REQUEST: Official working visit with FRG Chancellor Helmut Kohl.

PURPOSE: To obtain joint statement which outlines common US-FRG interests in improving NATO defense. Statement will also reaffirm joint interest in equitable, verifiable arms reduction and in improving East-West relations.

BACKGROUND: Chancellor Kohl would come to Washington expressly for this meeting. He views it as a unique opportunity to reaffirm US-FRG ties for the President's second term and to renew USG support for his government. The NSC has requested the Department's recommendation as to the appropriateness of asking the President to submit a contribution to a book honoring CSU Chairman Franz-Josef Strauss on the latter's 70th birthday. While such publications are common in the FRG on major birthdays, and Strauss may certainly be considered a friend of the U.S. worthy of recognition, we believe that such a commitment from the President could set an unfortunate precedent and be exploited for domestic political reasons in the FRG. As an alternative, we would propose a short message of congratulations from Vice President Bush at some point closer to the event.

Please give us a full report on the possible conference and its participants by February 6. If there is a conference, we would also appreciate your views on what sort of Presidential/White House involvement might be appropriate -- if any. (C)

On a separate matter, we also received a query about the President possibly joining with other Heads of Government/State in contributing chapters to a book honoring Franz-Joseph Strauss, CSU Party Chairman, on his 70th birthday. We understand the book would be published in September. While the President could not be expected to contribute a chapter, we may want to consider a brief foreword, though we have questions about the appropriateness of even this. Please provide us, as well, by February 6 the Department's recommendation with regard to the Strauss book. Thank you. (C)



Dear Helmut:

I read with interest your letter of March 29 and welcomed your thoughts and counsel, both on the various issues now under negotiation with the Soviets in Geneva and on the Strategic Defense Initiative. I very much appreciate the support that you and your government have consistently provided us in our negotiating efforts at Geneva.

We are fully in agreement that our foremost priority in the new negotiations with the Soviet Union must be, as you say, "the enhancement of strategic stability between the United States and the Soviet Union and the attainment of substantial reductions in intercontinental strategic and intermediate-range nuclear missiles." I have given my negotiators substantial flexibility, building upon the work already accomplished in previous negotiations and the Alliance consultations that have paralleled them. We are ready to take important steps toward an agreement in Geneva, provided that the Soviet Union is equally prepared to move forward.

It is still too early to tell whether, after an initial period of testing us for political advantage, the Soviets will be ready to get down to serious bargaining. It is too early, as well, to determine whether recent changes in the leadership in Moscow will have any positive effect in this regard. We naturally were disappointed with the Soviet resurfacing of their moratorium proposal, particularly with the way the proposal was moved into the public arena. But we will, of course, persist in our own efforts, both in private and in public, to encourage a positive evolution in Soviet policy. I am sure that your own diplomatic efforts have the same purpose. I believe that we must continue these efforts, while at the same time demonstrating patience, consistency and Alliance solidarity in the broad lines of our policy.

At the same time, with respect to INF, I agree that we need to continue our ongoing pattern of private discussion within the Alliance of the steps we might take at subsequent stages, should the Soviets indicate a serious willingness to move forward. Your views in this regard will, as always, be given great weight. We have therefore listened with interest to the ideas your representatives have put forward within the Special Consultative Group on this issue, and we look forward to discussing them in greater detail within that forum.

I also appreciated your thoughtful statement of support for our strategic defense research program. I share the importance that you attach to continuing consultations between us. We certainly welcome the possibility of participation on a bilateral basis in our research by those Allies who wish to join us. We also look forward to benefiting from consultation on the longer-term issues which would be raised should the defensive technologies under study prove feasible in coming years.

Finally, I fully support the statement of your government that "the strategy of flexible response must remain fully valid for the Alliance as long as there is no more effective alternative for achieving the goal of preventing war." To sustain this strategy, the Alliance must continue strengthening its conventional deterrent forces, as we agreed during our last meeting here in Washington, while it also pursues arms control agreements in the conventional area.

I look forward to continuing our exchange when we meet again this coming month.

Dear Mr. President:

It has come to my attention that the government of West Germany has invited you to visit the Nazi concentration camp Dachau, and you have declined. While I would suggest that such a visit would be most appropriate at a time when the world is commemorating the 40th anniversary of the liberation of many Nazi concentration camps, what has truly disturbed me is the lack of sensitivity inherent in your reason for declining. You stated that while visiting West Germany, you wanted to "renew friendships, not recount the past."

