SUBJECT: Public Information Campaign on Yellow Rain

As you requested, I have drafted a memo (TAB A) on how to encourage greater public interest in the Yellow Rain issue. Within the Pentagon, I have coordinated with Amoretta Hoeber, Tal Lindstrom, and Lee DeLorme (OSD/PA), as well as with my ISP colleagues. OSD/PA told me that, before the memo leaves the building, they would like to see a copy of it as approved by you. I coordinated informally also with Cary Lord and Sven Kraemer.

By the way, at the recommendation of Bill Shultz from

Readers Digest I spoke yesterday with Jane Hamilton-Merritt,
a writer who has published extensively on Yellow Rain. She
may be interested in doing another article on the subject and
asked if we could arrange an interview for her with the SecDef.
I said we would try to be helpful. I suggested that she may
want to write an article for TV Guide on why the networks have
given so little attention to the issue, or an article for another
publication on what Yellow Rain teaches us about arms control.
She promised to telephone me again in a few days.

Dr. Sharon Watson visited me today. She said she would gladly work with us in generating interest in the scientific community, as outlined in the attached memo.

Tom Simon, Soviet desk officer at State, telephoned me to convey several rumors of Brezhnev's death. In fact, he mentioned that our DCM in Moscow, Warren Zimmerman, called to report his conversation with Ed Stevens, a resident Moscow newsman (for 25 years) who has strong KGB connections. Stevens asserted that he had reports from five good sources that Brezhnev is dead. Both Secretary Shultz and CIA Director Casey have been informed of Zimmerman's call.

- 2. THE EXPECTED HAS FINALLY HAPPENED, ALTHOUGH THE PRACTICE OF THIS CLOSED SYSTEM DID NOT PERMIT THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF A LEADER'S DEATH UNTIL THEY WERE GOOD AND READY.
- 3. AT THE BIG RECEPTION THE OTHER DAY LEONID BREZHNEV APPEARED TO ME TO BE A MAN WHOSE COUNTRY WAS ASKING TOO MUCH OF HIM. MY BRITISH, FRENCH AND GERMAN COLLEAGUES DISAGREED WITH ME YESTERDAY WHEN I SAID THAT BREZHNEY COULD NOT POSSIBLY BE PART OF THE ACTIVE GOVERNANCE OF THIS COUNTRY. ONE OR TWO OF THEM THOUGHT HE LOOKED BETTER THAN LAST YEAR. WE SAW HIM, OF COURSE, AFTER HE HAD STOOD OVER TWO HOURS IN THE COLD WIND AND AFTER A WEEK OR MORE OF ACTIVITY. IN MY BRIEF EXCHANGE THERE WAS HARDLY A SPARK OF UNDERSTANDING. I THOUGHT GIVEN HIS SENTIMENTALITY THAT I WOULD RECALL AN EVENT HE PROBABLY TREASURES AND WHERE I WAS

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

PRESENT-VLADIVOSTOK. IT TOOK THREE TRIES BY ME, THE INTERPRETER, AND FINALLY GROMYKO TO GET THE ESSENCE THROUGH. THERE WAS SOME BRIGHTENING IN THE LOOK AND THEN THE SLIGHTLY CLOUDY BLUE EYES WENT BLANK ONCE AGAIN. THUS SIGHT. HEARING AND BREATHING WERE ALL SEEN TO BE IMPAIRED.

4. THE SENSE OF THE RECEPTION WAS CERTAINLY NOSTALGIC. BREZHNEV'S ASSISTANT ALEXANDROV LOOKED AS THOUGH THE WEIGHT OF THE WORLD WAS ON HIS SHOULDERS. HE SAID THAT HE WAS PESSIMISTIC ABOUT OUR RELATIONSHIP BUT HOPED SOMETHING MIGHT BE ACCOMPLISHED. I HAD THE FEELING HE WAS ALMOST EQUALLY CONCERNED ABOUT HIS OWN UTURE.

