS OVER THE MIDDLE EAST. WE WOULD EXPECT LITTLE OF NO BENEFIT ROM D SCUSU ONS HERE.
- 8. RE PARA 5 REFTEL, MIKE JOYCE LOOKS FORWARD TO PARTICIPATING IN THE DISCUSSIONS. HARTMAN
