I am writing on behalf of the members of Cub Scout Pack #130 regarding the birthday present they sent the President on February 14th.



A MUSEUM DEVOTED TO

THE CULTURE OF RICE

From the earliest settlement at the beginning of the eighteenth century until the first decade of the 1900's rice was synonymous with Georgetown County, South Carolina. Rice dominated life in the County!

In the 1840's, the Georgetown region produced almost half the rice grown in the United States. Indeed, it is likely that no other area of the country has ever been as dependent for as long a period of time on this one crop as was this section of the Low Country.

The story of the rice culture in Georgetown County — one of the most colorful chapters in the history of American agriculture — has been captured at The Rice Museum. Through maps, dioramas, pictures, artifacts, and other exhibits, visitors to the Museum gain a knowledge and understanding of a society based on one crop.

The Rice Museum is located in the Old Market Building, the first Georgetown structure to be listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The building was erected in 1842 and is known locally as the Town Clock because of the clock faces located on all four sides of its bell tower. The tower was added around 1845. The Town Clock — the symbol of Georgetown County — is a singularly appropriate site for studying the history of the community.

The Rice Museum was dedicated in the Spring of 1970 as part of the South Carolina Tricentennial Celebration. No vacation in the Low Country is complete without a visit to this unique institution!

Georgetown—the third oldest city in South Carolina—has European connections dating from 1526. A visit to The Rice Museum is an excellent start of a tour of Historic Georgetown. Nearby are almost fifty structures that pre-date the War Between the States. The Tour Train, providing a comfortable way of visiting Georgetown, makes regular stops at The Rice Museum.

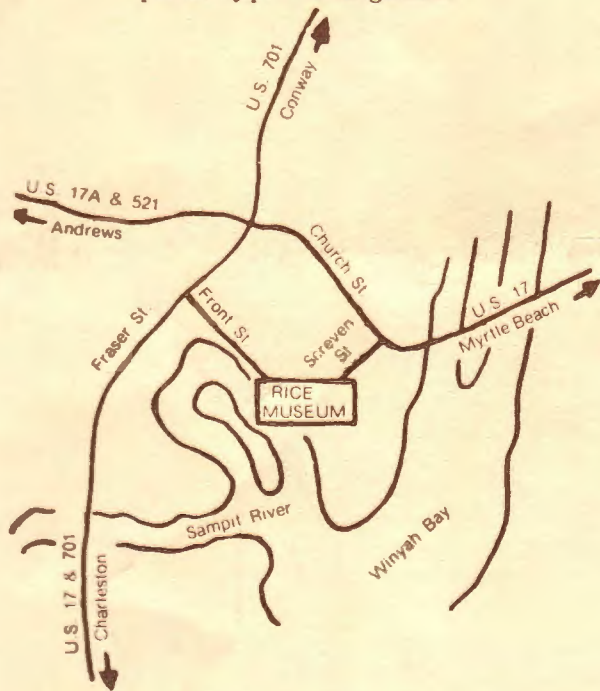





Ronald McDonald House To offer comforts of home

Parents of a hospitalized patient want to be as close as possible to their ill child. Often that has meant spending the night on a cot or chairs in the child's hospital room — or putting a strain on the family budget by footing the bill for motel accommodations near the hospital.

Children's Family House, Inc. (CFH), a nonprofit corporation, has been working to provide affordable, temporary housing for parents of children hospitalized at CHMC, by establishing a Ronald McDonald House. Eighteen such facilities are in use around the country, and now CHMC will have one of its own.

Thanks to a pledge of \$200,000 from the owners and operators of McDonald's Restaurants in Cincinnati, and a 99-year lease for \$1, provided by CHMC for suitable land on the medical center campus, groundbreaking for the facility will take place in the spring of 1982.

The Ronald McDonald House at 229 Erkenbrecher Avenue will include 20 bedrooms, a family room, kitchen and dining area, library, laundry, play yard, and a court yard.





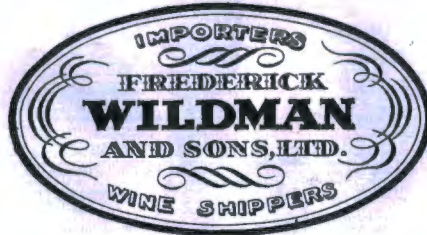