5. WITH BREZHNEV'S DEATH, THIS IS A TIME OF MONUMENTAL JOCKEYING HERE. I BELIEVE THAT IT IS OF GREAT IMPORTANCE THAT WE TRY TO KEEP OUR MANY OFFICIAL VOICES IN HARMONY. IN PARTICULAR, WE SHOULD NOT REPEAT NOT SPECULATE ON THE SUCCESSION. THIS IS A SENTIMENTAL AND PROUD PEOPLE WHO LOVE STRONG LEADERSHIP. THEY WILL NOT TAKE KINDLY TO OFFICIAL OUTSIDERS DENIGRATING THE GREAT MAN. IN ANY CASE, WE SHOULD AGAIN MAKE CLEAR OUR FIRMNESS OF PURPOSE AND INTENT TO PURSUE POSITIVE AVENUES TO PEACE IF WE GET AN APPROPRIATE SIGNAL FROM THE NEW LEADERSHIP. WHILE OUR PRINCIPAL PROBLEMS (SECURITY BALANCE. POLAND AND AFGHANISTAN) WILL NOT GO AWAY, WE MUST BE ALERT TO AND BE SEEN TO ENCOURAGE

6. WE WILL GET TO YOU THE PLANS ON ANY PUBLIC FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS AS SOON AS THEY ARE CONVEYED TO US. I HOPE UNTIL WE HAVE THEM IN HAND THAT WE CAN LIMIT STATEMENTS ON OUR SIDE TO THE FACT THAT WE WILL, OF COURSE, PARTICIPATE IN AN APPROPRIATE MANNER.

2. SUHMARY: AS OF FOUR HOURS AFTER PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT OF BREZHNEV'S DEATH, MOSCOW IS QUIET. WITH NORMAL WORKDAY ACTIVITIES CONTINUING EVERYWHERE. ARRANGEMENTS FOR FUNERAL ARE EXPECTED TO BE ANNOUNCED SOON, AND SHOULD PROVIDE FIRST CLUE OF NEW LEADERSHIP ARRANGEMENT. OFFICIALS AT MEA AND FOREIGN TRADE MINISTRY ARE WORKING

ON PRACTICAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR PREVIOUSLY SCHEDULED ACTIVITIES INVOLVING TWO GOVERNMENTS, INCLUDING MEETING NEXT WEEK OF U.S. - SOVIET TRADE AND ECONOMIC COUNCIL. FLAGS ARE DRAPED WITH BUNTING, BUT FEW SIGNS OF PUBLIC GRIEF ARE PRESENT. END SUMMARY.

