(TEXT) NEW YORK SEPTEMBER 19 TASS -- MEMBER OF THE POLITICAL BUREAU OF THE CPSU CENTRAL COMMITTEE, FIRST DEPUTY CHAIRMAN OF THE USSR COUNCIL OF MINISTERS AND FOREIGN AFFAIRS MINISTER OF THE USSR ANDREY GROMYKO, HEADING A SOVIET DELEGATION TO THE 39TH SESSION OF THE U.N. GENERAL ASSEMBLY, HAS HELD A CONVERSATION WITH PROMINENT REPRESENTATIVE OF THE BUSINESS COMMUNITY AND PUBLIC FIGURE OF THE UNITED STATES DAVID ROCKEFELLER.

THEY EXCHANGED VIEWS ON QUESTIONS OF SOVIET-AMERICAN RELATIONS, INCLUDING IN THE TRADE AND ECONOMIC SPHERE.

ANDREY GROMYKO SET FORTH THE SOVIET UNION'S ASSESSMENT OF THE CAUSES OF THE DANGEROUS DEGREE OF TENSION IN THE PRESENT STATE OF RELATIONS BETWEEN THE USSR AND THE UNITED STATES AND IN THE ENTIRE INTERNATIONAL SITUATION.

THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THAT. AT THE SAME TIME, ANDREY GROMYKO STRESSED THAT THE SOVIET UNION HAS ALWAYS FAVOURED NORMALISATION OF RELATIONS WITH THE UNITED STATES, FAIR AND SERIOUS TALKS WITH IT WITH A VIEW TO HALTING THE RACE OF ARMAMENTS AND ACHIEVING THEIR RADICAL REDUCTION ON THE BASIS OF THE PRINCIPLE OF EQUALITY AND EQUAL SECURITY. OBJECTIVELY, THERE ARE GOOD POSSIBILITIES FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF MUTUALLY BENEFICIAL TRADE AND ECONOMIC TIES BETWEEN OUR TWO COUNTRIES.

DAVID ROCKEFELLER, FOR HIS PART, CAME OUT IN FAVOUR OF LOOKING FOR WAYS TO NORMALISE RELATIONS BETWEEN THE SOVIET UNION AND THE UNITED STATES, INCLUDING THE SPHERE OF TRADE AND ECONOMIC COOPERATION, AND BROADEN SOVIET-AMERICAN CONTACTS, INCLUDING BETWEEN REPRESENTATIVES OF THE PUBLIC.
