Truffles & Flourishes For the President

Liberace the Lucrative leaves town tomorrow richer by his share of a gross of about \$450,000 after performing to nine sellout audiences at the Kennedy Center. Liberace the Lavish is poorer by one gold-leaf, 2-foot-square

chocolate piano full of truffles, which he sent as a "Glad You're Well" present to President Reagan.

The piano was personally escorted by Marc Randolph, the chocolate sculptor from Watergate Pastry Shop, who took it to the White House yesterday afternoon.

Liberace went to the White House, too, but separately. He, his manager Seymour Heller, his promoter Manuel Levine and several others toured the White House yesterday after-

noon after a look at the Capitol with Rep. Bob McEwen (R-Ohio).

Pete Roussel, a Reagan spokesman, said, "We're holding [the piano] in the residence until the pres-

ident and Mrs. Reagan are back on Sunday. Then we'll send it up for them to see." In the meantime, the truffled piano is understood to be under heavy guard.

Whether the piano had to go through the metal detection unit or the bomb squad was not revealed. "Whatever is appropriate will be done," said Roussel. A usually reliable source says there were a number of applicants for the job of Official Taster.

Will the president eat it all? The piano lid with the gold-leaf "L"? The gold-leaf scrolled sides? The white and black chocolate keys? Or will he, overcome by the thought of the calories, as was Liberace, give it to someone else? Roussel indicated the decision could only be made at the top.

The confection may end up as the most famous White House piano since Margaret Truman's.

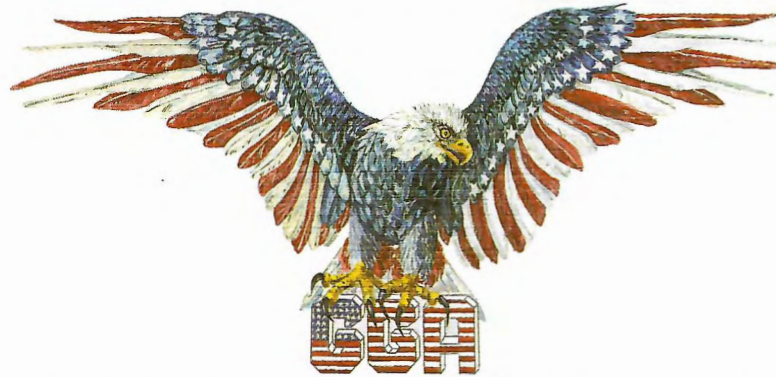

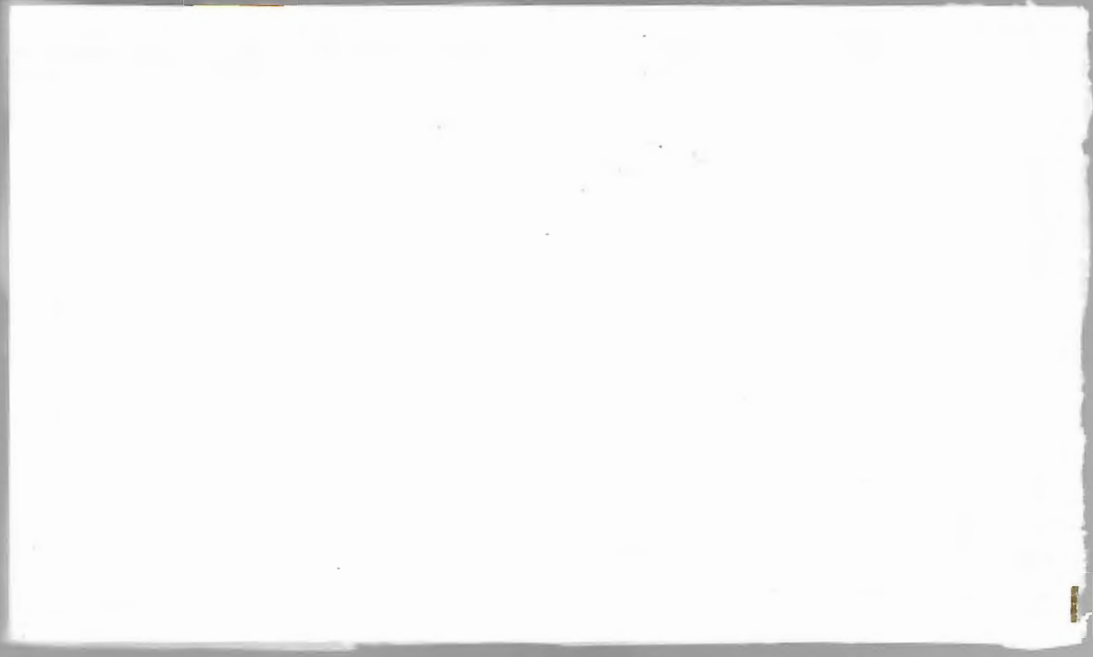

I write having been given your name by Mr. John G. Houser of the White House Technical Security Division. As proof that my letter is "bona fide" I attach references which I trust are self-explanatory. I also attach a copy of a letter to us from Anne Higgins of the White House Staff.

Here in Malmédy, we are engaged in the sale of army surplus and militaria. An entirely separate, non profit making activity we have undertaken, involves the establishment of a U.S. Veteran Contact Point and Information center.

