ANTI-SDI CAMPAIGN

Enugu [Nigeria] DAILY STAR in English 6 Dec 86 p 13 carries an article by A. Devitt arguing that SDI is disastrous for Africa. According to Devitt, SDI would perpetuate technological and economic backwardness in Africa, eliminate African ability to profit from competition among Western suppliers, and force a situation where the Pentagon controlled access to advanced technology. The financial aspects of SDI are also viewed as detrimental for Africa since it would dash hopes for increased aid. In addition, Devitt issues a challenge to pro-SDI arguments particularly objecting to U.S. claims that SDI is a useful tool in fighting terrorism. He goes on to question U.S. commitment to issues and organizations such as freedom of choice, free trade, UN, UNESCO, International Court, and at the same time, extolls Soviet support for international peace.

CHEMICAL, BIOLOGICAL AND NUCLEAR CAMPAIGNS

Moscow PRAVDA in Russian on 2 Dec 1986 carries on page 5 an article by V. Baykov in which he claims that U.S. and British media are engaged in "machinations" regarding the use of chemical and biological weapons in These "lies and slander" appeared in the British JANE'S DEFENSE Afghanistan. WEEKLY, according to Baykov, as well as the U.S. SOLDIER OF FORTUNE magazine. To counter the accusations, Baykov asserts that the "counterrevolutionary gangs" use chemical grenades marked 'Made in the United States". In another 2 December article, this in KRASNAYA ZVEZDA, V. Vinogradov cites a London SUNDAY TIMES article which claims that Libya has warheads containing lethal nerve gas. Vinogradov labels this a "long-standing" CIA suspicion "confirmed by the illustrious British intelligence service." The article in the SUNDAY TIMES, according to Vinogradov, also traces the source of the gas 'back to the Soviet Union." The Soviet author claims that the SUNDAY TIMES is using this article to divert attention from its role in the arms deals with Iran and adds that other "fabrications" about Soviet weapons in some trouble spot will "appear."

Moscow TASS in English, transmitting at 1714 GMT on 5 Dec 1986 alleges that a special Pentagon report has been issued on the "threat posed by non-existent Soviet biological weapons." The broadcast also cites a suit brought against the U.S. Department of Defense by a "public organization", the Foundation on Economic Trends, on the grounds that 75 experiments in biological warfare had been carried out by the Pentagon. In addition, the transmission mentions that the Argentine Ministry of Health "demanded an end to experiments conducted by U.S. specialist in Argentine territory without the Argentine Government's consent." "The Argentine authorities maintain", TASS English continues, "that an unknown virus has been released into the environment on the outskirts of the city of Azul. The opinion of Argentine experts is that it is a question of genetic experiments which pose an immense danger to people."

INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS

Nothing significant to report.

FRONT GROUP CAMPAIGNS

FRG press coverage of the World Peace Congress, held in October, 1986 in Copenhagen, included two articles in the SUEDDEUTSCHE ZEITUNG (18/19 October and 21 October) and one in the FRANKFURTER RUNDSCHAU (20 October). All three gave brief accounts of the conference, which they described as a Soviet-staged propaganda event. They focussed on the fact that the program was controlled by the Soviets and that points of view critical of USSR policies and actions (e.g., the occupation of Afghanistan) were ignored or shouted down.

REGIONAL CAMPAIGNS

Moscow TASS in English on 20 Dec, 0818 GMT cites the Cuban PRENSA LATINA news agency which alleges that U.S. military engineering units in Costa Rica are there not to assist in building roads and bridges but instead to prepare the infrastructure for a U.S. "planned invasion" of Nicaragua. In addition, also on 20 December, TASS cites Nicaragua's Radio Sandino, which alleges that U.S. embassy officials in Managua paid Nicarguan religious workers who had established links between members of the clergy and the contras. The report names B. Mendoza, pastor of the Central American Church of Managua, I. Hernandez, head of the Nicaraguan Bible Society and R. Mena, director of Nicaragua's Evangelical Radio Station. They are operating jointly, according to Radio Sandino and TASS, with the National Association of Evangelical Pastors.

ISLAM IN AFGHANISTAN

An unsigned article in the provincial Nigerian press reviews a recent Society TV documentary entitled "Islam in Afghanistan: The Truth and the Lies" by M. Leshchinski. The film reportedly documents Western mercenaries' direct involvement with the "counterrevolutionaries", portraying such activities as destroying mosques and shrines, slaying clergymen and burning religious materials. The documentary seeks to expose the "counterrevolutionary" practice of dressing up as Soviet and Afghan troops and perpetrating atrocities on civilians in an effort to embarrass the Afghan regime. The role of the CIA in training "bandits" in Pakistan and providing modern arms and chemical weapons is also stressed. (Enugu DAILY STAR in English 8 Dec 86 p 13).

