Dear Mr. President:

Your voice is urgently needed on the vital issue of each American's right to participate freely in the political life of our nation without facing the indignity of discrimination.

This year voices are once more being raised seeking to link you with an appeal to prejudice against lesbians and gay men.

They urge a campaign to exclude people from exercising basic political freedoms because of their sexual orientation and blatantly seek to ignite hatreds to divide Americans one from another.

You provided leadership in stopping similar campaigns in 1978 when you opposed a California initiative to deny gays and lesbians jobs in the state school system.

You restated your opposition to discrimination in both the public and private sector during your 1980 campaign. Most recently, the chairman of the Republican National Committee joined with his Democratic counterpart in signing a "fair campaign practices" pledge that "opposes appeals to prejudice based on...sexual orientation."

These statements underscore your support for the worth and dignity of each human being, of respect for individuals, and a commitment that the right of each individual to speak for themselves should not be abridged.

But these are commitments which must be renewed whenever appeals to prejudice occur. We are in such a period now. June 27, 1984 Page 2

Enclosed is a copy of one direct mail appeal that illustrates these appeals and a news article about the mailer which demonstrates how readily these appeals are linked to you.

Your voice is needed if we are to sustain the honored American tradition that the worth and dignity of each human being is not a political issue to be used to divide Americans.

We urge you to personally disavow any attempts to link your name or to make you a beneficiary of such goals, and to remind the American people that you will not equivocate on your commitment to justice.

There are many issues that moral, humane people are certain to differ over, but exploitation of basic human rights to a job and human dignity must not be one of them. Such actions taint all of us who do not speak up.

In your remarks to graduating class at the U.S. Air Force Academy on May 30, you said, "Jealously guard the values and principles of our heritage. They did not come easy."

Mondale, Hart are 'pro-gay,' circular claims

Democratic presidential candidates Walter Mondale and Gary Hart are accused of being "pro-gay" and "anti-family" in a recent mailer from a Washington-based organization that supports President Reagan's re-election.

The strongly worded mailer from a group called the American Family Association arrived in Sacramento this week. The low-budget organization, which lobbies against gay rights legislation, operates out of a house in a Washington suburb, according to its president, Daniel Villanueva.

The mailer signed by Villanueva warns that "in a few short weeks, liberal, anti-family and pro-gay forces will choose their candidate for president of the United States."

"No doubt the gay-lesbian forces will choose either Walter Mondale or Sen. Gary Ilart." the mailer says. "If Walter Mondale or Gary Hart defeats President Reagan, you, your family and our country are in big trouble."

The letter requests contributions of \$10 to \$100 to "spread the news about the dangerous and destructive Mondale-Hart Gay Platform." An envelope addressed to a Washington, D.C., post office box is enclosed. No other address appears on the mailer, which was sent to 30,000 to 40,000 people nationwide, according to Villanueva.

John Buckley, deputy press secretary for the Reagan-Bush campaign committee, said the American Family Association is "new to us."

"We are not engaged in any activities aimed at Sen. Hart, Walter Mondale or Jesse Jackson. We are happy to let the Democrats chose their nominee on their own," Buckley said.

"We have found out about a number of groups that have been trying to raise money for themselves using President Reagan's name. We disassociate ourselves from any group

unfortunate that things like this always crawl out when there's an election. Most people reject bigotry and hatred, and that's clearly what this is."

"It has no place in American politics," said Mondale's national cochairman, Duane Garrett, a San Francisco attorney.

The mailer includes an eight-point "platform" claiming that Mondale and Hart support employment of gays and lesbians in public schools, the armed forces, the FBI, CIA and private businesses.

Both Hart and Mondale support legislation in the U.S. Senate that would amend the Civil Rights Act of 1964 to prohibit discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation.

"There is a broad consensus in the Democratic Party that ... civil rights should be extended to gays and lesbians," Garrett said. "In no way does that harm our strong stance on preservation of the American family."

Mondale has taken no stand on whether such a provision should apply to sensitive national security positions in intelligence agencies and the military, according to another top Mondale adviser.

Villanueva, a 30-year-old Republican, said his organization opposes Mondale and Hart because of their support for the federal gay rights legislation.

"When it comes to sexual orientation, that is something that goes beyond the bounds of race or religion. We're moving into something that rank and file Americans just do not believe in. It's immoral. They feel like it's distasteful and it's destructive," Villanueva said.

Villanueva is not related to Danny Villanueva, former placekicker for the Los Angeles Rams and Dallas Cowboys who is a parner in a Los Angeles television station and is boxing commissioner for the Summer Olympics in Los Angeles.
