Dear Joe,

I guess by now you have recovered from your last trip to Santa Barbara and are champing at the bit to get back to this great part of California.

You will probably remember our invitation to President and Mrs. Reagan to visit the Shroud of Turin Visual Data Exhibit, currently in our Photography Hall of Fame. At that time the scheduled closing date for the exhibit was June 20, but because of public interest, almost overwhelming actually, we have extended the closing date until after Labor Day in September.

Therefore the exhibit will be still running when President and Mrs. Reagan are in the Santa Barbara area next month and on behalf of Mr. Ernest H. Brooks II, president, and Brooks Institute, I would like to extend another invitation to President and Mrs. Reagan.

The exhibit is open to the public from 10a.m.-4p.m. daily with the exception of Friday, when the hours are 10a.m.-8p.m. So if our invitation is accepted I would suggest a time after 4p.m. any day but Friday.

I can understand the security problems associated with any public engagements and if there is any reluctance to visit the Photography Hall of Fame because of that aspect perhaps I can suggest an alternative.

One of our instructors was the chief photographer on the Shroud of Turin investigation and he has compiled an excellent selection of slides. I know it would be possible to arrange a private showing for President and Mrs. Reagan at their Refugio Ranch if this is more agreeable.

I look forward to hearing from you and if you have any suggestions which would facilitate President and Mrs. Reagan viewing the photographic



SUBJECT: Photographic Coverage During Upcoming California

Trip

Due to the fact that the cast on my broken arm now extends past the elbow to my shoulder, I feel that I will be unable to make the first half of the upcoming West Coast Presidential trip. I shall contact both yourself and Mr. Meese on the 17th of August to advise you if I will be able to make the second half of the trip - from approximately 20 August to termination. Therefore, the following information pertinent to the photographic coverage might be of value to you:

- During the first part of the trip August 6 through 23 August, Karl Schumacher will ride Air Force I and Marine I. He shall be the person in charge of the photographic effort put forth by himself and Jack Kightlinger and shall be responsible for the photographic coverage.
- From August 24th to termination of trip, William (Bill) Fitz-Patrick will assume the lead photographer's duties and shall be responsible for the photographic efforts of himself and Mary Anne Fackelman.
- All black and white processing and printing will be done in the Santa Barbara Sheraton or Century Plaza. All color processing and printing will be done at the Point Magu Naval Air Station. Donald R. Dean will be the on site laboratory man in charge for the first twelve (12) days of the trip. John C. Shannon will relieve him. Sufficient laboratory personnel are on hand.
- 4. As per standard practice, Michael Deaver or the Senior Press person in charge will sign off on pictures to be released. Donald Dean and John Shannon will handle the editing of pictures.

- 5. The Press Office shall provide captions for the released photographs.
- 6. Remember time is of the essence when releases are anticipated. Due to the three (3) hour time difference, some day color releases cannot make the East Coast media closings unless the film has left the Ranch by helicopter by 10:00 a.m. For black and white only releases, the film must depart the ranch NLT than 1:00 p.m. by helicopter.
- 7. Previous experience indicates helicopter ferried film requires minimum of two (2) hours from time film leaves ranch for B&W releases. Five hours for color. These times indicate Santa Barbara release. These times for basic minimum releases; the wires + three (3) daily papers -- Los Angeles Times, New York Times, Washington Post. Color minimum release is the six (6) major networks; magazine and additional requirements to follow later.
- 8. A separate memorandum outlining Photographic Personnel, room numbers, pageboy numbers, those assigned radios, phone drop numbers, etc., will be available on Thursday prior to the California departure. Thank you.




