ON APR 20 THE MILITARY JUNTA ISSUED A COMMUNIQUE RE-GARDING THE STATUS OF THE NEGOTIATIONS. IN THE STATEMENT THE JUNTA ACCUSES UK OF AGGRESSIVE CONDUCT AND RELATES THE EVENTS, WHICH FROM THE GUA PERSPECTIVE, LED TO OCCUPA-TION OF THE SOUTH GEORGIAS, SOUTH SANDWICH AND MALVINAS. THE COMMUNIQUE THEN GOES ON TO STATE THAT THE CURRENT TALKS WITH SECRETARY HAIG HAVE, "AS A FINAL AND UNRELINQUISHABLE DBJECTIVE THE CONSOLIDATION AND RECOGNITION OF ARGENTINE SOVEREIGNTY OVER THE ISLANDS." ARGEN-TINE, ACCORDING TO THE JUNTA STATEMENT "HAS ALWYAS BEEN DISPOSED TO CONSIDER THE INTERESTS OF THE IN-HABITANS OF THE ISLANDS" AND "WILL NOT HESITATE TO SATISFY ACCEPTABLE BRITISH INTERESTS, PROVIDED THEY DO NOT INTERFERE WITH THE AFFIRMATION OF HER (ARGEN-TINA'S) SOVEREIGNTY AND ARE NOT EXPRESSED AS A MILITARY THREAT." 2. THE CUMMUNIQUE GOES ON: "IN CUNVERSATIONS WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE, WE DISCUSSED FORMULAS THAT WOULD PERMIT ALL OF THESE SITUATIONS. WE CON-

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SIDERED GUARANTEES AND ARRANGEMENTS THAT CONTEMPLATE THE PARTICULAR REQUIREMENTS OF A LIMITED PERIOD OF TRANSITION SO THAT, AFTER SUCH PERIOD, THE RESULT CAN BE NONE OTHER THAN THE FULL EXERCISE OF OUR SOVERFIGNTY." "AFTER REFERRING TO UNIFIED NATIONAL SUPPORT ON THIS ISSUE, THE COMMUNIQUE STATES THAT THE GOA MUST "RESIST ANY ATTEMPT TO CONDITION ITS TITLE OR IGNORE ITS RIGHTS." IN THE JUNTA STATES: "AT THE SAME TIME THAT WE MAKE CLEAR OUR INVARIABLE DIS-POSITION TO NEGOTIATE HONORABLE FORMULAS FOR A SOLU-TION, IT IS NECESSARY THAT WE UNDERLINE WITH THE SAME FIRMNESS THE WILLINGNESS OF (ARGENTINA'S) AUTHORITIES AND HER PEOPLE TO DEFEND AND INSURE RECOGNITION OF HER SOVEREIGN RIGHTS." 3. FONMIN COSTA MENDEZ TOLD THE CABINET THAT IN CON-VERSATIONS WITH THE SECRETARY OF STATE THE GUA HAD "NEVER DISCUSSED SOVEREIGNTY, SHARED GOVERNMENT OR BRITISH RIGHTS EXTENDING TO THE ANTARCTIC." THE CAB-INET MET EVEING OF APR 20 TO HEAR COSTA MENDEZ BRIEF ON THE STATUS OF NEGOTIATIONS, ON THE OTHER HAND, AIR FORCE CINC, BRIGADIER LAMI DOTO, TOLD PRESS AT PUERTO ISLAS MALVINAS (EX=STANLEY) UN APRIL 20 THAT A "BIPARTITE GOVERNMENT" SHARED WITH THE UK "WOULD BE ACCEPTABLE TO ARGENTINA PROVIDED THAT THERE ARE (IN THE AGREEMENT) SUME CLAUSES THAT RATIFY ARGENTINE SOVEREIGNTY OVER THE MALVINAS." 4. MEANWHILE, IN AN ATTEMPT TO MAINTAIN SUPPORT FOR THE GOA'S CONDUCT OF THE SOUTH ATLANTIC DISPUTE, AND PERHAPS TEST THE WATERS FOR SOME OF THE IDEAS DISCUSSED WITH SECRETARY HAIG, ON APR 20, MINISTER OF INTERIOR, GENERAL ALFREDO SAIN JEAN BRIEFED LEADERS OF 13 POLITICAL PARTIES, INCLUDING PERUNISTS AND RADICALS. ACCORDING TO B.A. DAILY "LA NACIUN", SAINT JEAN AND SECRETARY OF THE PRESIDENCY GENERAL IGLESIAS DESCRIBED IN CONSIDERABLE DETAIL THE CUNTENTS OF "WORKING PAPERS" DISCUSSED WITH THE SECRETARY, GALTIERI'S CONVERSATIONS WITH PRESIDENT REAGAN AND ALLEGED PRESSURE THAT THE USG WAS BT #2401

