In the Senate of the United States

February 26, 1986

Whereas the Government of the United States has recognized the legitimacy of the new Government of the Philippines under the popularly-supported leadership of President Corazon Aquino;

Whereas the Senate has stated, in S. Res. 345, that "America's interests are best served in the Philippines by a government which has a popular mandate.";

Whereas the Congress has stated, in H. Con. Res. 232, that the reinvigoration of Philippine democratic institutions offers the best means of restoring public confidence in the government and of defeating the growing Communist insurgency;

Whereas, on January 30, 1986, the President of the United States stated that "A free and fair election, if also followed by a genuine reform effort in the economic and security areas, will assist the Philippines along a path of growth, prosperity and stability that will benefit the entire region.";

Whereas in this same statement, the President referred to the growing Communist insurgency in the Philippines by saying "The Communist strategy can be defeated. But defeating it will require listening to and respecting the sovereign voice of the people.";

Whereas the strong historical bonds between the United States and the Philippines, and the deep commitment by the peoples of both nations to the principles and exercise of democracy, have been reaffirmed through this critical period in the history of Filipino-American relations;

Whereas Filipinos and Americans have fought and died together to defend liberty and the right of all peoples to choose governments whose moral and political legitimacy is based on their being created and maintained through free elections and other democratic processes;

Whereas the Filipino people, through their participation and perseverance in the recent election, have demonstrated courageously their commitment to the exercise of democratic freedoms, and have had that faith in democracy justified by the transition to a popularly-supported government of the Philippines;

Whereas the Philippines now is facing political, economic, and military crises so grave that close cooperation between the United States and the Philippines is required for them to be overcome; and

Whereas the most effective means to combat the Communist insurgency in the Philippines is through significant economic, political, and military reforms: Now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That the United States Senate:

(A) fully supports the recognition by the Government of the United States of the legitimacy and legal stature of the new Government of the Philippines under the leadership of President Corazon Aquino, who clearly enjoyed the support of a majority of the Philippine people in the February 7, 1986, election;

(B) praises the progress toward restoration of democracy in the Philippines, and commends President Aquino for the statesmanlike and peaceful methods employed to bring about an orderly transfer of power;

(C) praises the people of the Philippines for their valor and courageous commitment to democracy, especially during the recent activities in Manila, which resulted in the peaceful and expeditious transition of power to the Aquino government.

SEC. 2. The President is urged to convey these findings and sentiments of the United States Senate personally to President Aquino.

SUBJECT: New Finance and Trade Ministers in the Philippines

We have just learned of two new appointments in President Aquino's Cabinet: Jaime (Jimmy) Ongpin, as Finance Minister, and Jose (Joe) Concepcion, Jr., as Minister of Trade and Industry.

Jimmy Ongpin, 47, is the former President of Benguet Corporation. He holds a B.S.B.A. in Management from Ateneo de Manila University (1958), was a Fulbright travel grantee (1960-62), and received an MBA from Harvard in 1962. Ongpin brings a strong business orientation to the Cabinet. In his role as Finance Minister, he also will serve on the Governing Board of the Central Bank. He became politically active following Benigno Aquino's assassination in 1983, and was one of Cory Aquino's earliest supporters and principal advisers.

Joe Concepcion, Jr., 55, is best known as the head of the National Citizens Movement for Free Elections (NAMFREL), the citizens group that performed a "watchdog" role during the elections. He heads a number of businesses, the most prominent of which is the RFM (Republic Flour Mills) conglomerate (with interests in food processing, paper, mining and other activities). Like Ongpin, Concepcion will bring a strong business background to the Cabinet and will serve on the Central Bank Governing Board. He has been critical in the past of some of the economic reforms which the World Bank called for in its structural adjustment loan (SAL). He holds a B.S. in Agriculture from Araneta University. He has held numerous civic posts and was active in the Jaycees, receiving awards as Outstanding Jaycee in both 1964 and 1965.







Further to our past correspondence, we would like to suggest, as a possible solution to the current Philippine problem...to have Mr. Marcos step down and obtain a peaceful and orderly transition of leadership.

