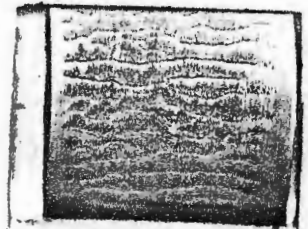
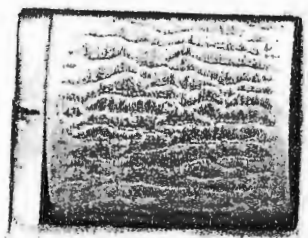

Subject: Talking Points for Mrs. Reagan's Meeting
with Mariapia Fanfani, May 12, 1981, 4:00 p.m.

Mariapia Fanfani is the wife of Amintore Fanfani, the veteran Christian Democrat politician, former Prime Minister of Italy, and currently President of the Italian Senate. In contrast to the spouses of most Italian political leaders, Mrs. Fanfani is herself an influential and highly visible figure in Italian public life.

Mrs. Fanfani was in the United States when the November 1980 earthquake struck southern Italy. She traveled from coast to coast speaking in many fora to various Italian-American organizations and to volunteer groups. Her efforts bore fruit as contributions to help earthquake victims poured into voluntary agency coffers.

Mrs. Fanfani wrote to Mrs. Reagan in early April to express her shock and indignation at the attempt on the President's life. Embassy Rome delivered Mrs. Reagan's reply last week.

Attached are talking points for Mrs. Reagan's use during her meeting with Mrs. Fanfani.

May 12, 1981, 4:00 p.m.

-- THANK YOU FOR YOUR KIND MESSAGE OF SUPPORT FOLLOWING THE ATTEMPT ON THE PRESIDENT'S LIFE. I AM SURE YOU'LL BE HAPPY TO KNOW THAT HE IS WELL ON THE WAY TO COMPLETE RECOVERY, AND IS DOING MORE AND MORE EACH DAY.

-- THERE IS CONTINUED CONCERN AND SYMPATHY IN THE U.S. FOR THE VICTIMS OF LAST NOVEMBER'S EARTHQUAKE IN SOUTHERN ITALY. OUR AGENCY FOR INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT IS WORKING WITH ITALIAN OFFICIALS IN GETTING OUR OFFICIAL PROGRAM (\$50 MILLION) UNDERWAY.

-- AID IS SELECTING SITES FOR SCHOOLS SO THAT THE CHILDREN IN THE EARTHQUAKE ZONE CAN RESUME THEIR EDUCATION UNDER FAVORABLE CIRCUMSTANCES. AS YOU WELL KNOW THE VOLUNTARY AGENCIES AND ITALIAN-AMERICAN ORGANIZATIONS ARE PROVIDING GENEROUS ASSISTANCE AND COORDINATING THEIR PROGRAMS. OUR EMBASSY IN ROME AND OUR AID PEOPLE IN NAPLES ARE COOPERATING IN THAT COORDINATION LEADING TO BEST USE OF U.S. FUNDS COLLECTED.

-- YOUR EFFORTS HERE ON BEHALF OF EARTHQUAKE VICTIMS HAVE BEEN HIGHLY PRAISED. YOUR HOSPITALITY TO THE OFFICIAL AND PRIVATE U.S. DELEGATIONS WHICH HAVE TRAVELED TO ITALY IS MOST APPRECIATED.

Secretary of the Italian Liberal Party

Valerio Zanone, Secretary of Italy's small but influential Liberal Party, plans to visit Washington May 11-13. He has asked for an opportunity to call on the Vice President. The Department regards such a call as desirable, but not essential to the conduct of our policy with Italy. Accordingly, we recommend against it.

We do, however, recommend that Admiral Murphy or another of the Vice President's staff meet with Zanone. We understand that Admiral Murphy met with Giovanni Spadolini, Secretary of Italy's small Republican Party. We would like to maintain a degree of symmetry in the appointments of the two of them.

The Italian Liberal Party, unlike U.S. parties of the same name, is located toward the right of the Italian political spectrum. It is the Italian party most devoted to the free enterprise system, with a record of devotion to the interests of the West and friendship for the United States. Although not a member of Prime Minister Forlani's governing coalition, it supports the government on key issues from outside, and is a potential member of Italy's next government.

BRIEFING PAPER
FOR
FIRST LADY'S MEETING WITH MRS. FANFANI
4:00 p.m., May 12, 1981

Background. Maria Pia Fanfani is an exceptional politician's wife in Italy. Her husband, Amantore Fanfani, is a well known veteran Christian Democrat, a former prime minister of Italy, and now President of the Senate. However, Mrs. Fanfani has earned her own reputation as an influential and engaged public figure, especially in humanitarian causes. She happened to be traveling in the United States in November, 1980, at the time of the earthquake which devastated southern Italy. She immediately undertook a cross-country effort to raise private donations for disaster relief efforts. Since then she has continued to work for this cause, and has become the best known and most influential Italian figure in the private disaster relief effort. On Friday she will be receiving an award in San Francisco from the Italian-American Foundation for her work, and will be honored at Candlestick Park on Sunday.

