SUBJECT: Minutes of Working Group Meeting of January 22, 1987

1. The meeting was chaired by Dr. Bailey. Attending were: Mr. Leventhal (USIA), Mr. Knecht (PA/OAP), Mr. Sheren (INR/ID), Major Bloom (OJCS), LTC Jacobowitz (OSD/PSYOP), Mr. Limberg (INR/SEE), Mr. Schwartz (INR/SEE), Mr. Schmidt (EUR/SOV), Ms. Joselyn (EUR/SOV), Mr. Senko (INR/IC), Mr. Hertzberg (INR/ID), and Mr. Greenberg (INR/ID).

2. Afghanistan Talking Points: Dr. Bailey distributed talking points on Afghanistan that covered Soviet and Afghan propaganda campaigns and their vulnerabilities to US countermeasures. She stressed the vulnerabilities and noted that the AMWG has the opportunity to fulfill our obligation to be proactive. She suggested that a good starting point might be to rehash the Soviet sham withdrawal of October 1986. In the ensuing discussion, the group became sidetracked on definitional questions. Dr. Bailey will discuss the issue with P and the regional bureaus to ensure that any AMWG response to Soviet activities in Afghanistan does not duplicate or interfere with other efforts.

3. <u>Nuclear Testing</u>: Dr. Bailey noted that Soviet pronouncements from Geneva on the testing issue have a significant active measures potential, especially if they are replayed worldwide through the pro-Soviet press and the Soviet front-group mechanism. She stressed that the Soviets may use active measures to attack the US position in February when we have our first test. Major Bloom suggested a sub-working group to address the subject. Dr. Bailey responded that, because ACDA was not represented, the suggestion would be brought up at the next meeting and that, in the interim, she would discuss the issue with ACDA.

4. <u>New Members</u>: Dr. Bailey welcomed Todd Leventhal of USIA who will be replacing Mr. Copp and Bernadine Joselyn of EUR/SOV, replacing Mr. Schmidt.

5. Active Measures Memorandum: Mr. Sheren introduced the new format for the memorandum which includes a security notice and an index of the articles. He noted that the unclassified calendar of WPC solidarity events will be sent to all posts. He also reviewed the procedure for obtaining ORCON clearance so that INR can cable an abbreviated version of the memorandum to all posts.

6. <u>New Business</u>: The inclement weather curtailed further discussion and no new business was introduced.

7. <u>Next Meeting</u>: The next AMWG meeting will be February 5, 1987, at 11 AM in room 6530 Main State. Items on the agenda will include: the fisheries pamphlet and training. Members with additional agenda items should contact Andrew Sheren, 647-9740, before COB February 3.

FOR THE PERIOD AUGUST 8, 1986, TO AUGUST 6, 1987

(The Appeal will be submitted for adoption by the Bureau of the Soviet Peace Committee)

The United States Campaign for a People's Peace Treaty, on the one side, and the Soviet Peace Committee, on the other side, note with satisfaction the signing of A PEOPLE'S APPEAL FOR PEACE at the United Nations August 8, 1986, by representatives of our organizations, and, by extension, our peoples. We consider it to be a significant event in the spirit of the International Year of Peace.

In order to fulfill the potential of the PEOPLE'S APPEAL FOR PEACE (pending adoption by the Soviet Peace Committee), we pledge our respective organizations to the task of publicizing and disseminating the APPEAL to the peoples of our countries, including gathering of large numbers of signatures, and the exchange of copies of the APPEAL with signatures between local organizations such as city and town councils, trade union locals, church congregations, schools. The coordination of all such exchanges will be done by our two organizations. The purpose of such exchange shall be to increase the people-to-people contact between our two countries on the basis of participation in such local organizations and on the basis of the principles stated in the APPEAL.

We further pledge our respective organizations to cooperate in the delivery of the signed copies of the APPEAL on August 6, 1987, to President Reagan, General Secretary Gorbachev and to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, along with appropriate publicity to mark the historical significance of this popular demand for peace.
