I am sending you a copy of a self-explanatory letter I have received from Mr. Holt Confer, a constituent of mine.



Cast in bronze and mounted on hand rubbed walnut, this magnificent work embodies the look of pride and independence so characteristic of the breed.

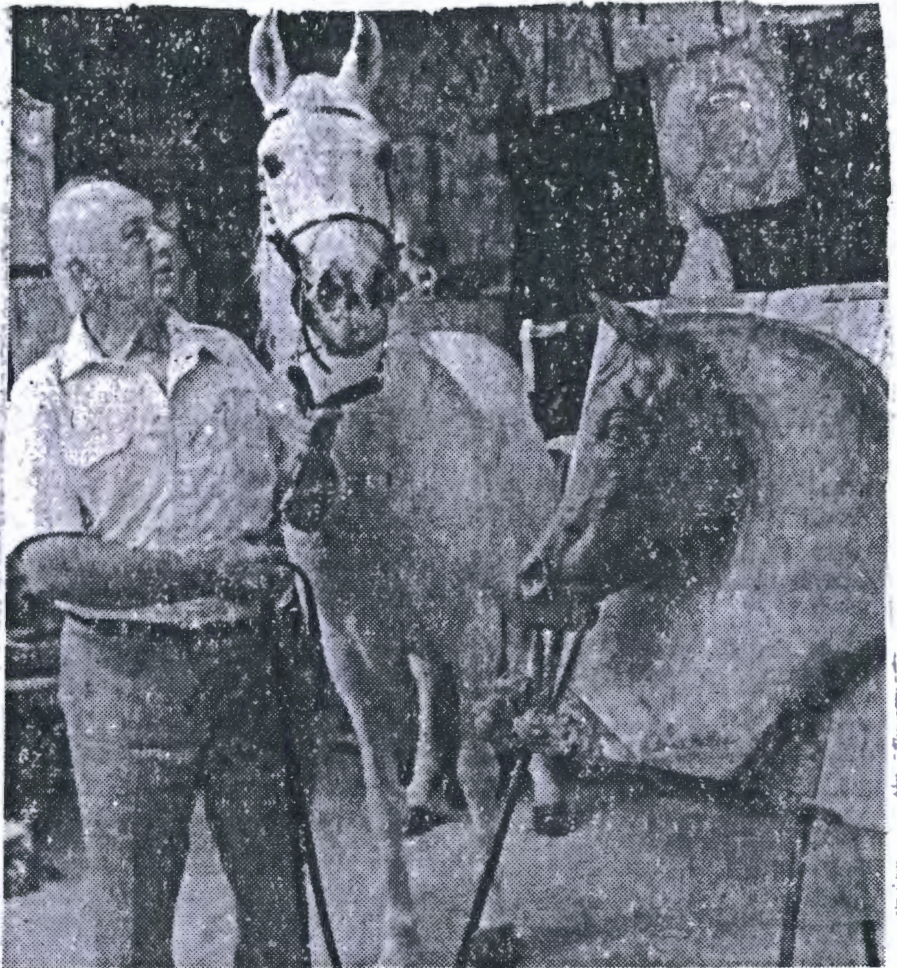

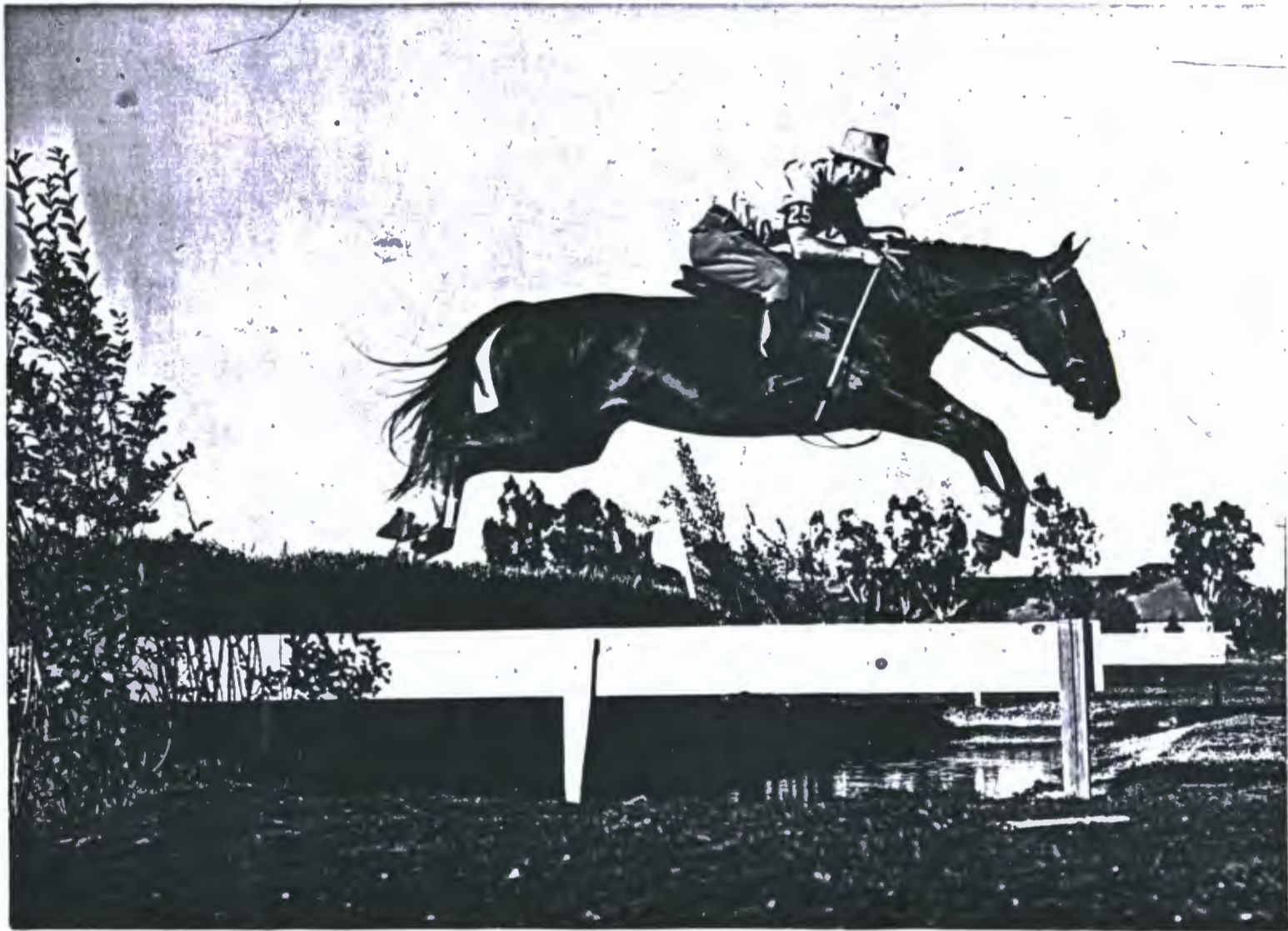

Dear Mr. President:

It is with great personal pleasure that I congratulate you upon your election. As a teenager in Perry, Iowa, I used to listen to your baseball broadcasts and I took a special interest in following your early years in Hollywood through the Des Moines Register.

The Company I now head was responsible for the codification of the U. S. Laws in 1926 and we have every six years since worked closely with the Law Revision Counsel in the preparation of the new edition of the U. S. Code. As an outgrowth of these efforts, we prepared the U. S. Code Annotated which in addition to the Code Titles and Sections incorporates summaries of the Court Rulings interpreting the Congressional Enactments.

We have made a complimentary set of U. S. Code Annotated available to the President of the United States in the past, and we are happy to continue this tradition. 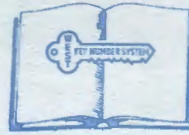
