The economic attaché from the Soviet embassy has requested a meeting with Martin Feldstein. The general consensus here, at State, is that Feldstein should not meet with such a low-ranking officer, but should offer that the attaché meet with one of Feldstein's junior assistants.

This is a matter of reciprocity. The access of our officers in Moscow to high Soviet officials is extremely limited, and until it improves, we should not give the Soviets here any special favors.

HARRIMAN CALLS FOR REAGAN-ANDROPOV SUMMIT

WASHINGTON, JUNE 16, REUTER - FORMER AMBASSADOR AVERELL HARRIMAN SAID TODAY A SUMMIT MEETING BETWEEN PRESIDENTS REAGAN AND YURI ANDROPOV WAS NECESSARY TO BREAK A NEAR U.S.-SOVIET IMPASSE OVER NUCLEAR ARMS CONTROL.

"I BELIEVE THAT WE HAVE REACHED THE MOMENT WHERE NEGOTIATION CAN BEST BE ADVANCED BY COMMUNICATION AT A WELL-PREPARED SUMMIT MEETING," HARRIMAN TOLD THE SENATE FOREIGN RELATIONS COMMITTEE.

BUT ANOTHER FORMER U.S. AMBASSADOR TO MOSCOW, THOMAS WATSON, AGREED WITH SECRETARY OF STATE GEORGE SHULTZ'S STATEMENT TO THE COMMITTEE YESTERDAY THAT A SUMMIT COULD BE DANGEROUS.

SHULTZ TOLD THE COMMITTEE A SUMMIT WOULD DASH HOPES FOR PEACE IN THE PUBLIC MIND IF IT WERE CONDUCTED WITHOUT ASSURANCES THAT IT WOULD PRODUCE RESULTS.

WATSON SAID A SUMMIT MIGHT TURN INTO "NOTHING BUT AN ARGUMENT" BETWEEN REAGAN AND ANDROPOV IF THE TWO SUPERPOWERS WERE AS DIVIDED OVER NUCLEAR ARMS CONTROL AS THEY APPEARED TO BE.

HE SAID THE SENATE COMMITTEE SHOULD TAKE THE LEAD IN FORCING A CHANGE IN POLICY AS IT DID IN ENDING U.S. INVOLVEMENT IN THE VIETNAM WAR.

"INTENSE, FRANK AND CONTROVERSIAL HEARINGS MIGHT BE ONE TOOL IF THEY LEAD TO EFFECTIVE RESTRAINTS ON DANGEROUS POLICY," HE SAID.

HARRIMAN WAS U.S. AMBASSADOR TO THE SOVIET UNION FROM 1943 TO 1946 AND BECAME A LEADING U.S. EXPERT ON SOVIET AFFAIRS. WATSON WAS AMBASSADOR TO MOSCOW FROM 1979 TO 1981.

HARRIMAN MET ANDROPOV ON JUNE 2 AND RESTATED TO THE COMMITTEE HIS CONVICTION THAT THE SOVIET PRESIDENT WANTS MUTUAL U.S.-SOVIET ACTION TO REDUCE THE DANGER OF CONFRONTATION.


