MEMORANDUM

As you will recall, I made a trip to Jamaica on behalf of the United States Youth Counsel. In Jamaica I met Ms. Monica Ladd, the Assistant Political Affairs Officer for the United States Embassy. Prior to her work at the Embassy, she was a member of Andrew Young's personal staff at the United Nations. In her briefing to us on the situation in Jamaica, Ms. Ladd was insistent that the Youth Council visit the People's National Party Youth Arm. She felt that the PNP Youth were more representative of the Jamaican people than Mr. Seaga's ruling Jamaican Labor Party. It is interesting to note that as we were introduced to the leaders, they prefaced their names with "Comrade". The PNP consider themselves the vanguard of the PNP and a part of the International Socialist struggle. To be a party member in good standing, one must exercise party discipline and attend regularly scheduled classes in Marxist-Leninist philosophies. Enclosed is literature published by the PNP Youth and the PNP so that you might have a better understanding where this party is coming from.

We attended a meeting with Kingsley Sangster, a member of Parliament, and Ms. Daphne Adams, both of whom work with the Youth Ministry of Jamaica. We discussed Jamaica sponsoring a Youth Conference prior to the celebration of the International Year of the Youth in 1985. The Jamaican officials expressed an interest in having a conference for youth from democratic countries. Ms. Ladd informed us, that from her experience with the United Nations, you could not exclude other countries or your conference would not be deemed legitimate by the international community, and wanted to know how we defined democratic communities. Mrs. Adams answered that we all know what Democracy is and in her opinion, it is apparent to the rest of the world also.

One of the Jamaican labor leaders with whom we visited, mentioned an incident at a public meeting where Ms. Ladd privately told one of the Cabinet members that he and his government were not doing the right things for his people and how could they claim to be doing so.

In our private conversations with Ms. Ladd she said she did not hold the Seaga government in very high esteem and did not feel that they could accomplish the goals that they were trying to. She felt that it was just a matter of time before the PNP regained control.

Finally, as a matter of observation: the people we visited both in and out of the government, youth and adults, in Trinidad, Tabago, Jamaica and Barbados all made one point very clear -- if the United States cannot make their program work in Jamaica, it will not work anywhere in the Caribbean. I think this is very important given Seaga's upfront stance against totalitarian regimes and especially wanting them out of the Caribbean. To make our program work, we should be sending our best people who believe in our program to Jamaica.

IT IS A GREAT PLEASURE TO WELCOME
YOU HERE THIS MORNING. WE ARE HERE TO
HONOR ONE OF OUR HEMISPHERE'S FOREMOST
STATESMEN AND MY GOOD FRIEND, PRIME
MINISTER EDWARD SEAGA OF JAMAICA. PRIME
MINISTER SEAGA IS BEING AWARDED THE 1982
AMERICAN FRIENDSHIP MEDAL BY THE
FREEDOMS FOUNDATION FOR HIS EFFORTS "TO
FURTHER DEMOCRATIC INSTITUTIONS AND THE
FREE MARKET ECONOMY AND FOR HIS
COURAGEOUS LEADERSHIP IN THE CAUSE OF
FREEDOM FOR ALL PEOPLE."

FEW PEOPLE ARE MORE DESERVING OF
THIS TRIBUTE THAN PRIME MINISTER SEAGA.
PEOPLE OFTEN SAY FREEDOM IS A WORTHY
IDEAL, AND IT WORKS.

THE PROOF OF THIS AXIOM IS REFLECTED IN THE ACHIEVEMENTS IN JAMAICA OF THE MAN WE ARE HONORING TODAY:

-- BEFORE PRIME MINISTER SEAGA, THERE WAS VIOLENCE AND LAWLESSNESS; NOW THERE IS PEACE AND GROWING RESPECT FOR THE LAW;

-- BEFORE THERE WAS DESPAIR ABOUT THE FUTURE; / NOW THERE IS HOPE AND EXPECTATION OF BETTER TIMES AHEAD;

-- IN THE RECENT PAST THE ECONOMY WAS DECLINING; / NOW, THROUGH FREE ENTERPRISE, IT IS GROWING; AND

-- A SHORT TIME AGO FEW NEW JOBS WERE BEING CREATED; / NOW THERE ARE SIGNIFICANT EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES.

WITHOUT THE POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC FREEDOM CHARACTERISTIC OF DEMOCRATIC SOCIETIES, THESE RESULTS WOULD HAVE BEEN IMPOSSIBLE.

JAMAICA IS DEMONSTRATING TO ITS NEIGHBORS, WHO SHARE ITS STRUCTURAL ECONOMIC PROBLEMS AND RESULTING POLITICAL POLARIZATION, THAT CONDITIONS OF FREEDOM AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY LEAD TO GREATER PROSPERITY AND PEACE FOR ALL.