The Contact Point is a unique free (no strings) service offered by us to visiting U.S. W.W. II veterans and their wives. 
young Europeans of what young Americans did
for them 40 years ago.


To commemorate the Fall of

Importers of Biological Supplies

Maxilla & Mandible was founded in 1983 by vertebrate paleontologist Henry Galiano for the purpose of making available osteological specimens and materials obtained from Government sponsored reclamation programs in Africa and around the world.

By combining strict scientific accuracy with an esthetic element, Maxilla & Mandible bridges the gap between science and art, helping people gain a better appreciation of the grandeur of the inhabitants of our world. The magnificent, museum-quality specimens available through Maxilla & Mandible are the result of more than 500 million years of evolutionary influence on the design and architecture of our living world. They are both an important reflection on natural history and an investment for the future.

As these specimens are acquired only through natural processes, they will, unfortunately, become scarce in the very near future. Maxilla & Mandible believes that saving specimens is as important as saving wildlife, for these may soon represent the only available study materials for many dwindling species.

By far one of Africa's most dangerous animals, the Cape Buffalo has earned the reputation of deliberate savagery when cornered or wounded. Found mainly in savanna habitats, it is rarely seen far from water. Its horns may measure between 30-45 inches from tip to tip, and both males and females carry the heavy based horns which almost meet at the mid-brow of the skull. In general design, the horns display great power in construction. The black horns (or 'mustache') sweep outward and bend downward below the base of this impressive skull.

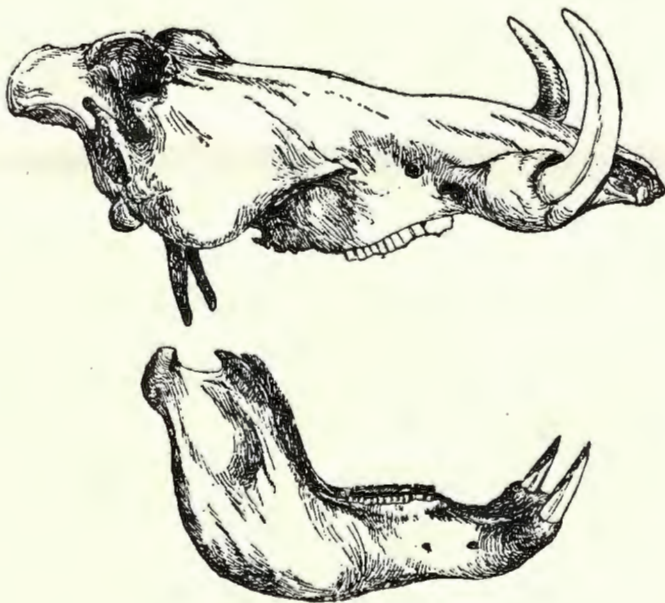

The world's largest antelope, the Eland, often reaches the weight proportions of Buffalo. A very regal and impressive antelope, it has massive horns, with screw-like spirals reaching to 40 inches in length. Eland have horns present in both sexes, and are splendid examples of graceful design, size notwithstanding. The Eland is closely related to the Kudu.

A successful symbol of the African plains is the Wildebeest. In its migrating patterns and sheer numbers, the Wildebeest will tend to dominate the landscape, evidence of its evolutionary success. Horns are present in both sexes, with an average spread of up to 20-25 inches. Unlike many of the African antelopes, the horns of the Wildebeest are not ribbed, but are, instead, rather smooth with a velvet-like texture in appearance. The Wildebeest skull is long and quite elegant.

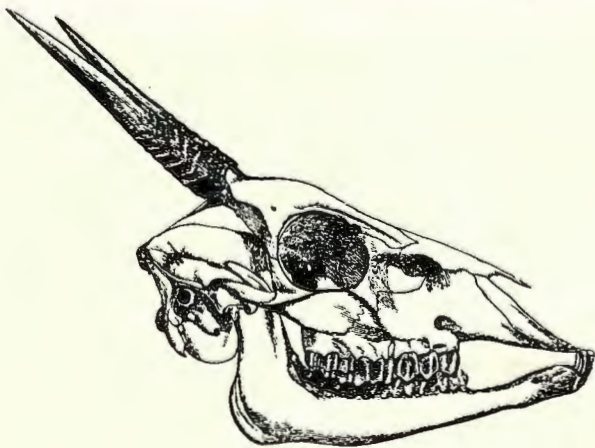

A striking example of the unappreciated world of osteological sculpture, the African Warthog skull has large orbits, set high and far back in the skull, one of the many curious features of this wild suid. The ivory tusks are strong and formidable weapons which grow continually throughout life, often times exceeding 9 inches.

In both forms of this grand antelope the females lack horns. The most impressive and handsome of the African antelopes is certainly the Kudu, whose horns spiral in an elegant fashion, sometimes reaching three full twists. The lengths of the horns in the Greater Kudu may average between 45-50 inches. Like most African antelopes, Kudus prefer dense bush habitat and are excellent jumpers.

In this small, dog-sized African antelope, only the males have horns. Although the Bush Duiker is a member of a large group of small-sized antelopes, it is the only one whose preferred habitat is out in the open ground. The skull features large orbits with a tapering face; the bones are delicate and the upright standing horns exhibit some slight ribbing at the base. Horns average 7 inches in length. Recent studies indicate the Duiker and their kin in Africa are closely related to the enigmatic four-horned antelope (*Tetraceros*) of Asia.