3. ALTHOUGH SOVIET MEDIA WERE CLEARLY AWARE OF BREZHNEV'S DEATH AS OF THE EVENING HOURS OF NOVEMBER 10 (A NATIONAL DAY MESSAGE TO ANGOLA WAS ANNOUNCED AS BEING SIGNED ONLY BY THE PRESIDIUM OF THE SUPREME SOVIET AND THE PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE). THE PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENT WAS WITHHELD FOR OVER TWENTY-FOUR HOURS, AS HAS BEEN TRADITIONAL WITH THE DEATH OF BY COR NARA DATE /2/11 TLEADERSHIP FIGURES. ORDERLY ANNOUNCEMENT AND OTHER SIGNS INDICATE THAT THE LEADERSHIP IS DETERMINED TO DEMONSTRATE THE EXTERNAL APPEARANCE OF NORMALCY. THE ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE FUNERAL WILL BE AMONG THE FIRST INDICATORS OF A PROTOCOL ORDER OF THE LEADERSHIP. BUT IT MAY BE SOME TIME BEFORE THE ACTUAL POWER RELATION-SHIPS AND DIVISION OF LABOR BECOME CLEARLY EVIDENT TO THE OUTSIDE WORLD. 4. FARLY INDICATIONS OF SOVIET INTENTIONS TO CARRY ON BUSINESS AS USUAL TO MAXIMUM EXTENT COMPATIBLE WITH FUNERAL ARRANGEMENTS ARE TYPIFIED BY INFORMAL WORD WE HAVE RECEIVED FROM MINISTRY OF FOREIGN TRADE THAT PLANS ARE STILL ON FOR MEETING OF U.S. -SOVIET TRADE AND ECONOMIC COUNCIL TO MEET BEGINNING NOVEMBER 16. VISIT OF CODEL DOLE IS PRESUMABLY STILL WELCOME (CODEL IS SCHEDULED TO ARRIVE MONDAY EVENING NOVEMBER 15 AND MFT OFFICIAL BELIEVED FUNERAL WOULD TAKE PLACE MONDAY AFTERNOON). C O N F I D E N T I A L SECTION 82 OF 83 MOSCOW 13587 FROM THE LOBBY THAT THE EMBOFFS HAD FAILED TO RECONFIRM THE APPOINTMENT (WHICH HAD NOT BEEN MADE A PREREQUISITE ARRANGED) AND THAT A MEETING (EVEN FOR FIVE MINUTES) COULD NOT TAKE PLACE. AT ABOUT THE SAME TIME, OTHER EMBOFFS ALSO UNSUCCESSFULLY SOUGHT TO SEE USA AND CANADA INSTITUTE STAFFERS WITHOUT AN ADVANCE APPOINTMENT. THEY WERE TOLD THAT THERE WAS "NO DIE AVAILABLE" TO RECEIVE THEM. AT BOTH THE PRAVDA BUILDING AND THE INSTITUTE, THE PUBLIC AREA SEEMED OUIETER THAN NORMAL.

6. AT MID-DAY THE REMLIN GROUNDS WERE CLOSED TO

TOURISTS, ALTHOUGH NORMAL KREMLIN STAFF AND WORKERS ON CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS WITHIN THE KREMLIN WERE ADMITTED BY GUARDS WITH ONLY A CURSORY GLANCE AT THEIR IDENTIFICATION PAPERS.

7. OVERT SECURITY AROUND GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS IN CENTRAL MOSCOW REMAINS AT A NORMAL LEVEL WITH THE SINGLE EXCEPTION OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE BUILDING, WHERE A NUMBER OF PLAINCLOTHESMEN ARE HANGING AROUND THE ENTRANCES IN ADDITION TO THE NORMAL UNIFORMED KGB AND MILITIA GUARDS.

8. SHORTLY BEFORE THE ANNOUNCEMENT OF BREZHNEV'S DEATH IN THE LATE MORNING, THERE WAS AN UNUSUALLY LARGE NUMBER OF OFFICIAL VEHICLES PARKED IN FRONT OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE BUILDING INCLUDING FIVE LARGE ZIL LIMOUSINES WITH MOTORS RUNNING. BY EARLY AFTERNOON THE NUMBER OF PARKED OFFICIAL VEHICLES NEAR THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE HEADQUARTERS HAD DROPPED TO NORMAL. BOTH MORNING AND AFTERNOON THERE WAS ONE CHANGE FROM NORMAL PROCEDURE FOR VEHICLES AT THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE: THE LARGE CENTRAL PARKING AREA WITHIN THE CC COMPLEX WAS COMPLETELY DEVOID OF ANY PARKED CARS AND THERE WAS NO ADMITTANCE INTO THE COMPLEX FOR VEHICLES.

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

9. THOSE PEDESTRIANS AND SHOP CLERKS WITH WHOM EMBOFFS HAD OCCASION TO TALK ASKED IF WE HAD HEARD THE NEWS, AND GENERALLY EXPRESSED THEIR FEELINGS THAT THE EVENT WAS "HORRIBLE" (UZHASNO). SMALL CLUSTERS OF PEOPLE, YOUNG AND OLD, MEN AND WOMEN, IN VARIOUS SPOTS WERE EXCHANGING THE NEWS AND DISCUSSING IT. SEVERAL SOVIETS WERE SEEN IN A LOCAL POSTER STORE BUYING UP BREZHNEV'S PORTRAITS. HOWEVER, THE GENERAL IMPRESSION WAS ONE OF NORMAL EVERYDAY ACTIVITY, WITH NO EXCESSIVE SIGNS PUBLICLY OF SHOCK OR GRIEF.