PRIME MINISTER SEAGA'S ACCOMPLISHMENTS ARE NOT LIMITED TO WHAT HE HAS DONE IN JAMAICA IN JUST OVER 2 YEARS. / HE HAS LONG OPPOSED TOTALITARIAN INROADS IN THE CARIBBEAN BASIN. / HE HAS FOUGHT FOR THE ADHERENCE OF BASIN STATES TO THE PRINCIPLES OF FREE ELECTIONS, RESPECT FOR BASIC HUMAN RIGHTS AND OTHER DEMOCRATIC IDEALS THAT WE ALL CHERISH.

LONG-TERM PROSPERITY CANNOT BE ACHIEVED WITHOUT INTERNAL CONDITIONS OF POLITICAL FREEDOM AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY.

BUT EXTERNAL ASSISTANCE IS OFTEN NECESSARY TO HELP OVERCOME STRUCTURAL ECONOMIC PROBLEMS THAT IMPEDE DEVELOPMENT. THIS IS PARTICULARLY TRUE IN CARIBBEAN BASIN NATIONS WHOSE SMALL ECONOMIES ARE ESPECIALLY VULNERABLE TO EXTERNAL SHOCKS. PRIME MINISTER SEAGA'S IDEAS ABOUT THE NEED FOR OUTSIDE TRADE AND INVESTMENT INCENTIVES TO FOSTER THE REGION'S ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT WERE AN IMPORTANT INTELLECTUAL FORCE CONTRIBUTING TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF MY CARIBBEAN BASIN INITIATIVE (CBI) PROPOSAL TO CONGRESS LAST YEAR. PRIME MINISTER SEAGA HAS BEEN THE CBI'S MOST PERSISTENT AND ELOQUENT CARIBBEAN ADVOCATE. I AM DEEPLY DISAPPOINTED THAT THE CBI DID NOT PASS THE SENATE LAST DECEMBER. LATE LAST WEEK I SENT UP TO CONGRESS CBI LEGISLATION. IT IS ONE OF MY HIGHEST PRIORITIES.

I AM HOPEFUL IT WILL PASS QUICKLY IN THIS SESSION. THE CONGRESS KNOWS THIS LEGISLATION IS ESSENTIAL TO HELP THE BASIN COUNTIES COPE WITH ECONOMIC DIFFICULTIES NOT OF THEIR OWN MAKING IF THEIR PEOPLE ARE TO HAVE A BETTER FUTURE.

IN GIVING THIS PRESTIGIOUS AWARD TO PRIME MINISTER SEAGA, THE FREEDOMS FOUNDATION IS RECOGNIZING A TRUE FRIEND OF PEOPLE EVERYWHERE WHO DESIRE A BETTER LIFE THROUGH FREEDOM AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY. FOR THAT REASON HE IS ALSO A FRIEND OF THE UNITED STATES. IT IS NOW MY GREAT PLEASURE TO PRESENT DR. ROBERT MILLER, THE PRESIDENT OF THE FREEDOMS FOUNDATION, WHO WILL PRESENT THE AMERICAN FRIENDSHIP MEDAL TO PRIME MINISTER SEAGA.

David told me this morning that P.M. Seaga has agreed to Unify the Rates in December. David feels this is very good since Seaga had never before said that he would 'unify' P.M. Seaga is not prepared to 'float the rates'

After seeing the President David went over to see the World Bank people. They are not optimistic about Jamaica's "Compliance"

David has suggested to Seaga that Seaga call on a 'world financial figure' (suggesting Gordon Richardson-former head of Bank of England) to come to Jamaica and to advise on tough steps that need to be taken. This would permit Seaga to do the tough things he must do.

David Rockefeller thought it would be good for the President to raise the Financial Question in the following manner:

Attached (Tab I) is a proposed response to Mr. Rockefeller's correspondence to you of December 2, 1983 (Tab II). His letter references:

- Gratitude for pictures of our meeting with President.
- Encouragement over developments in Jamaica and his pleasure with having been of service.
- Recent return from presiding over seventh annual conference on the Caribbean and announcement of his new capacity as Chairman of a new affiliate of the Americas Society, the Caribbean/Central American Action.
- Praise for the Grenada mission.

Your response addresses the above subjects and highlights the benefits of private/public sector cooperation on mutually held objectives in the region. In a related action coming over today, we have proposed that you schedule a meeting with a group from the Council of the Americas (another affiliate of the Americas Society). We recommend that you build in sufficient lead time for our Directorate to acquire and analyze a new study of the Council on Western Hemisphere debt so that we can prepare substantive talking points. In addition, we propose that you consider "reshaping" the original request for a dinner meeting with some two dozen Council members followed by a short presentation/response by you. This approach may be time consuming and potentially awkward. We, therefore, recommend inviting six Council members to meet with you in the West Wing, perhaps over lunch.

That you sign the attached response to Mr. Rockefeller (Tab I).


Dear Mr. McFarlane:
