THE PRESIDENT and MRS. REAGAN proceed to their chairs in the front row on the South Lawn.

Concert performed by The Boston Pops 5:01 p.m. Orchestra begins.

Concert concludes. 5:45 p.m.

THE PRESIDENT and MRS. REAGAN proceed from their chairs to the lectern.

Remarks by THE PRESIDENT.

At the conclusion of his remarks, THE PRESIDENT invites guests inside for reception.

5:50 p.m. THE PRESIDENT and MRS. REAGAN depart the South Lawn via The First Lady's Garden and the East Garden Room and proceed to the Blue Room via the elevator.

> THE PRESIDENT and MRS. REAGAN take their places for the receiving line (posed photographs) in front of the fireplace in the Blue Room.

> > Ambassador Roosevelt will make the introductions.

Guests are escorted into the Residence via The First Lady's Garden and the East Foyer and are directed to the State Floor via Lower Cross Hall and the Grand Staircase.

Receiving line is formed. 6:00 p.m.

> Guests enter the State Dining Room via the Cross Hall doors, proceed through the south door of the Red Room into the Blue Room, past THE PRESIDENT and MRS. REAGAN in front of the fireplace, into the Green Room, and out the Cross Hall to the East Room.

Refreshments will be served in the State Dining Room and in the East Room.

At the conclusion of the receiving line, THE 6:30 p.m. PRESIDENT and MRS. REAGAN may mix and mingle with guests.

6:45 p.m. THE PRESIDENT and MRS. REAGAN depart the State Floor via the elevator enroute the Residence. Approx.

> Guests begin to depart the State Floor via the Grand Staircase and the East Wing Colonnade.