AIDS

Moscow LITERATURNAYA GAZETA No 49 of 3 Dec 86 carries on page 9 a short

article which castigates the Brazilian newspaper ESTADO DE SAO PAULO. This newspaper published an article entitled "AIDS and Disinformation: Which is Worse?" which "took back" the accusations it had levelled against the Pentagon concerning the latter's creation of the AIDS virus. In ESTADO's latest article, according to LITERATURNAYA GAZETA (LG), the Soviet Union is accused of trying to undermine the position of the U.S. and its leading role in NATO. The LG article also mentions in passing an article which appeared in its issue No 47 on the creation of a new government "Bureau for Disinformation, Analysis and Response". (Punctuation according to the LG article).

Monrovia NEW LIBERIAN carries a commentary calling on the U.S. government to establish an official inquiry into allegations that the AIDS virus is the creation of U.S. scientists. These allegations by Jonah Seale, Robert Strecker and Jacob Segal are seen as an refutation of the Western claim that AIDS originated in Africa and an expose of "the West's disinformation and deception campaign against the black race." (Monrovia NEW LIBERIAN in English 11 November 86 pp 1,6, Commentary by Joseph G. Bartuah).

According to Liberian columnist Ephraim Johns, "reliable sources" report that 25 Liberians suspected of having AIDS will soon be deported from the U.S. The article reports Liberian Deputy Commissioner of Immigration David Barshell stating that if the Liberians are proved to have contracted AIDS while in the U.S. they will not be allowed to return to Liberia until cured. No other confirmation for the story is available. The same article also includes a summary of an earlier DAILY STAR article blaming a U.S. laboratory accident for the AIDS virus (Monrovia DAILY STAR in English 11 October (sic November) 86 pp 1, 7).

Tbilisi KOMUNISTI in Georgian on 19 September 1986 carries on page 3 GRUZINFORM correspondent I. Gorelov's 1,000-word interview with L. A. Sakvarelidze, head of Tbilisi Medical Institute's Epidemiology Department, concerning the spread of AIDS in the world from epicenters in Central Africa and the United States. Unnamed French scientists are reported as speculating that the AIDS virus was accidently released in American biolgical weapons experimentation. Asked whether there is any danger of the disease spreading to the USSR, Sakvarelidze answers that "we do not live in a vacuum." As for Georgia itself: "So far, fortunately, no cases have been diagnosed. Nevertheless, the risk is great, inasmuch as we still have people tending toward the vices, for example narcotics. This is not rumor but fact." [Special note: the Russian-language version of this interview, appearing in ZARYA VOSTOKA of 19 September 1986 on page 4, is unsigned and omits the passage about the danger of AIDS in the USSR and Georgia].

DISINFORMATION

The CIA is to blame for Olof Palme's murder, according to Swedish Communist MP Jorn Svensson, who presented his allegation concerning the murder to the parliament, asking for a parliamentary inquiry. He says the murder was politically motivated because Palme represented an independent third way in

international politics and supported strategies that threatened U.S. interests. "CIA is known for actions like this." The murder was preceded by approved preparations. However, Palme's movie visit was unplanned, and the murderer(s) got wind of it via listening devices or from someone in Palme's inner circle. However, Jorn Svensson thinks that other states --Chile, South Africa, Israel, Turkey-- have had motives for murdering Olof Palme, yet were not strong enough to commit murder. Svensson does not believe that the East bloc or the Arab countries are involved. His alternate theory is that the organization of the murder came from Sweden but that it was carried out by European right wing terrorists. The U.S. embassy in Stockholm had no comment on the CIA theory on Friday. (Helsinki HUFVUDSTADSBLADET in Finnish 8 Nov 86 pl6).

THATCHER GOVERNMENT LAMBASTED FOR FALKLAND'S ECONOMIC ZONE CREATION In an article by George Nail the Thatcher government is criticized for announcing a 150-mile economic zone around the Falkland Islands in which the British would have complete control over fishing rights and potential oil deposits. Sinister motives are also accorded to the timing of this move. The event is viewed as an attempt by the British to sidetrack the Brazilian UN proposal to create a South Atlantic Peace Zone in the wake of the Iceland summit. The article claims that the peace zone initiative has the overwhelming support of other Latin American countries but only focuses in on Argentinian President Raul Alfonsin's visit to Moscow and the resulting joint communique (Enugu DAILY STAR in English 3 Dec 86 p 13).
