DEAR MR. LINAS KOJELIS ,

I thank you sincerely for your letter with the good news! I am glad having such an influential person at White House.

In your letter you said: "I am sure that the President would be happy to accept your symbolic painting..." I presume that your diplomatic language means: yes, the President has seen the photos of your art-works, he likes your paintings and would be glad to have one. Otherwise how could I risk sending such expensive stuff not being sure it will be gratefully accepted?


Soon after you receive my letter will arrive my package. Please, open it VERY CAREFULLY, unscrewing the front board (with address on it); so, you will need a screwdriver and perhaps somebody to help you. When my painting reaches its final destination PLEASE let me know in what condition it arrived and other details, so that I can forget my worries and sleep well... My letter will be attached somewhere inside the box, addressed To the President at White House. Also a heavy duty hanger. In case my painting would appear to the President as too big or otherwise unfitting in his mansion-in such unfortunate case we ~~we~~ both (you Mr Linas and I) would be in trouble! Perhaps you could find a place for my art-work somewhere on Capitol Hill?

With this my letter you will find several photos of my paintings; select one you like best, mark down, return all of them to me-the painting you have marked will be given to you for all your troubles. Not even one dollar from my dear Mediator! But maybe my big paintings would be too big for you? Only one is smaller but artistically it was not especially well done. (The red spider). The sizes of my paintings are marked on the backs of my photos.

I still am not absolutely sure if my heavy, big package will be accepted and shifted by airlines; to send it by Greyhound-too risky.

I would like to get address of Rev. T. Ziuraitis in Washington; could you write down in your letter?