18. THE MOOD OF THE PEOPLE IN MOSCOW'S FOODSTORES AT MID-DAY WAS NORMAL: THEY WERE MORE INTERESTED IN STANDING IN THREE LINES AT ONCE TO BUY SAUSAGE, ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES AND CANNED FISH THAN IN DISCUSSING BREZHNEV'S DEATH. IN FACT, NONE OF THE CUSTOMERS IN THE LINES EMBOFF STOOD IN MENTIONED THE SOVIET EVENT OF THE YEAR (IF NOT THE DECADE). THE EVENT. IF ANYTHING, MUSCOVITES CONTINUE TO BE SLIGHTLY MORE QUIET AND SUBDUED THAN NORMAL. AMONG THE CBSERVATIONS EMBOFFS HAVE REPORTED DURING THE AFTERNOON ARE:

3. SIX "CHERRY-PICKER" CRANES WERE HARD AT WORK ON THE FACADE OF THE DOM SOYUZOV, WHERE EXPIRED SOVIET LEADERS AND OTHER DIGNITARIES HAVE LAIN IN STATE. PRESUMBBLY BREZHNEV'S BODY WILL BE ON DISPLAY THERE AS WELL.

4. MUCH ACTIVITY WAS OBSERVED IN FRONT OF THE HOTEL MOSKVA ON MARX PROSPECT, WITH MANY OFFICIAL CARS DISCHARGING PASSENGERS, POSSIBLY CENTRAL COMMITTEE SUPREME SOVIET MEMBERS ARRIVING IN MOSCOW.

5. LONGER THAN USUAL QUEUES AT NEWSSTANDS WERE SEEN. THE AFTERNOON IZVESTIYA HAD NOT APPEARED ON THE STANDS BY 6: 80 P.M. (IT IS USUALLY OUT BY 4:80 P.M.), AND PURCHASERS HAD TO BE SATISFIED WITH VECHERNAYA MOSKVA, WHICH CARRIED ONLY THE BRIEF ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE DEATH ON THE FRONT PAGE.

6. BREZHNEV'S PORTRAIT SOLD OUT AT THE ARBAT POSTER

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

STORE AT ABOUT 5:00 P.M. EMBOFFS OBSERVED A MEDIUM-SIZED LINE FOR THE PORTRAIT, AND A PHOTOGRAPHER (APPARENTLY FROM A NEWSPAPER) WAS BUSILY SNAPPING PICTURES OF THE LAST CUSTOMERS.

7. ISOLATED COMMENTS OF SOVIET CITIZENS INCLUDED SPECULATION ABOUT WHETHER THE SUCCESSOR WOULD BE ANDROPOV OR CHERNENKO, MILD ARGUMENTS ABOUT THE LEVEL OF PROGRESS ACHIEVED IN THE BREZHNEV YEARS, AND ONE OR TWO REMINISCENCES OF STALIN'S PASSING. ONE ELDERLY WOMEN OBSERVED THAT SHE HAD BEEN AROUND IN 1953, AND TOLD AN INTERLOCUTOR THAT IN COMPARISON WITH CURRENT LEADERS, STALIN WAS A "REAL" LEADER.

8. AN EMBOFF WHO DROPPED IN AT A BEER STAND FREQUENTED BY WORKERS FOUND THAT NO ONE SAID A WORD ABOUT BREZHNEV'S PASSING -- THE CONVERSATIONS CONCENTRATED ON SPORTS, BEER QUALITY AND PERSONAL MATTERS.

9. IN THE MAIN MOSCOW DEPARTMENT STORE (GUM) CROWDS CONTINUED THEIR HUSTLING FOR GOODS AND SEEMED TOTALLY OBLIVIOUS AS LOUDSPEAKERS CARRIED A RADIO BROADCAST OF THE PARTY/STATE STATEMENT AND BREZHNEV'S OBITUARY.

