- RESPONSE TO LETTER FROM PRESIDENT REAGAN

- 1. DURING A CALL ON PRESIDENT ROYO MORNING OF MAY 24 AMBASSADOR WAS HANDED THE LETTER ADDRESSED TO PRESIDENT REAGAN IN WHICH PRESIDENT ROYO RESPONDS TO THE PRESIDENT'S VIEWS ON THE FALKLAND ISLANDS CRISIS. PRESIDENT ROYO HAS MADE THE TEXT OF THE LETTER AVAILABLE TO THE PRESS AND THE FULL TEXT IS EXPECTED TO BE PRINTED IN TOMORROW'S (MAY 25) EDITION OF ESTRELLA DE PANAMA.
- 2. EMBASSY'S TRANSLATION OF THE ORIGINAL SPANISH TEXT FOLLOWS. SPANISH TEXT TRANSMITTED 'SEPTEL. SIGNED ORIGINAL HAS BEEN POUCHED TO ARA/CEN.
- 3. BEGIN TEXT. DEAR MR. PRESIDENT. THE
 CONCERNS WHICH YOU EXPRESSED IN YOUR LETTER OF
 MAY 2 ARE MINE AS WELL. IN EFFECT,
 THE ANGLO-ARGENTINE CONFLICT IN JUST A
 SHORT TIME STOPPED BEING A BILATERAL PROBLEM
 AND, ENCOMPASSING ALL THE COUNTRIES OF THE
 AREA, HAS GRAVELY TESTED THE PRINCIPLES AND PROCEDURES
 ON WHICH THE INTERAMERICAN SYSTEM HAS
 BASED ITSELF. INDEED, A NEW ZOME OF
 INTERNATIONAL TENSION HAS COME INTO BEING, ADDING
 YET ANOTHER PROBLEM FOR THE MAINTENANCE OF WORLD
 PEACE.
- 4. AS YOU KNOW, MY COUNTRY IS, FOR HISTORICAL REASONS, PARTICULARLY SENSITIVE TO EVERYTHING WHICH HAS TO DO WITH RECUPERATION AND PRESERVA-TION OF TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY AND SOVEREIGNTY, AS WELL AS WITH THE PRINCIPLES OF LAW AND OF PEACEFUL AND CONSTRUCTIVE NEGOCIATION TO RESOLVE INTERNATIONAL DIFFERENCES AND TO RE-ESTABLISH JUSTICE IN THE RELATIONS BETWEEN STATES. IT WAS PRECISELY YOUR COUNTRY AND MINE WHICH DEMONSTRATED TO THE WORLD THAT THIS WAY IS CORRECT AND FEASIBLE, WHEN WE AGREED ON THE PROGRAM OF DECOLONIZATION CONTAINED IN THE CANAL TREATIES, WHICH ARE HOW IN THE PROCESS OF BEING IMPLEMENTED. THIS SETS THE BASIS FOR GOOD UNDERSTANDING, RESPECT, FRIENDSHIP AND COLLABORATION BETWEEN BOTH HATIONS.
- 5. WITH THAT OUR TWO COUNTRIES SHOWED THE WORLD COMMUNITY THAT TO PERSIST NOVADAYS IN COLONIAL SITUATIONS OF TERRITORIAL OCCUPATION,
 BESIDES BEING MORALLY MURTFUL, CONSTITUTES

AN UNLAWFUL ACT WHICH VIOLATES THE PEACEFUL
CDEXISTENCE AMONG MATIONS AND BECOMES A PRIMARY
CAUSE FOR FURTHER CONFLICTS. IT MEANS THAT,
IN THE COMMUNITY OF THE AMERICAS AND IN THE WORLD
COMMUNITY, COLONIALISM, THE ALIGNMENT (SIG;
ALIEMATION?) OF THE PATRIMONIAL RESOURCES OF EACH
MATION, AS WELL AS ECONOMIC INEQUALITY AND
DEPENDENCE, ARE THE CAUSE OF REPEATED CONFLICTS,
ESPECIALLY WHEN THEY ARE NOT ACCOMPANIED BY
MEGGITATIONS WHICH BRING ABOUT TIMELY AND SATISFACTORY
RESULTS IN AN EFFECTIVE MANNER.