WITH RESPECT TO ARGENTINA'S GUALS IN THE DAS, SAINT JEAN REPORTEDLY TOLD THE POLITICIANS THAT ARGENTINA WAS NOT SANGUINE ABOUT THE POSSIBILITY OF OBTAINING APPROVAL FOR THE APPLICATION OF THE INTER-AMERICAN TREATY ON RECIPROCAL ASSISTANCE. NEVERTHELESS, HE REPORTEDLY SAID THAT THE "ARGEN-TINE GOVERNMENT IS INTERESTED IN THE POLITICAL VALUE OF A HARD-FOUGHT VOTE AND BECAUSE IT WOULD SERVE AS A WARNING TO THE U.S." SEPARATELY, THE MORNING DAILIES REPORTED THAT FONMIN COSTA MENDEZ WOULD BE TRAVELING TO WASHINGTON (DATE AND FLIGHT NUT REVEALED) TO ATTEND DAS SESSIONS NEXT WEEK. 6. IN A STRONGLY-WORDED STATEMENT, ARGENTINE COUNCIL OF BISHOPS HAS CALLED FOR A PEACEFUL RESULU-

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TION OF THE CONFLICT WITH GREAT BRITAIN, WHILE SUPPORTING ARGENTINE OCCUPATION OF THE ISLANDS, THEY RECALLED POPE JOHN PAUL II'S WORLDS "WAR IS THE MOST CUREL AND INEFFECTIVE MEANS FOR RESOLVING DIS-PUTES" AND URGED THAT "PEACE BE WON AT THE NEGOTIA-TING TABLE." THE BISHOPS, WHO WERE MEETING IN A REGULARLY-SCHEDULED PLENARY, EXHURTED THE POPULA-TION TO PRAY THAT THE LORD WILL BESTOW "PRUDENCE AND STRENGHT UPON OUR LEADERS SO THAT THEY CHAN WIN THE PEACE." FINALLY, REFERRING TO THE POPE'S LETTER TO PRESIDENT GALTIERI, WHICH WAS READ FROM ALL THE PULPITS IN ARGENTINA LST SUNDAY, THE BISHOPS EX-PRESSED HOPE THAT "THE GOVERNMENT (GDA) WILL TAKE ADVANTAGE OF ALL POSSIBILITIES THAT CAN LEAD TO A JUST AND PEACEFUL SULUTION." 7. ARGENTINE GOVERNOR OF THE MALVINAS, GENERAL MARIO BENJAMIN MENENDEZ TOLD THE PRESS APR 20 "I AM NOT LEAVING THE ISLANDS." IN A PARTICULARLY! TOUGH STATEMENT, MENENDEZ SAID THAT HIS SOLIDERS ARE "EAGER TO ENTER INTO COMBAT TO DEFEND ARGENTINE SOVEREIGNTY" AND "THEY ARE PREPARED TO FACE WHAT-EVER MAY COME." HE NOTED THAT "GENERAL GALTIERI AND THE JUNTA DESIGNATED ME AS GUVERNOR. I DID NOT COME AS A TOURIST. I AM NOT LEAVING." 8. LOCAL TV AND RADIO IS REPURTING THAT THE BRITISH FLEET HAS REDUCED ITS SAILING SPEED TO EIGHT KNOTS,

PRESUMABLY TO ALLOW MORE TIME FOR THE SECRETARY'S EFFORTS TO BEAR FRUIT,
