IN A MEETING WITH VICE FOREIGN MINISTER ZHANG WEJIN ON JULY 31, CHARGE SAID HE HOPED VICE PREMIER/FOREIGN MINISTER HUANG HUA WOULD BE ABLE TO ACCEPT THE SECRETARY'S INVITATION FOR A MEETING IN WASHIMRTON ON HIS WAY BACK FROM CANCUN AS THIS WOULD PRESENT THE VICE PREMIER A GOOD OPPORTUNITY TO MEET NEW U.S. GOVERNMENT LEADERS, POSSIBLY INCLUDING SECRE-TARIES HAIG, WEINBERGER, BALDRIDGE AND REGAN, AS WELL AS SECRETARY STOESSEL. THE CHARGE ALSO INDICATED THAT WHILE THE PRISIDENT WOULD NOT BE IN WASHINGTON AT THE TIME, IT WAS QUITE POSSIBLE THAT THE VICE PRESIDENT WOULD BE ABLE TO MEET WITH HUANG HUA. ZHANG REPLIED THAT HE PERSONALLY HOPED HUANG HUA WOULD BE ABLE TO MAKE THE VISIT, BUT ASKED WHETHER A DATE OTHER THAN AUGUST 12 COULD BE ARRANGED. THE CHARGE REPLIED THAT ARRANGEMENTS HAD BEEN TENTATIVELY MADE FOR AUGUST 12, BUT THAT IT MIGHT BE POSSIBLE TO SHIFT SOME OR ALL OF THESE IF THAT WAS NECESSARY, ZHANG SAID HE WOULD BE IN TOUCH AS SOON AS POSSIBLE WITH THE VICE PREMIER, WHO COULD DISCUSS THE QUESTION IN CANCUN WITH SECRETARY HAIG. IN VIEW OF THE DEPARTMENT'S BETTER COMMUNICATIONS, HOWEVER, ZHANG ASKED IF WE COULD ALSO CONVEU THE PROPOSALS TO THE FOREIGN MINISTER IN CANCUN. 3. AND WE WOULD BE GIVING CAREFUL CONSIDERATION TO
ALL THE CHINESE REGUESTS. IN AREAS WHERE WE
COULD NOT BE RESPONSIVE, WE WOULD SUGGEST ALTERNATIVES.
THE CHARGE STRESSED THAT THIS ISSUE INVOLVED AN
IMPORTANT NEW ASPECT OF OUR RELATIONS AND WE WANTED
THE TO GO WELL.

ZHANG INDICATED THAT THE CHINESE WOULD CONSIDER
OUR REQUEST FOR A NEW TIMEFRAME FOR THE VISIT.

AFTER THE CONVERSATION HAD TURNED TO OTHER SUBJECTS,

ZHANG RETURNED TO THE MATTER OF LIU'S VISIT. WHILE

THE LIU VISIT WAS A DEFENSE MATTER, ZHANG SAID, THE

MFA VIEWED THE GUESTION IN TERMS OF POLITICAL RELATIONS.

CLEARLY REFERRING TO US DECISIONS REGARDING TAIWAN,

ZHANG THEN EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT NOTHING WOULD

MAPPEN DURING THE VISIT THAT WOULD DAMAGE THE

ATMOSPHERE. HE ALSO SAID THAT BEFORE THE VISIT

TAKES PLACE, THE PRC WOULD LIKE TO KNOW WHAT THE

THE CHARGE REPLIED THAT ZHANG'S PREVIOUS QUESTIONS ALONG THESE LINES HAD BEEN CAREFULLY DEPORTED. HE EMPHASIZED THAT DOD/OSD/ISA DAS ARMITAGIS TALKS WITH THE PRC ATTACHE IN WASHINGTON ON THIS SUBJECT AND THE CHARGE'S OWN COMMENTS TO ZHANG HAD UNDERSCORED THE VERY POSTTIVE ATTITUDE WITH WHICH THE US APPROACHED THE VISIT. THE CHARGE INDICATED THAT THERE WERE LIMITS IN OUR CONSIDERATION OF AN ABSTRACT LIST OF ITEMS WITHOUT SPECIFICATION AS TO THE NUMBERS DESIRED OR WHETHER PRODUCTION TECHNOLOGY OR THE ITEM TTSELF WAS SOUGHT. THE DETAILED PRESENTATION OF OUR POSITION, THE CHARGE SAID, WOULD HAVE TO AWAIT LIU'S ARRIVAL IN WASHINGTON, BUT, HE ADDED, HE COULD ASSURE THE VICE MINISTER THAT GENERAL LIU'S VISIT TO WASHINGTON THIS YEAR WOULD NOT BE A MERE DEPETITION OF HIS VISIT LAST YEAR.

