1. FOLLOWING IS FULL TEXT OF SUBJECT LETTER RELEASED MAY 9, 1982, IN BEIJING BY VICE PRESIDENT PRESS OFFICE.

MESSAGE (CONTINUED):

- 2. (BEGIN TEXT) APRIL 5, 1982, DEAR MR. VICE CHAIRMAN:
- 3. THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS BETWEEN
  THE UNITED STATES AND CHINA WAS AN HISTORIC EVENT WHICH
  IMPROVED THE PROSPECTS FOR PEACE AND SERVEO THE INTERESTS
  OF BOTH OUR PEOPLES. YET WE NOW FIND OURSELVES AT A
  DIFFICULT JUNCTURE IN THOSE RELATIONS.
- 4. I AM WRITING TO YOU BECAUSE IT IS IMPORTANT FOR THE LEADERSHIP OF BOTH OUR COUNTRIES TO RESUME THE BROAD ADVANCE TO WHICH YOU HAVE CONTRIBUTED SO MUCH. THIS IS PARTICULARLY IMPORTANT TODAY, AS WE FACE A GROWING THREAT FROM THE SOVIET UNION AND ITS SATELLITE NATIONS THROUGHOUT THE WORLD. THOUGH OUR INTERESTS AND THUS OUR POLICIES ARE NOT IDENTICAL, IN AFGHANISTAN AND IRAN, IN SOUTHEAST ASIA, IN MY OWN HEMISPHERE, AND IN THE FIELD OF

NUCLEAR MEAPDNRY, YOUR NATION AND MINE FACE CLEAR AND PRESENT DANGERS, AND THESE SHOULD IMPEL US TOWARD FINDING A FIRM BASIS FOR COOPERATION.

- 5. WE HAVE COME FAR TOGETHER IN A VERY SHORT TIME. I STRONGLY SUPPORT THE CONTINUATION OF THIS PROGRESS. WE MUST WORK TOGETHER TO EXPAND THE BENEFITS TO BOTH OUR COUNTRIES. MY ADMINISTRATION HAS TAKEN A NUMBER OF INITIATIVES TO FURTHER THIS PROCESS, AND WE INTEND TO DO MORE.
- 6. CLEARLY, THE TAIWAN ISSUE HAD BEEN A MOST DIFFICULT PROBLEM BETWEEN OUR GOVERNMENTS. NONETHELESS, VISION AND STATESMANSHIP HAVE ENABLED US IN THE PAST TO REDUCE OUR DIFFERENCES OVER THIS ISSUE WHILE WE HAVE BUILT A FRAMEWORK OF LONG-TERM FRIENDSHIP AND COOPERATION.
- 7. THE UNITED STATES FIRMLY ADHERES TO THE POSITIONS AGREED UPON IN THE JOINT COMMUNIQUE ON THE ESTABLISHMENT OF DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND CHINA. THERE IS ONLY ONE CHINA. WE WILL NOT PERMIT THE UNOFFICIAL RELATIONS BETWEEN THE AMERICAN PEOPLE AND THE PEOPLE OF TAIWAN TO WEAKEN OUR COMMITMENT TO THIS PRINCIPLE.
- 8. I FULLY UNDERSTAND AND RESPECT THE POSITION OF YOUR GOVERNMENT WITH REGARD TO THE QUESTION OF ARMS SALES TO TAIWAN. AS YOU KNOW, OUR POSITION ON THIS MATTER WAS STATED IN THE PROCESS OF NORMALIZATION: THE UNITED STATES

MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

HAS AN ABIDING INTEREST IN THE PEACEFUL RESOLUTION OF THE TAIWAN QUESTION.

- 9. WE FULLY RECOGNIZE THE SIGNIFICANCE OF THE NINE-POINT PROPOSAL OF SEPTEMBER 30, 1981 AND THE POLICY SET FORTH BY YOUR GOVERNMENT AS EARLY AS JANUARY 1, 1979. THE DECISIONS AND THE PRINCIPLES CONVEYED ON MY INSTRUCTIONS TO YOUR GOVERNMENT ON JANUARY 11, 1982 REFLECT OUR APPRECIATION OF THE NEW SITUATION CREATED BY THESE DEVELOPMENTS.
- 10. IN THIS SPIRIT, WE WISH TO CONTINUE OUR EFFORTS TO RESOLVE OUR DIFFERENCES AND TO CREATE A COOPERATIVE AND ENDURING BILATERAL AND STRATEGIC RELATIONSHIP. CHINA AND AMERICA ARE TWO GREAT NATIONS DESTINED TO GROW STRONGER THROUGH COOPERATION, NOT WEAKER THROUGH DIVISION.