10. AS A SIGN OF THE OVERSENSITIVITY OF LOW-LEVEL SECURITY AUTHORITIES, WE NOTE THAT SHEREMYETOVO AIRPORT AUTHORITIES REFUSED TO ALLOW AN EMBASSY TRUCK

It seems to me the delegation should be powerful enough not to cause a visible contrast with other Allied delegations, but not so high-level as to send a wrong signal to Moscow. In particular, it should not include individuals clearly identified with detente or appeasement (as, for example, Averell Harriman, who was directly involved in the Yalta negotiations). My suggested list would be as follows:

2. YURI ANDROPOV WAS UNANIMOUSLY ELECTED SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE CPSU CENTRAL COMMITTEE AT A SPECIAL PLENUM HELD ON NOVEMBER 12. NO OTHER LEADERSHIP CHANGE WAS AMNOUNCED AT THE PLENUM. BREZHNEY'S POST AS CHAIRMAN OF THE PRESIDIUM OF THE USSR SUPREME SOVIET. REMAINS UNFILLED, THOUGH THIS POSITION WILL ALMOST CERTAINLY BE FILLED WITHIN THE MEXT TWO WEEKS. (A SESSION OF THE SUPREME SOVIET WILL BET ON NOVEMBER 23.) AMONG THE CANDIDATES PROMINENTLY MENTIONED HERE FOR THE LATTER POST INCLUDE KONSTANTIN CHERNENKO, ANDROPOV'S CHIEF RIVAL FOR THE PARTY SUCCESSION, AND FOREIGN MINISTER GROMYKO.

3. IN SELECTING ANDROPOV FOR THE PARTY POST, THE LEADER-SHIP HAS ACHIEVED A DISPLAY OF UNITY AND COMESION. ANDROPOV'S NOMINATION WAS MADE, FOR INSTANCE, BY CHERNENKO, WHO DESCRIBED THE NEW PARTY BOSS AS A LEADER IN THE BREZHNEV TRADITION OF "RESPECT FOR THE OPINION

OF OTHER COMRADES AND, I CAN EVEN SAY, A PASSION FOR COLLECTIVE WORK." THE EXPEDITIOUSNESS WITH WHICH THE REGIME HAS NAMED A SUCCESSOR SUGGESTS THAT CONSENSUS ON THE SUCCESSION MAY HAVE EXISTED EVEN BEFORE BREZHNEY'S DEATH, ALTHOUGH CHERNENKO'S MANEUVERINGS UP TO ALMOST THE MOMENT OF BREZHNEY'S DEATH SUGGEST HE WAS STILL COVETING THE TOP PARTY JOB.

- 4. IN HIS BRIEF ACCEPTANCE SPEECH TO THE PLENUM, ANDROPOV UNDERLINED THE NECESSITY FOR CONTINUITY IN BOTH FOREIGN AND DOMESTIC POLICIES. HE REMINDED HIS AUDIENCE THAT "AS HEAD OF THE PARTY AND STATE, AS THE CHAIRMAN OF THE DEFENSE COUNCIL LEONID ILYICH BREZHNEV CONSTANTLY SAW TO IT THAT THE DEFENSIVE CAPACITY OF THE COUNTRY SHOULD BE UP TO PRESENT-DAY REQUIREMENTS. " IN REMARKS MADE TO EMBOFF NOVEMBER 12, YU DAVYDOV (PROTECT), SECTORHEAD AT THE USA/CANADA INSTITUTE WHO HAS IN THE PAST TOUTED ANDROPOV'S CANDIDACY FOR THE SUCCESSION, SAID THAT HE BELIEVES THE NEW LEADER WILL BE MORE FLEXIBLE AND INNOVATIVE IN FORMULATING HIS POLICIES. DAVYDOV SAID THAT THIS WOULD ESPECIALLY BE THE CASE IN SOVIET DEAL-INGS WITH ITS EAST BLOG PARTNERS, INCLUDING POLAND. IN DOMESTIC MATTERS.
