Dear Mr. President:


On March 20, 1983, at 7PM, local time, Kenneth Charles Trinchitella, age 16, of 8415 Grand Haven Ave, Upper Marlboro, MD 20772, established four (4) United States Aviation Records. He became the first person on record to fly his initial solo flight at night; the youngest licensed United States Pilot; the youngest night qualified United States Pilot and the youngest pilot on record to qualify for night flight. Kenny accomplished this feat in a Cessna 150 at Hyde Field in Clinton, MD.

These records have been certified by Mr. Milton Brown of the National Aeronautical Association (NAA), Mr. Wildon Britton and Mr. Howard Hess of the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). A formal presentation at the National Air & Space Museum is scheduled for September 22, 1983; however, I thought that it would be appropriate for this young aviator to meet you and to shake your hand. With the emphasis now being placed on the defense budget, Kenny's dream of graduating from the Air Force Academy and becoming a fighter pilot would compliment this effort.

His father, who is a Captain for United Airlines, as well as myself are firm believers in your policies and the steady course they are taking to rebuild this nation. We would really appreciate your taking five minutes to congratulate Kenny in the Oval Office at your convenience.

I know you are very sensitive to the needs of the people in this Great Nation of ours and this meeting would be the highlight of this young person's life. This accomplishment is equal to the "Skins" bowl victory because it is a dream fulfilled and meeting you at the White House would be like receiving the Super Bowl ring for a job well done.