- 6. IT IS FOR THAT REASON THAT, FOR LATIN AMERICANS, TO RESPECT THE PRINCIPLE OF LAW MEANS TO ELIMINATE THOSE CAUSES OF CONFLICT REALLY AND EFFECTIVELY, SINCE THIS IS THE MOST POSITIVE WAY TO AVOID SUCH CONFRONTATIONS.
- 7. IT IS A FACT THAT THE RESOLUTIONS ON DECOLONIZATION AGREED TO IN THE UNITED NATIONS
 HAVE BEEN DISREGARDED FOR A LONG TIME AND IN
 AN IRRITATING MANNER DURING THE BRITISH
 OCCUPATION OF THE MALVINAS AND THEIR DEPENDENCIES.
 ARGENTINA'S CONDUCT IN ORDER TO REVINDICATE
 ITS HONOR AND MATIONAL INTERESTS HAS NOT BEEN
 THE CAUSE BUT RATHER HAS BEEN THE RESULT
 OF AN UNJUST AND UNACCEPTABLE SITUATION, RENDERED
 ACUTE BY THE OBSTINATE NEGLIGENCE OF THE UNITED
 KINGDOM IN ARRIVING AT A PEACEFUL ARRANGEMENT
 AFTER LONG YEARS OF FRUITLESS NEGOTIATIOMS.
 IT HAS BEEN GREAT BRITAIN WHO HAS COMPLETELY
 ERODED THE PRINCIPLES OF LAW AS IT HAS
 DENIED NOT ONLY RESULTS BUT EVEN ANY HOPE

TO THE NEGOTIATING PROCESS.

- 8. ARGENTINA HAS ACTED IN THE LEGITIMATE DEFENSE
 OF ITS HISTORIC RIGHTS AND HAS DONE SO IN ORDER
 TO DIRECT ITS CASE AS INDICATED BY LAW AND
 INTERNATIONAL AGREEMENTS. THE USE OF VIOLENCE
 HAS CHARACTERIZED THE BRITISH RESPONSES NOT
 ONLY IN THE UNACCUSTOMED MOBILIZATION OF FORCE
 BUT ALSO IN THE HUMILIATING INTENSIFICATION OF
 HILITARY PRESSURE AND IN THE ORCHESTRATION OF
 ACTS OF ECONOMIC AGGRESSION DURING THIS NEW PERIOD
 OF NEGOTIATIONS. THE EXCESSIVE USE OF FORCE
 HAS ONCE AGAIN PLACED IN DOUBT THE SINCERITY OF
 THE BRITISH DISPOSITION TO WORK OUT A DIPLOMATIC
 SOLUTION.
- 9. THE CAUSE OF COLONIALISM, AND THE USE OF FORCE INVARIABLY ASSOCIATED WITH IT, IS A BAD CAUSE. WE LATIN AMERICANS HAVE HAD TO LAMENT THAT OUR FRIENDS IN THE UNITED STATES NOW FIND THEMSELVES IDENTIFIED WITH THAT CAUSE ON ACCOUNT OF THEIR SUPPORT FOR THE VIOLENCE WHICH THE BRITISH ARE CARRYING OUT AGAINST ARGENTINA. TO AID THE USE OF FORCE WITH ACTIONS IS NOT THE BEST WAY TO DEFEND THE PRINCIPLE OF LAW. RATHER IF THAT DECISIVE SUPPORT HAD NOT BEEN GIVEN, IT WOULD HAVE BEEN MORE FEASIBLE TO ACHIEVE A HEGOTIATED AGREEMENT FOR THE PEACEFUL SOLUTION OF THAT DISPUTE. THE SEARCH FOR A WORTHY AND JUST SOLUTION, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PRINCIPLE OF LAW, REQUIRES THE WITHORAWAL OF ALL BACKING FOR THE EXERCISE OF FORCE BY THE UNITED KINGDOM, WHICH HAS MADE IT (THE EXERCISE OF FORCE) INTO ITS PRINCIPAL NEGOTIATING ARGUMENT AND IS THE GREATEST OBSTACLE TO A DIPLOMATIC TERMINATION OF THE CONFLICT.
- 18. TO ATTEMPT TO END THE QUARREL BY MILITARY HEARS WILL RESULT ONLY IN BURDLHING THE PRESENT WITH INSULTS AND INJURIES AND IN DARKENING THE FUTURE WITH FRUSTRATIONS, RESENTMENTS AND RENEWED DISPUTES WHICH WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCE OF THE ERRORS THAT ARE NOW BEING COMMITTED.
- 11. OHE OF THESE ERRORS HAS BEEN THAT OF ABANDONING THE DOCTRINE WHICH PRESIDENT MOURCE ENUNCIATED A CENTURY AND A HALF AGO AND WHICH, DEFENDED BY ADAMS, JEFFERSON AND CLAY, WAS THE INSPIRATION AND GUIDE FOR THE FOREIGN POLICY OF SUBSEQUENT GENERATIONS OF MORTH AMERICANS. THAT DOCTRINE, WHICH ON OCCASION WAS BADLY INTERPRETED OR BADLY USED TO JUSTIFY NORTH AMERICAN INTERVENTIONS IN OUR COUNTRIES--

INTERPRETATION OR BAD USE WHICH WE WILL ALWAYS REJECT-VAS THE BULWARK FOR DEMOCRACY AND FOR THE UNITY OF THE PEOPLES OF THE HEW WORLD AGAINST THE EXPANSIONIST DESIGNS OF EXTRA-CONTINENTAL POWERS. AS SUCH IT WAS THE FOUNDATION FOR HEMISPHERIC RELATIONS THAT WERE WITHOUT PRECEDENT IN THE HISTORY OF PEOPLES, AS IT UNITED MORTH AND SOUTH IN ONE SET OF LIBERTARIAN DESIRES.