Italian Disaster Emergency Assistance (IDEA). This umbrella organization begun by Lieutenant Governor Mario Cuomo of New York, acts to coordinate the various private groups participating in the earthquake relief effort. John Volpe is the national chairman, Gino Paulucci the international chairman, and the honorary co-chairmen are Vice President Bush and former Vice President Mondale. Mrs. Fanfani works with this organization, and has hosted its visiting delegations in her own home.

Official Disaster Assistance to Italy. Initially the United States contributed \$5 million for immediate disaster relief. Currently the Agency for International Development (AID) is administering a \$50 million program of reconstruction funding. One of the most important reconstruction efforts is the rebuilding of schools in the earthquake area. The official efforts are coordinated with the contributions and work of private organizations such as IDEA through the U.S. embassy in Rome and U.S. officials in Naples.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS

-- Acknowledgment of Mrs. Fanfani's important personal efforts to bring assistance to the victims of the earthquake in southern Italy.

-- Acknowledgment of Mrs. Fanfani's message of support when the President was wounded. Mrs. Fanfani would be interested in hearing the progress the President is making in recovering from the wound. Italy itself is coping with a vicious campaign of violence and terrorism. Recently, for example, Mr. Cirillo, a prominent politician in Naples, was kidnapped, and his bodyguards killed. The government has made considerable progress in combatting the terrorists without infringing on citizens' personal freedoms.

-- Acknowledgment of the staunch ally that Italy has been to the United States, despite the many changes of government and domestic problems. Last week's meeting of the North Atlantic Council in Rome (Secretary Haig attended for the United States) produced an impressive display of Alliance unity, in which Italy played a key role.

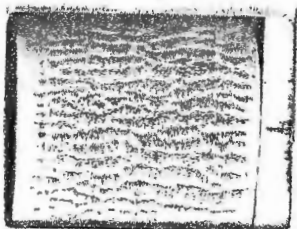
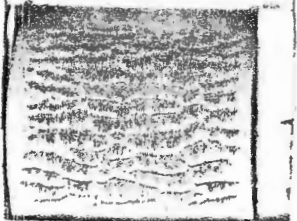

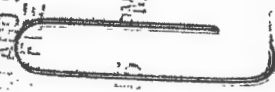

Subject: Invitation to Former Italian Prime Minister
Giulio Andreotti to Visit the U.S.

The Department recommends against a presidential letter offering to meet with Andreotti. What is seen as a simple expression of friendship here becomes a Presidential invitation and important political tool in Italy.

Andreotti is an able politician and aspires to the Presidency. We should maintain close contact with him, and it might be advantageous for the President to see Andreotti when he is here in the autumn. That is a matter to be evaluated then in the light of intervening political developments in Italy.

At the present time, however, the Italians are in the process of forming a new government, with competition among and within the coalition parties. Andreotti's faction has supported closer relations with the Communist Party and is currently frozen out of top government posts. A Presidential letter at this time could be interpreted as support in the current maneuvering.

Moreover, President Pertini has a standing request to meet with President Reagan. The new Italian Prime Minister will surely make an early approach, as will the Foreign Minister. In the circumstances, we do not believe an advance invitation to Andreotti would be appropriate.

As usual I write to ask a very particular favor, but one that I hope may not be that involved. For some months I have been making soem business trips to Italy on behalf of a client of mine. During those trips a former Prime Minister of Italy, Giulio Andreotti, has been most kind to me and has assisted me with several very important problems.

Mr. Andreotti is one of the principal leaders of the Christian-Democratic Party of Italy. The Christian-Democrats are the largest political party of the country but are not a majority. As you may know, recently the fortieth administration in Italy since the end of WW II has to resign because of internal scandals. Mr. Andreotti, as usual, was found to be totally free of any involvement in the unfortunate situation, and in fact, his leadership will now be critical to prevent a very strong left turn in Italian policy.

Mr. Andreotti is coming to the United States in late September or October. He will be receiving an honorary degree and making some presentations at several Universities. He is presently a member of the lower House of the Italian Parliament, the Chamber of Deputies.

The proposed letter from the President to Mr. Andreotti really says nothing, except that we appreciate his friendship, and would grant him a brief audience if the schedule at that time makes it possible. My purpose in asking for the letter is simply a means repaying Mr. Andreotti for his several kindnesses to me, which have been most important to the success of my work in Italy.

I wouldn't ask you to do anything you felt inappropriate, but would hope the letter could be approved. I would be glad to hand carry it, or it could be sent through the usual diplomatic channels.