Clearly, President Marcos has exhibited a reluctance to do what is right. Further, he appears to be on the verge of using military equipment, which the United States provided under our aid agreements, to impose his will on those countrymen that have indicated a preference for Mrs. Aquino.

I believe Mr. Marcos will listen to you, a voice of reason, if the personal risk to him is great enough. He currently owns, via entities which he controls, hundreds of millions of dollars in United States investments...primarily real estate. (You may wish to research Enrique Zobel).

If you told him that the United States did not provide him with military equipment to be used against the Philippine people, and that should such occur, we, the American people, want financial restitution for this equipment. Since he is unilaterally making the decision to use this equipment, then he will personally be held accountable for its value; We will confiscate his holdings or suspected holdings in America.


However, should he show respect for the wishes of his people and peacefully step down, then he can keep his assets in America and even have political asylum in this country.

In these troubled times, President Marcos cannot be thinking clearly, and regardless of the legal ability or outcome of the above suggestions, President Marcos would have to view the loss of his wealth on the same level, or greater, than the loss of his life. This added pressure might make the difference.

Lastly, I have a very strong suggestion which could help Mr. Bush in 1988. However, it is not something which could be put in writing. If he or someone very close to him would like to give a call, I would be pleased to discuss it.

Text of Senate Resolution on Philippine Vote

Special to The New York Times

WASHINGTON, Feb. 19 — Following is text of the nonbinding Senate resolution on the Philippine election that was adopted today by a vote of 85 to 9:

Expressing the sense of the Senate that the recent presidential elections in the Philippines were marked by such widespread fraud that they cannot be considered a fair reflection of the will of the people of the Philippines.

WHEREAS the presidential election held in the Philippines on February 7, 1986, was plagued by widespread fraud on all levels:

WHEREAS international observer groups, including a United States official observer delegation, appointed by President Reagan, witnessed numerous instances of such fraud;

WHEREAS President Reagan stated

on February 15, 1986, that "the elections were marred by the widespread fraud and violence perpetrated largely by the ruling party";

WHEREAS the Catholic Bishops Conference of the Philippines judged the elections to be "unparalleled in the fraudulence of their conduct," including systematic disenfranchisement of voters, widespread and massive vote-buying, deliberate tampering with the election returns and intimidation, harassment, terrorism and murder of the citizens of the Philippines;

WHEREAS the vote totals reported in the Philippine National Assembly were inconsistent with figures tallied by the citizen poll-watching group Namfrel; and

WHEREAS the President has dispatched Ambassador Philip Habib on a fact-finding mission to help determine how best the United States

might assist the Philippines to return to a stable political situation based on democratic principles: Now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that it is the sense of the Senate that:

Section 1. America's interests are best served in the Philippines by a government which has a popular mandate.

Section 2. The February 7, 1986, presidential and vice presidential elections in the Philippines were marked by such widespread fraud that they cannot be considered a fair reflection of the will of the people of the Philippines.

Section 3. The Senate hereby requests that the President of the United States personally convey these concerns to President Ferdinand Marcos and Corazon Aquino of the Philippines.

Waiting for Marcos

Corazon Aquino put it succinctly. "Those who are prepared to support armed struggles for liberation elsewhere discredit themselves if they obscure the nature of what we are doing peacefully here." The Philippines' opposition leader added that there was more "at stake than the removal of an impostor president; it is the future of democracy itself."

When the President of the United States is calling for many millions of dollars in heavy arms for those he calls "freedom fighters" in Nicaragua and Angola, it is hard to explain why he is so loath to take a stand on the Philippines. Surely it cannot be that Washington prefers to wait until there is a large-scale armed insurgency to confront with military means. American domestic politics may be getting in the way of a nonviolent solution.

The remarkable aspect about the turmoil in the Philippines is that this is one case where the choice ought to be easy. It isn't often in the third world that there is a real and massive democratic movement to support against an oppressive regime at one end of the spectrum and Communist guerrillas at the other.

Nor should the means to advance the choice be costly or hard to find. Washington can announce that it does not recognize the fraudulent re-election of President Ferdinand Marcos, and considers the country temporarily without a legitimate government. He was given plenty of notice.