Surely you must realize that such a statement, with its insinuation that it is time to put the horrors of the Holocaust behind us, is anathema to all Jews. Across the globe, the Jewish people have struggled to teach and sensitize the world to the fact that the madness that resulted in the death of six million Jews during the Holocaust still threatens us all. Evil was not obliterated during World War II, and unless we work to preserve the memory of the war's horror, we risk its repetition. The government of West Germany has come to realize this, which is why it has preserved the Dachau concentration camp in remembrance of those who were slaughtered there.

Trying to remind the world of the atrocities of the Holocaust should be perceived as an act of generosity, an attempt to save the world from another disaster.

As a child of Holocaust survivors, I urge you to reconsider your refusal to visit Dachau.

It is one of the objectives of the Committee on the Budget of the House of Representatives to provide the public with a clear and concise statement of the budget for each fiscal year. This report is intended to provide such a statement for the fiscal year 1965. The report is divided into two parts: the first part contains a summary of the budget and the second part contains a detailed statement of the budget.

The total amount of the budget for fiscal year 1965 is \$100 billion. This amount is divided into three main categories: the first category is for the Department of Defense, the second category is for the Department of State, and the third category is for the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. The Department of Defense budget is \$40 billion, the Department of State budget is \$10 billion, and the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare budget is \$50 billion.

The following table shows the breakdown of the budget for each department:

Department of Defense: \$40 billion
Department of State: \$10 billion
Department of Health, Education, and Welfare: \$50 billion

Dear Ms. Riley:

Thank you for your telegram to President Reagan of November 27, which has been referred to this office for reply. I have not seen the "Los Angeles Times" article which you mention, but it is true that the Federal Republic of Germany has paid out millions of dollars in compensation to survivors of the Holocaust, most of whom live in Israel or the United States.

The program began in the 1950's and was extended several times. While new applications for restitution payments are not being accepted any longer, beneficiaries covered by the plan are still receiving money. A smaller program continues to take new applications for certain kinds of medical benefits, but the maximum benefits available are fairly small. Payment is made directly by the Federal German government to the beneficiaries.

Should you need more information, I suggest you contact the Consulate General of the Federal Republic of Germany in Los Angeles, which administers the program locally. The address is 6435 Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles, California, 90048. The telephone number is (213) 852-0441.

PRESIDENTIAL REMARKS: DEPARTURE STATEMENT
CHANCELLOR HELMUT KOHL OF GERMANY
FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 30, 1984

Chancellor Kohl and I met today to discuss a wide range of issues. Characteristic of our relationship, our talks were friendly, useful, and productive. There is a high level of cooperation and personal rapport between us. As always, I was glad to have such thorough consultations with the Chancellor and his government.

I call your attention to the joint statement issued as a result of today's discussions. It underlines our common commitment to improving East-West relations, improving NATO's conventional defenses, and intensifying our search for arms reductions.

We place special emphasis on overcoming the barriers that divide Europe, a division keenly felt by those living in Central Europe. I was pleased to reaffirm to Chancellor Kohl today our support for his efforts to lower the barriers between the two German states.

The close relationship between the United States and the Federal Republic is enhancing the opportunity for improved East-West relations. This is demonstrated by our successful efforts to carry out the NATO dual track decision to seek genuine arms reductions agreements and modernize our defenses. Today, Chancellor Kohl and I firmly agreed that we will continue to place a high priority on the search for a responsible means of

reducing the arsenals of nuclear weapons that now threaten humankind. We call upon all men and women of good will to join us.

The solidity of the German-American partnership remains a crucial building block in the search for world peace. The people of our two countries blessed with liberty and abundance have a great desire for peace. Chancellor Kohl and I share that desire and we will continue to work diligently to bring about a more peaceful world.

The German-American relationship, now in its fourth century, must never be taken for granted. We launched a major initiative in 1982 to nurture an appreciation of ties between us and to enhance German-American contacts at all levels. Chancellor Kohl and I noted today the enthusiastic public response in our respective countries, especially among our younger citizens, to the growing exchanges between our peoples.

In sum, our talks confirm the closeness of our views and our commitment to work together. It was a pleasure to have Chancellor Kohl, Foreign Minister Genscher, and all of his party here. I wish them a smooth journey home, and I look forward to the next time we can get together. Thank you.