Carrying out the June 4 NSC decision which you approved (Tab 1), I informed the Chinese in Beijing of your decision to make good past U.S. Government commitments to liberalize export controls on dual-use technology. I also conveyed your intentions to seek Congressional action to end discrimination in legislation no longer consistent with the present U.S.-China relationship and to suspend China from the list of embargoed destinations for munitions exports.

Two interagency groups are preparing guidelines to effect liberalization of controls on dual-use exports and identifying laws that prohibit cooperation with China because of its former association with the Soviet Bloc. A third group is developing guidelines for responding to Chinese requests to purchase arms from the U.S. It will produce a policy recommendation containing an analysis of all factors involved, including effects on Chinese military capabilities, strategic benefits and risks, and reactions of third parties.

We plan to approach this sensitive area of arms transfers in a gradual and careful way. I have briefed Congress to this effect; similar consultations with allied and friendly Asian nations have allayed concerns which some of them harbor on this score. The Soviets have made known their views, and while we cannot give them a veto over U.S. policy, our caseby-case reviews of specific exports will take the Soviet factor into account.

I believe we can now complete the formalities of placing China in the category of nations eligible to acquire arms in the U.S. This will set the stage for Vice Chief of the PLA General Staff Liu Huaqing's visit, which we now understand will take place in early fall. A simple administrative procedure is required. State will send a routine notice to American defense manufacturers stating that we will now consider all export license applications on a case-by-case basis. We will also

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publish a change in the International Traffic in Arms Regulations in the Federal Register. Before doing so, we will undertake one final round of consultations with allies and friends, so no one will be surprised.

The Department of Defense supports this approach.

This move is a step toward your goal of developing relations with China on the basis of U.S. strategic interests. It is in keeping with other steps you have directed that we take on a number of issues, including Taiwan, which will be raised with you separately.

As indicated to you on Friday and detailed in my memorandum to you on Saturday afternoon, preparations for Under Secretary Stoessel's CBW news conference this afternoon left much to be desired. And while substantial progress was achieved through intensive interagency discussions on Saturday, it proved impossible at the press conference today to surmount fundamental credibility problems noted earlier.

Mr. Stoessel's opening statements, as well as answers provided on background by a panel of four US Government specialists, were presented in an earnest and detailed way. However, for sources and methods reasons, the panelists could not give their names, could not identify the chain of evidence, the research institute, the researchers, and the doctors involved. They also could not elaborate on why we were not charging the Soviet Union with violations or how these incidents fit into the larger framework of US-Soviet relations and US arms control policy. The media were dismayed.

It is a shame that such important evidence and issues were rushed forward without sufficient prior thought and coordination, and with possibly serious adverse impacts on the Reagan Administration's credibility. We will continue to watch developments carefully.

This memorandum reports on President Carter's forthcoming trip to China and the Vice President's comment that someone in the White House should talk to him. I am available to talk to former President Carter should you desire me to do so.

When I was with the Vice President on Friday, July 31, introducing him to the President of Nauru, he took me aside and asked if anyone on the NSC staff was going to brief Carter before he went to China. The Vice President said he heard rumblings that Carter was concerned that no one in the White House was scheduled to talk to him before his forthcoming trip now scheduled for departure approximately 20 August. Tab A is a State Department cable on his trip and states the man to contact is Phil Wise, telephone number 192-824-7141. (2)

I am certainly not asking to conduct this briefing but I thought it was important that I acquaint you with the state of play. (U)

RECOMMENDATION:

That you consider the value of briefing Carter and decide whether State or I should handle it.
