(TEXT) MANY REPORTS AND REACTIONS WHICH HAVE ARRIVED FROM OVERSEAS TODAY ARE CONNECTED WITH THE EVENTS IN CENTRAL AMERICA. THE WHITE HOUSE AND THE PENTAGON ARE STEPPING UP THEIR ACTIONS THERE. THE AIRCRAFT CARRIER RANGER AND SEVEN OTHER U.S. WARSHIPS ARE PATROLLING CLOSE TO THE SHORES OF CENTRAL AMERICA. THE U.S. BATTLESHIP NEW JERSEY IS HEADING THERE FROM THAILAND. IT IS ACCOMPANIED BY FOUR WARSHIPS. ANOTHER NAVAL GROUP, HEADED BY THE AIRCRAFT CARRIER CORAL SEA, WILL BE TRANSFERRED TO THE CARIBBEAN SEA. MAJOR MANEUVERS WILL COMMENCE IN CENTRAL AMERICA IN AUGUST. IT IS EXPECTED THAT THEY WILL LAST FOR AT LEAST HALF A YEAR AND THAT UP TO 5,000 U.S. SERVICEMEN WILL TAKE PART IN THEM.