Backed up by Congress, by many willing allies and by the Vatican, that would deliver a loud and clear message to Mr. Marcos's uncertain followers in the worried business com-

munity and doubtless to many in the army, as well as to the opposition. In such circumstances, American aid could hardly go to the non-recognized Filipino Government.

Mr. Marcos has added to the provocation by thanking the Soviet Union for "its position against interventionism" when he accepted the credentials of the new Soviet Ambassador yesterday. He menaced the opposition, saying he had "certain powers to dismantle the machineries of civil disobedience," and that "I will exercise to the limit the provisions of the law and the Constitution to prevent turmoil."

Of course, he neglected to mention that he violated the Constitution in the first place by refusing to resign before the elections. He is gambling desperately that with these threats he can scare both Washington and his determined critics into letting him carry on as usual.

His inauguration is set for Tuesday. Washington has apparently decided not to send anybody important as the American representative, but there is talk of tapping a first secretary of the U.S. Embassy on the grounds that somebody has to turn up. That would be like sending the police to do honors at a mafia funeral. Nobody has to stand in for the United States at the ceremonial reinstatement of a greedy, murderous crook.

What is Washington waiting for then? There is talk about compromise and keeping the dialogue going among Filipinos, about gathering information and not appearing to intervene. That is evident nonsense. Things have gone much too far for that.

And whether the U.S. now dares to make its stand clear or continues to fudge, it is already intimately identified with whatever happens next. Jose R. Castro Jr., Manila director for the legal but militant Bayan federation of students, labor, peasants and others who consider Mrs. Aquino too cautious, demanded action to "oust the U.S.-Marcos dictatorship."

Sooner or later, Marcos has to go, the sooner the better for everybody else except perhaps the Communists (which is presumably why the Soviet Ambassador congratulated him), and possibly for himself as well.

It is beginning to appear that Washington's waffle isn't about the Philippines after all, nor about foreign policy, but about domestic American politics. The White House seems to be worried that it will stir up its ultra-conservative critics if it helps give Mr. Marcos a push, and that he would try to exploit them to create a divisive internal debate in the Administration.

This is the worst possible reason for stumbling into a dead end that can only damage the U.S. around the world, especially when there is so much to be gained in terms of President Reagan's "crusade for democracy" if the U.S. is seen to reject tyrants. Let the superpatriots show for once that they recognize and truly care for the national interest and America's commitment to freedom. It is time for Mr. Reagan to decide and tell them why. □

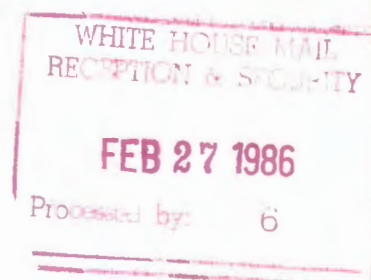

Dear Mr. Jackson:

I am replying to your February 16 letter to President Reagan regarding U.S. policy toward recent events in the Philippines.

The U.S. Government maintained strict neutrality in the Philippine elections, consistently urging that they be free and fair. Nevertheless, the elections were marred by widespread fraud and violence, and the results were not credible to the Filipino people.


The events following the elections and leading to the transition to a new government in the Philippines are now history. The United States moved quickly to recognize the Aquino Government. In a February 25 statement announcing the U.S. position, Secretary Shultz noted that President Reagan was pleased with the peaceful transition. He characterized recent events in the Philippines as "one of the most stirring and courageous examples of the democratic process in modern history."

The United States stands ready to assist in Filipino efforts to deal with the problems their country faces. The way to restore peace and prosperity has always been through political, economic, and military reforms. The country faces major economic and security problems, including a dangerous communist insurgency. We are consulting with the Aquino Government to assess needs and determine how we can be helpful.

Over the course of 20 years and five U.S. administrations, Mr. Marcos has been a loyal friend and ally of the United States. We have extended, as appropriate, our welcome to him to remain in this country if he wishes. We are not yet aware of his long-term plans. The question of who will pay for the various expenses incurred as a result of Mr. Marcos' exit from

the Philippines and temporary stay on U.S. facilities is under study. Any legal disputes that may arise over Mr. Marcos' possessions in the United States will be handled in accord with relevant U.S., Philippine, and international law.