- 12. AS THE HONROE DOCTRINE HAS TODAY BEEN BROKEN BY THOSE WHO OUGHT TO HAVE BEEN ITS PRINCIPAL GUARDIANS, THE INTERESTS OF THE PEOPLES OF THE TWO AMERICAS HOW CONFRONT EACH OTHER, BY VIRTUE OF THIS PECULIAR IDENTIFICATION OF THE UNITED STATES WITH THE DEATH RATILES OF EUROPEAN COLONIALISM. ALTHOUGH IT MAY SEEM PARADOXICAL, FROM HOW ON, WE LATIN AMERICANS MUST BE THE INHERITORS AND SPOKESHEN OF THAT WISE PRINCIPLE WHICH IN TIMES PAST ILLUMINATED MOORTH AMERICAN POLICY. THAT FACT NATURALLY AFFECTS THE UNDERSTANDING WHICH WE SHALL HAVE IN THE FUTURE OF HEMISPHERIC RELATIONS.
- 13. RECOGNIZING THE AUTHENTIC RIGHTS WHICH ARGENTINA HAS TO RECOVER THE MALVINAS AND THEIR DEPENDENCIES, MY GOVERNMENT HAS ALWAYS SUPPORTED THEIR DECOLONIZATION. WITHOUT ABANDONING OUR ATTACHMENT TO PEACE, WE REPEAT THAT THE ONLY MAY TO SET THE SOLUTION ON A JURIDICAL PATH IS THROUGH THE RECOGNITION OF ARGENTINE SOVEREIGNTY AND THE OETERMINATION OF THE, RESIDUAL RIGHTS WHICH ITS OCCUPANTS MAY HAVE ACQUIRED. TO MAKE AN ATTEMPT AGAINST THIS PROCEDURE BY MEANS OF FORCE AS THE UNITED KINGDOM IS DOING CONSTITUTES AN UNNECESSARY AND UNJUSTIFIABLE AGGRESSION AGAINST A NEIGHBOR MATION, WHICH THE MAJORITY OF LATIN AMERICAN GOVERNMENTS HAS ALREADY CONDENNED. SUCH

A WIDESPREAD OUTCRY FROM THE GREAT MAJORITY OF THE NATIONS OF THIS CONTINENT WOULD DESERVE TO BE LISTENED TO BY THE UNITED STATES.

- PANAMA AND THE UNITED STATES ARE LINKED BY THE CANAL TREATIES, ONE ELEMENT OF WHICH IS A NEUTRALITY PACT WHICH WE MUCH APPRECIATE AND WHICH RESPONDS TO THE BEST INTERESTS OF BOTH NATIONS. IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS (PACT), THE PRESENCE IN MY COUNTRY OF NORTH AMERICAN MILITARY INSTALLATIONS AND PERSONNEL IS TEMPORARILY JUSTIFIED; THEY, (WORKING) TOGETHER WITH THE PANAMANIAN ARMED FORCES, OUGHT TO BE SPECIFICALLY DESTINED TO THE EXCLUSIVE PURPOSE OF PROTECTING AND DEFENDING THE PANAMA CANAL UNTIL THE LAST DAY OF 1999.
- GIVEN THE INDISSOLUBLE HISTORICAL, ETHNIC AND CULTURAL TIES WHICH BIND US WITH THE ARGENTINE PEOPLE AND THE OTHER PEOPLES OF LATIN AMERICA, AS WELL AS OUR COMMITMENT TO THEIR NATIONAL UNDERTAKING, WE ARE CONCERNED ABOUT THE STRICT COMPLIANCE WITH THE LETTER AND SPIRIT OF THE CANAL TREATIES WITH REGARDS ALSO TO MILITARY ACTIVITIES OR (ACTIVITIES) RELATED TO MILITARY ACTIVITIES, WHICH MIGHT TAKE

- MY GOVERNMENT REITERATES ITS BEST DISPOSITION TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE DIALOGUE AND THE UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE PARTIES, FOR THE CAUSE OF PEACE AND THE ELABORATION OF AGREEMENTS FOR THE DEFINITIVE ELIMINA-TION OF THE CAUSES OF THE CONFLICT. WE THEREFORE WELCOME YOUR REQUEST THAT WE SHOULD MAKE KNOWN OUR VIEWS AND ENCOURAGE THE EXCHANGE OF VIEWS IN THE DIFFICULT DAYS IN WHICH WE ARE LIVING.
